SPLOST: County begins work on Hamilton Mill area road project



The Gwinnett County Board of Commissioners broke ground on a road-widening project for Braselton Highway (SR 124) on May 20. The roadway will get an additional lane in each direction in addition to a center turn lane from Hamilton Mill Road east to Pine Road. Existing pavement will be recycled through a large portion of the project. The County will also modify the signals on Braselton Highway at the Hamilton Mill Road and Hamilton Creek Parkway intersections for better performance. The total project will be approximately 1.3 miles. "This is one of many projects that we are working on this year to help reduce congestion and keep traffic moving efficiently," said Gwinnett DOT Director Brian Allen.

The County will get \$1.5 million in state funding for the project. "We are grateful for the cooperation between the County and the State to fund this much-needed project for this growing area. We also appreciate Gwinnett County

residents for providing funds through SPLOST to help relieve traffic in our County," said District 3 Commissioner Mike Beaudreau. The developer of a new commercial center on State Route 124 also contributed \$500,000 towards construction costs. Construction is expected to be completed late 2008 or early 2009.



Gwinnett Justice and Administration Center (GIAC) celebrated its grand opening with a five-minute fireworks show for a crowd of about 500.

The following year, County Manager

SPLOST program raised \$65.7 million in 24 months to pay for the new building and its 65-acre site.

The East Wing originally housed 28 courtrooms plus offices for the District Attorney and Clerk of Court staff. The West Wing housed many of the County's II departments along with offices for the Board of Commissioners. Lillian Webb was chairman when the building opened and the commissioners were Ken Suffridge, Scott Ferguson, Mike Berg, and Don Loggins.

Spectators watched the early fireworks shows from the 650-car circular parking lot in front of the building. Two years ago, the festivities outgrew the parking lot and County officials forged a new partnership with the City of Lawrenceville to move the food vendors and free children's activities to the Historic Courthouse Square nearby.

Advice from the Tax Commissioner

Reminder: Tax bills will be mailed

The Gwinnett County Tax Commissioner will mail 2008 property tax bills to all property owners in Gwinnett by July 15, 2008. For convenience, taxpayers will receive two payment coupons and reply envelopes and may pay in two installments due September 15 and November 15, 2008. Payment in full is also accepted by the first installment date. Penalties and interest apply for late payments.

This year, taxpayers have even more options to pay their property tax:

- Use credit card or e-check at www.gwinnetttaxcommissioner.com (Convenience fees apply for credit card transactions over the Internet)
- Pay by check and use the drop-off boxes accessible 24 hours a day at all Tax Commissioner's offices
- Mail payments to the Tax Commissioner's office at 75 Langley Drive, Lawrenceville, GA 30045

- Pay in person during regular business hours at the main Property Tax Office located in the Gwinnett Justice and Administration Center in Lawrenceville, or at any of the five motor vehicle tag branch offices
- Pay using banking information over the telephone by calling TaxTalk 24 at 770.822.8800

For property owners with funds held in escrow accounts, tax bills are automatically mailed to mortgage companies. Contact the Tax Commissioner's office for more information.

House Bill 518 reduces title application period

During the 2007 – 2008 legislative session, the Georgia General Assembly passed *House Bill 518*, which reduces the time to apply for a vehicle title. Effective July 1, 2008, a title application must be made within 30 days following the date of purchase, as opposed to the current 90-day requirement, or a \$10 penalty will be assessed.

If the title application is rejected, the party applying for a title has 60 days from the rejection date to resubmit the title application or an additional \$10 penalty will be assessed. Also, the owner of the vehicle must immediately remove the license plate of the vehicle and return it to the Department of Revenue or a County tag office. The license plate will be considered expired as of midnight on the 60th day following the initial rejection of the documents.

Also during the legislative session, Senate Bill 437 passed requiring vehicle security interest holders (lienholders) to apply for a title within 30 days of the date they create a lien on a vehicle. The effective date for this bill is July 1, 2009.

Groundbreaking: Gwinnett Braves Stadium


