County to break ground at Singleton Park on March 28

Commissioners gave the green light to build Singleton Park and Greenway in unincorporated Norcross. The new 1.58-acre park will meet the community's diverse needs and preferences with recreational and accessibility features, including open leisure spaces, a playground, a multimodal trail, shade structures, and a Ride Gwinnett stop.

F.S. Scarborough LLC was awarded the contract. The \$6.3 million project is funded by the American Rescue Plan Act, a Governor's Office grant, 2017 SPLOST programs, and a CARES Act Community Development Block Grant.

Reduce your property tax bill by applying for a homestead exemption! Owners who occupied their home as their primary residence as of January 1 may qualify for an exemption this year. If you already have an exemption in place, you do not need to reapply. Homestead exemption also makes you eligible for Gwinnett's Value Offset Exemption!
