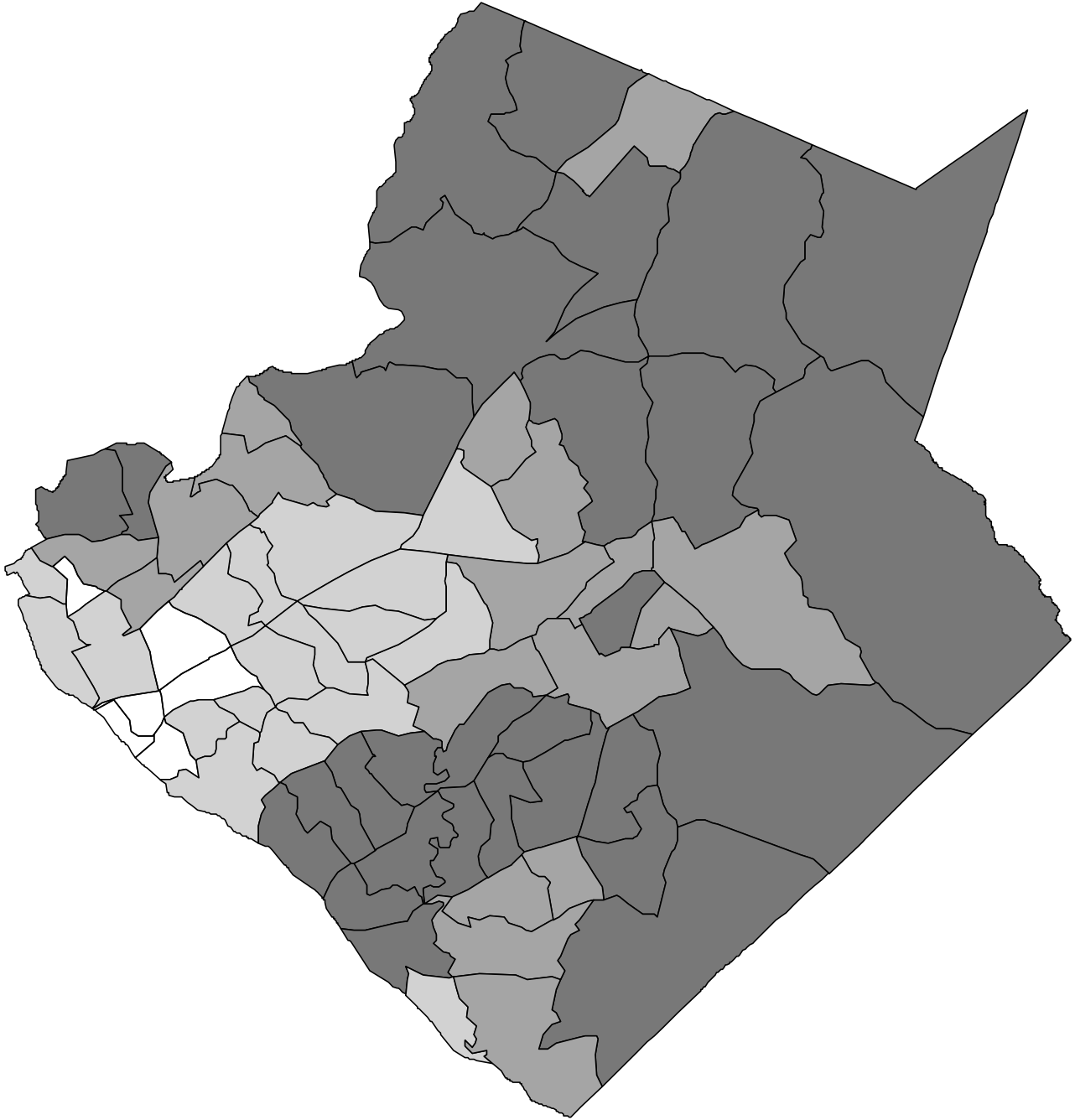


Census 2000 Selected Income and Poverty Status Characteristics



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INTRODUCTION

This report is the second in a series of reports that present data from the 2000 Census. The reports concentrate on socio-economic and demographic changes over the past ten years at the census tract level for Gwinnett County and on the county level for the Atlanta Region. The text summarizes and describes data depicted in the maps and tables.

The purpose of these reports is to provide access to sub-county level Census data. Each report will cover various topics including population, housing, household, income and poverty status, and labor force characteristics and will be published as data processing and analyses are complete.

The first report **Census 2000: Selected Race and Ethnic Characteristics** examines racial and ethnic changes in Gwinnett County's population since 1990. This report, **Census 2000: Selected Income and Poverty Status Characteristics** presents and analyzes data concerning population and household income and poverty level status. The changes in population and household poverty status from 1990 to 2000 are also included.

This report presents four primary areas of information for Gwinnett County: median household income, median family income, median nonfamily household income, and per capita income, the number and proportion of households and families by income category, sources of household income, and poverty level status for people and households in 1990 and 2000.

In this report and others, selected 2000 Census data are aggregated to the 1990 census tract level. This enables comparisons between 1990 and 2000 data. Census tracts

are small, somewhat permanent statistical subdivisions of a county or equivalent area. The primary purpose of census tracts is to provide a relatively stable set of geographic units for the presentation of decennial census data. When first delineated, census tract boundaries are designed to be fairly homogeneous with respect to population, economic status, and living conditions. The spatial size of the census tracts varies widely depending on the density of area. (Summary File 1, 2000 Census of Population and Housing, Technical Documentation; U.S. Census Bureau, June 2001, p. A-11).

Census tracts are split due to population growth or aggregated due to population decline. In Gwinnett County the number of census tracts increased from 45 in 1990 to 71 in 2000. Split tracts can be reformed to construct the original census tract. For example the 1990 census tract 501.01 located in the Buford area was split into the 2000 tracts of 501.03 and 501.04. To make comparisons between 1990 and 2000 for that area, the 2000 data for the two tracts must be aggregated.

INCOME

This section presents various income measures including median household income, median family income, median nonfamily household income, and per capita income. The median income divides the income distribution in half. For instance, half the households or families in an area had incomes over the median while half had less. The per capita income is the average income calculated for every person in a particular area.

A household is an occupied housing unit, of which the members may or may not be related. For example, two college students sharing an apartment compose a household; whereas a

family is a household containing two or more persons related by blood, marriage or adoption. A married couple with no children is considered a family as is a household containing a divorced mother and her children. Nonfamily households are one person living alone or non-relatives only.

Median Household Income

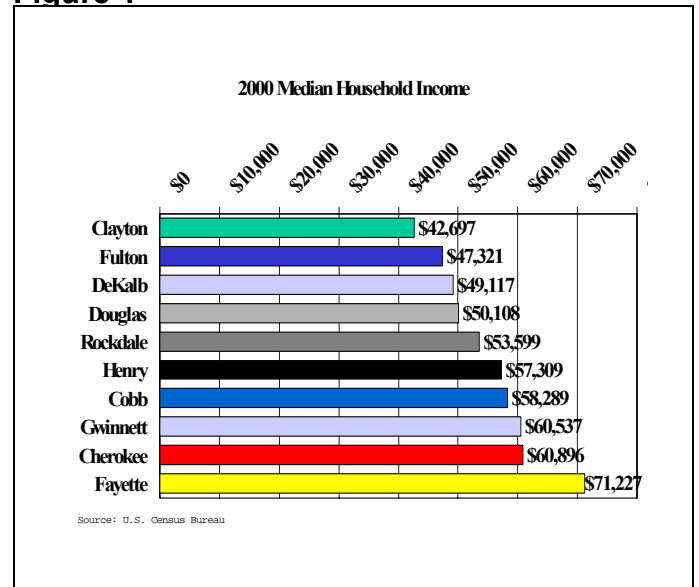
Table 1 presents the number and proportion of households by income category and the median household income in 2000. The table contains data for Gwinnett County's census tracts and municipalities and for the other counties in the Atlanta Region and surrounding area.

Figure 1 compares Gwinnett County's 2000 median household income with the other counties in the Atlanta Region. Fayette County had the highest median household income at \$71,227. Cherokee County accounted for the next largest median household income, \$60,896 followed closely by Gwinnett County with a median household income of \$60,537. With a median income of \$42,697, Clayton County had the smallest median household income in the Atlanta Region. Between 1990 and 2000 Gwinnett County's median household income increased by \$17,019 or 39.1%. In comparison, Gwinnett's median household income increased by \$20,946 or 92.8% from 1980 to 1990.

Map 1 depicts the 2000 median household income in Gwinnett County by census tract. The highest median household incomes were found in two census tracts - 503.07 and 503.08. These tracts were located in Peachtree Corners abutting the Chattahoochee River and Fulton County. The median household income in these tracts was over \$110,000 with tract 503.08 having the county's largest median household income - \$128,137. Other areas in Gwinnett County that had relatively high median

household incomes included Berkeley Lake, Duluth, Suwanee, Collins Hill, Hamilton Mill, Dacula, Mountain Park, Stone Mountain, and Snellville. Many households in these census tracts reported median incomes ranging from \$70,000 to \$90,000.

Generally, the smallest median household incomes were found in the census tracts located in a band stretching from the Norcross area along I-85 through Duluth and Lilburn to Lawrenceville. Lower median household incomes were also reported in the Buford area. Median household incomes in these census tracts ranged from \$32,554 to \$50,000. Census tract 505.20, located in Lawrenceville had Gwinnett's smallest median household income - \$32,554.

Median Family Income

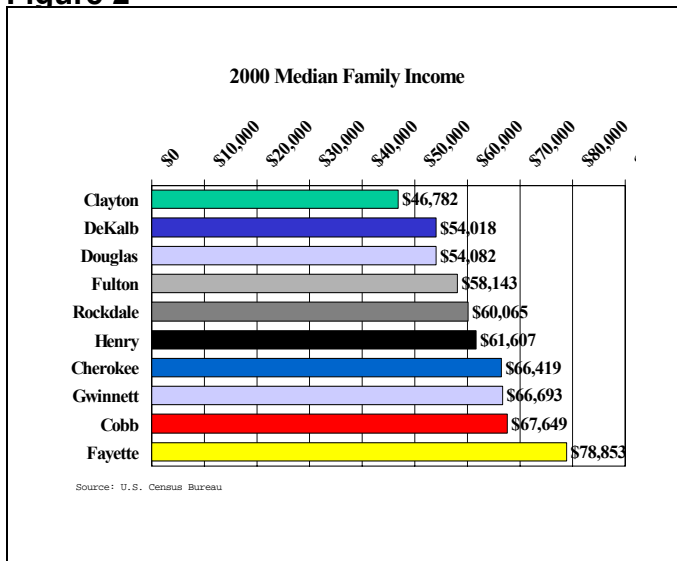
Table 2 presents the number and proportion of families by income category and the median family income in 2000. The table contains data for Gwinnett County's census tracts and municipalities and for the other counties in the

Atlanta Region.

Figure 2 compares Gwinnett County's 2000 median family income with the other counties in the Atlanta Region. The regional distribution of median family incomes was similar to the pattern of median household incomes. For instance, families in Fayette County had the largest median income at \$78,853 while families in Cobb County and Gwinnett County accounted for the next largest median incomes, \$67,649 and \$66,693 respectively. Besides having the lowest median household income, Clayton County also had the smallest median family income - \$46,782. Between 1990 and 2000, Gwinnett County's median family income increased by \$18,693 or 38.9%.

Throughout the Atlanta Region, median family incomes were all greater than median household incomes. This may be attributed to the presence of two wage earners in many family households as well as the exclusion of one-person households from the family category. Generally, single person households have smaller incomes than other types of households.

Map 2 depicts Gwinnett County's 2000 median

family income by census tract. Gwinnett's distribution of median family incomes was similar to the spatial pattern of its median household incomes. The largest median family incomes were located in census tracts concentrated in Peachtree Corners along the Chattahoochee River. The median family income in these census tracts was over \$110,000 with tract 503.08 having the county's largest median family income - \$128,327.

Generally census tracts with the smallest median family incomes were concentrated in southwest Gwinnett adjacent to DeKalb County, Norcross, and southwest Lawrenceville. Median incomes in these tracts ranged from \$37,946 to \$50,000. However census tract 501.05 located in Buford had Gwinnett's smallest median family income - \$37,946.

Median Nonfamily Household Income

Table 3 presents the number and proportion of nonfamily households by income category and the median nonfamily household income in 2000. The table contains data for Gwinnett County's census tracts and municipalities and for the other counties in the Atlanta Region and surrounding area.

Figure 3 compares Gwinnett County's 2000 median nonfamily household income with the other counties in the Atlanta Region. As shown, with \$39,325 Gwinnett County had the highest nonfamily household median income followed closely by Cobb County at \$39,145. Clayton County had the smallest median nonfamily household income in the Atlanta Region - \$30,699.

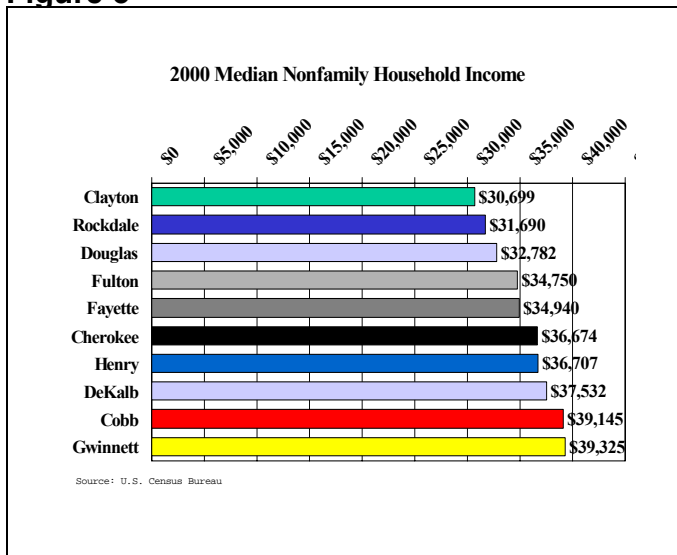
Map 3 depicts the 2000 median nonfamily household income in Gwinnett County by census tract. Again the highest median nonfamily

household incomes were found in two census tracts - 503.07 and 503.08 located in Peachtree Corners adjacent to the Chattahoochee River and Fulton County. The median nonfamily household income in these tracts was \$76,659 and \$72,143 respectively.

Other areas in the county that had relatively high median nonfamily household incomes included Berkeley Lake, Duluth, Suwanee, Collins Hill, Hamilton Mill, Hog Mountain, Lawrenceville, Lilburn, and Mountain Park. Median nonfamily household incomes in these census tracts ranged from \$40,000 to \$64,000.

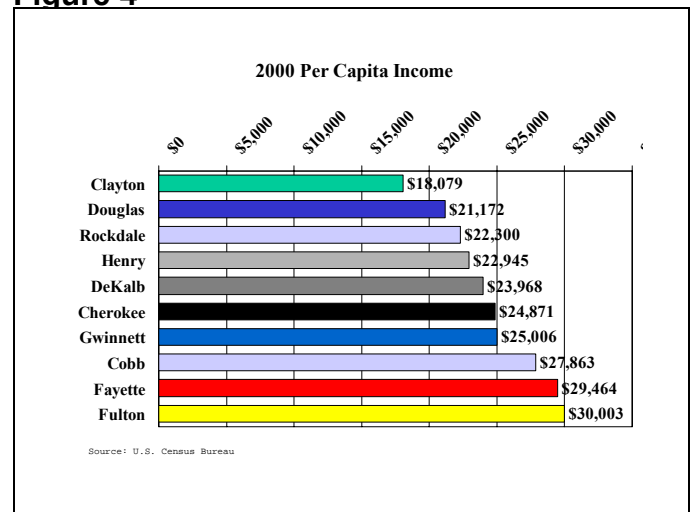
The smallest median nonfamily household incomes were widely dispersed throughout the county. Four census tracts located in Buford, Lawrenceville, and in extreme southwest Gwinnett near Stone Mountain reported median non-family household incomes below \$28,000. Census tract 505.22, located in southwest Lawrenceville had Gwinnett's smallest median nonfamily household income - \$16,813.

Per Capita Income

Table 4 presents several income measures for 2000 including per capita income. The table contains data for Gwinnett County's census tracts and municipalities and for the other counties in the Atlanta Region and surrounding area.

Figure 4 compares Gwinnett County's 2000 per capita income with the other counties in the Atlanta Region. Fulton County and Fayette County had the largest per capita incomes with \$30,003 and \$29,464 respectively while Clayton County had the lowest per capita income - \$18,079. Gwinnett County had the region's fourth largest per capita income - \$25,006. Gwinnett County's per capita income increased by \$7,125 or 39.8% between 1990 and 2000. In comparison, Gwinnett's per capita income increased by \$9,714 or 118.9% from 1980 to 1990.

Map 4 shows the 2000 per capita income in each of Gwinnett County's census tracts. Gwinnett's largest per capita incomes were found in the census tracts located in the Peachtree Corners adjacent to the Chattahoochee River and Fulton County.

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Census tract 503.08 had Gwinnett's highest per capita income - \$49,781. Other areas with large per capita incomes included Berkeley Lake, Duluth, Suwanee, Mountain Park, and Snellville. The per capita income in these tracts was over \$28,000.

Obviously, most areas that reported large household and family median incomes also had high per capita incomes. However, many census tracts that contained smaller families and many one-person households also had large per capita incomes because the total income in the tract was distributed among fewer residents.

Household Income Sources

Table 5 presents data showing sources of income for Gwinnett County's households by census tract and for the other counties in the Atlanta Region. Income source categories in the table include salaries and wages, self-employment, Social Security, Supplemental Security, dividends, interest, and net rental, public assistance, retirement, and other income.

Wages and Salaries

The primary source of income for the vast majority of Gwinnett's households was wages or salaries. This category includes wages, commissions, tips, and bonuses. For instance, 91% of all of Gwinnett's households reported earnings from salaries or wages. In comparison, all of the other counties in the Atlanta Region had smaller ratios ranging from 85% in Rockdale County to 89% in Clayton and Cobb counties.

Social Security Income

Social Security income that includes social security pensions and survivor benefits, permanent disability insurance payments, and railroad retirement insurance payments was

reported by 12% of Gwinnett's households. Gwinnett's percentage was lower than the Atlanta Region proportion of 16% and well below Rockdale County where 21% of the households received some type of Social Security income.

Map 5 shows the percentage of Gwinnett's households that reported Social Security income in 2000 by census tract. Areas that contained the largest proportion of households receiving Social Security income were scattered throughout the county. For instance, over 21% of the households located in census tracts 503.11 (Norcross), 501.05 (Buford), 505.22 (Lawrenceville), 507.21 (Snellville), and 504.30 (Stone Mountain) reported Social Security income. Census tract 505.22 had the largest percentage of households with Social Security income – 35.6%.

Several other census tracts located in Norcross, Mountain Park and in eastern Gwinnett stretching from Buford through Dacula and Harbins to the Grayson and Loganville areas had Social Security income proportions ranging from 14% to 21%.

Retirement Income

Retirement income was reported by 10% of Gwinnett County's households. Gwinnett's percentage was slightly lower than the Atlanta Region proportion of 12% and significantly lower than Fayette County where 19% of the households received some type of retirement income. Retirement income includes pensions, disability payments, periodic receipts from annuities and insurance, or regular income from IRA or other plans. This does not include Social Security income.

Map 6 shows the percentage of Gwinnett County's households that reported retirement income in 2000 by census tract. Census tracts

that contained the largest proportion of households with retirement income were located primarily in southwest Gwinnett. For example, many census tracts located in the Mountain Park, Lilburn, Stone Mountain, Snellville, Centerville, and Loganville areas had households with retirement income proportions ranging from 13% to 20.8%. Three census tracts located in the Mountain Park and Stone Mountain areas – 504.26, 504.27, and 504.30 had households with retirement income proportions of approximately 20%. These were the highest percentages in the county.

Another section of the county that had a significant proportion of households that reported retirement income was central and eastern Lawrenceville. Several census tracts in this area had proportions over 13%. In addition, households with retirement income proportions ranging from 10% to 13% were found in Peachtree Corners, Norcross and in eastern Gwinnett stretching from Buford through Dacula, Hog Mountain and Harbins to Grayson.

Public Assistance Income

Another source of household income is public assistance income. This category includes temporary assistance to needy families and general assistance. The percentage of households receiving public assistance income in Gwinnett County was extremely low. Only 1% of Gwinnett's households reported this type of income in 2000. In comparison, 2% of the Atlanta Region's households received public assistance income with Fulton County possessing the largest proportion - 4%.

Map 7 depicts the proportion of households in Gwinnett County that received public assistance income in 2000 by census tract. Census tracts located in Buford, Lawrenceville, and Norcross reported the largest proportion of households

receiving public assistance income. In these areas, 3% to 5.1% of the total number of households reported some type of public assistance income with tract 503.06 having the largest proportion - 5.1%.

POVERTY STATUS

This section of the report presents data and analysis concerning Gwinnett County's population and households that had incomes below the poverty level in 2000. Tables 6 and 7 list the number and changes in Gwinnett's population by age and poverty level status. Tables 8 and 9 list the number and changes in Gwinnett County's households by type and poverty level status.

Persons for whom poverty status was determined excluded institutionalized persons, persons in military group quarters and college dormitories, and unrelated individuals less than 15 years of age. Poverty thresholds in 2000 for all-adult households were: one-person - \$8,501, two persons - \$10,869, three persons - \$13,290, four persons - \$17,029, five persons - \$20,127, six persons - \$22,727, seven persons - \$25,912, eight persons - \$28,967, and nine or more persons - \$34,417. Thresholds were lower for households that included children and for one and two person households in which the householder was 65 years of age or older.

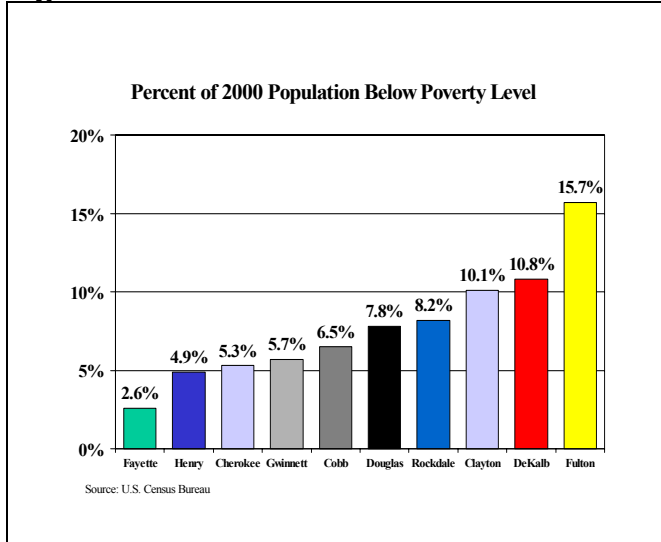
Population in Poverty

Figure 5 compares the share of Gwinnett County's 2000 population that lived below the poverty level with the other counties in the Atlanta Region. Overall, 9.5% of the Atlanta Region's population lived in poverty. However, this proportion was not evenly distributed throughout the Region. The proportion of people living in poverty ranged from 2.6% in Fayette County to 15.7% in Fulton County. With 5.7%

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of its population living below the poverty level, Gwinnett County had the fourth lowest ratio in the Region.

Map 8 shows the percent of Gwinnett County's population that lived below the poverty level by census tract. In 2000, Norcross and the areas adjacent to DeKalb County in southwest Gwinnett had the largest proportion of people living in poverty. For instance, between 15% and 19.5% of the population in census tracts 503.04, 503.06, 503.12 and 504.18 lived in poverty. Other areas of the county that reported a large percentage of residents living in poverty included census tracts located east and west of I-85 in Norcross, and in the cities of Buford and Lawrenceville. The ratio of the population living below the poverty level in these tracts ranged from 12% to 15%.

Map 9 presents the percentage of Gwinnett County's population below 18 years of age that lived in poverty. In 2000, 6.3% of Gwinnett County's population that was under 18 years of age lived in poverty. In contrast, the proportion of the regional population under 18 years of age living in poverty was 12.3%. Census tracts

503.12 (Norcross), 503.16 (Peachtree Corners), 504.18 (adjacent to DeKalb County), and 505.20 (Lawrenceville) had the largest concentrations of children living in poverty in Gwinnett County. Over 20% of the under 18 years of age population in these tracts lived below the poverty level with the largest proportion reported in tract 504.18 – 26.1%.

In addition to these areas, there were several other census tracts in the county that had a significant proportion of children living in poverty. For instance, tracts 503.04, 503.06, 503.11, and 504.21 in Norcross and 505.21 in Lawrenceville had proportions of children living in poverty ranging from 15% to 20%.

Map 10 shows the proportion of Gwinnett's population age 65 or over that lived below the poverty level by census tract. In 2000, Gwinnett County's proportion of residents age 65 or older that lived in poverty was 5.5%. By far, the largest proportion of residents age 65 and older living in poverty was in census tract 501.05. Over one-third or 34.1% of the inhabitants age 65 or older in this area of Buford lived in poverty. Census tract 503.11 in Norcross also had a large concentration of seniors living in poverty – 21.2%

Several more census tracts in the Norcross, Duluth, Lilburn, Lawrenceville, and Stone Mountain areas also had a significant percentage of residents age 65 or over living in poverty. The proportion of seniors that had incomes below the poverty level ranged from 10% to 20% in these tracts.

Map 11 presents the percent change between 1990 and 2000 in the county's population living in poverty. Between 1990 and 2000 the proportion of Gwinnett's residents living in poverty increased slightly from 4% to 5.7%. However, the actual number of people living in

poverty increased dramatically by 137% or more than 19,000. These were both the largest percent and net increases in the Atlanta Region. Within Gwinnett County, the largest percent increases occurred in areas located in the I-85 corridor stretching from DeKalb County through Norcross and into Lilburn, Duluth and Suwanee.

Map 12 presents the change in the proportion of residents living in poverty since 1990 in Gwinnett County by 1990 census tract. While the overall proportion of people living below the poverty level increased slightly in Gwinnett there were large increases in census tracts located adjacent to DeKalb County and in Peachtree Corners, Norcross, and Lilburn. Two census tracts – 503.04 and 503.12 had proportion increases of over 10 points. Smaller but still significant increases in the proportion of people living in poverty occurred throughout central Gwinnett while much of the eastern and southeastern sections of the county experienced no change or a decline in the proportion of people living in poverty.

Generally proportions change as incomes rise or fall or as people with higher or lower incomes change residency. For example, as more people with higher incomes moved into eastern Gwinnett during the 1990s, the proportion of the population living below the poverty level declined.

In a pattern similar to the change in the proportion of the total population in poverty, Gwinnett County's rate of children in poverty also increased. Between 1990 and 2000 the proportion grew from 4% to 6%. This proportion increased because the actual number of children living in poverty increased dramatically by over 6,000 or 139%.

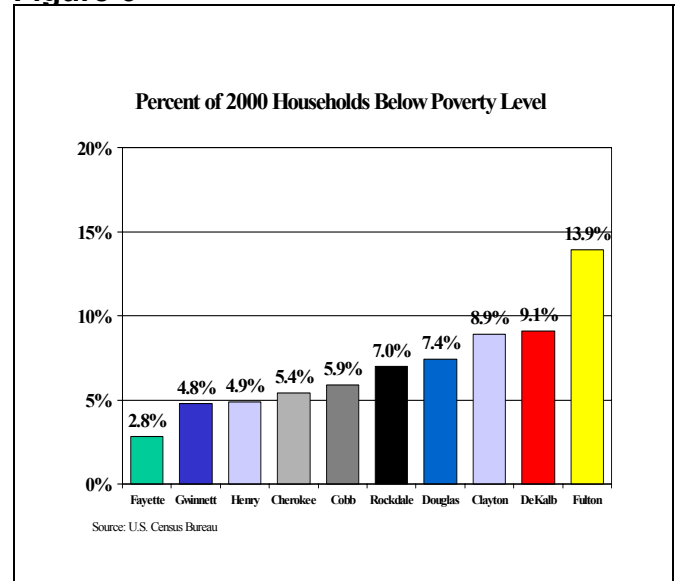
Gwinnett's share of seniors living in poverty dropped from 9.9% in 1990 to 5.5% in 2000.

However, the actual number of people age 65 or older living in poverty increased slightly from 1,577 to 1,666. Despite the small increase in the number of residents 65 or older living in poverty, the proportion decreased as Gwinnett's senior population almost doubled during the 1990s.

Households in Poverty

Figure 6 compares Gwinnett County's 2000 ratio of households that had incomes less than the poverty level with the other counties in the Atlanta Region. The regional distribution of households in poverty was similar to the pattern of the population in poverty with Fulton County having the largest proportion at 13.9% and Fayette County with the smallest ratio of households in poverty – 2.8%. Gwinnett and Henry counties had the second smallest regional proportions of households in poverty – 4.8% and 4.9% respectively.

Map 13 shows the percent of Gwinnett County's population that lived below the poverty level by census tract in 2000. Census tracts 503.04 and 503.12 in Norcross, 505.20 in Lawrenceville and

501.05 in Buford had the largest ratios of households in poverty. Approximately 12% to 17% of the households in these tracts had incomes below the poverty level. This was roughly triple the county proportion of 4.8%.

The proportion of households with incomes below the poverty level varied with the type of household. For instance, married-couple family households accounted for the largest number and percentage of Gwinnett's households in poverty. Approximately 32% of all of Gwinnett's households that had incomes below the poverty level were married-couple families.

Female-headed family and female-headed nonfamily households accounted for the next largest proportions – 22% each. Combined female-headed households accounted for 44% or almost half of all Gwinnett's households in poverty. The remaining percentage was comprised of male-headed families and male-headed nonfamily households.

Map 14 presents the 1990-2000 percent change in the county's households living in poverty. Between 1990 and 2000 the proportion of households living in poverty in Gwinnett increased slightly from 4% to 4.8%. However, the actual number of households with incomes below the poverty level almost doubled. The number of households increased 92% or over 4,600. These were also the largest percent and net increases in the Atlanta Region.

Within Gwinnett County, the largest percent increases occurred in areas located in the I-85 corridor stretching from DeKalb County through Norcross and into Lilburn, Duluth, and Lawrenceville. Most of the census tracts in these areas reported increases in the number of households with incomes below the poverty level of over 100%.

Map 15 presents the change in the proportion of households with incomes below the poverty level since 1990 in Gwinnett County by 1990 census tract. While the overall proportion of households with incomes below the poverty level increased slightly in Gwinnett, there were large increases in census tracts located adjacent to DeKalb County and in Peachtree Corners, Norcross, and Lilburn. Five census tracts – 503.04, 503.12, 504.07, 504.08, and 504.10 had proportion increases ranging from 6 to 9.8 points.

Other census tracts in Peachtree Corners, Norcross, and Stone Mountain experienced smaller yet still significant increases in the proportion of households with incomes below the poverty level. These increases ranged from 3 to 6 percentage points. Much of the eastern and southeastern sections of the county experienced no change or a decline in the proportion of households reporting incomes below the poverty level.

SUMMARY

Gwinnett's household and family incomes as well as population and household poverty rates underwent notable changes during the 1990s. Major changes included a significant increase in Gwinnett's median household income and per capita incomes and the phenomenal growth in the county's number of high-income households. Attracted by numerous employment opportunities, moderate housing costs and quality educational services and facilities, Gwinnett experienced a large in- migration of people with higher incomes thus raising median incomes and increasing the number of higher income households in the county.

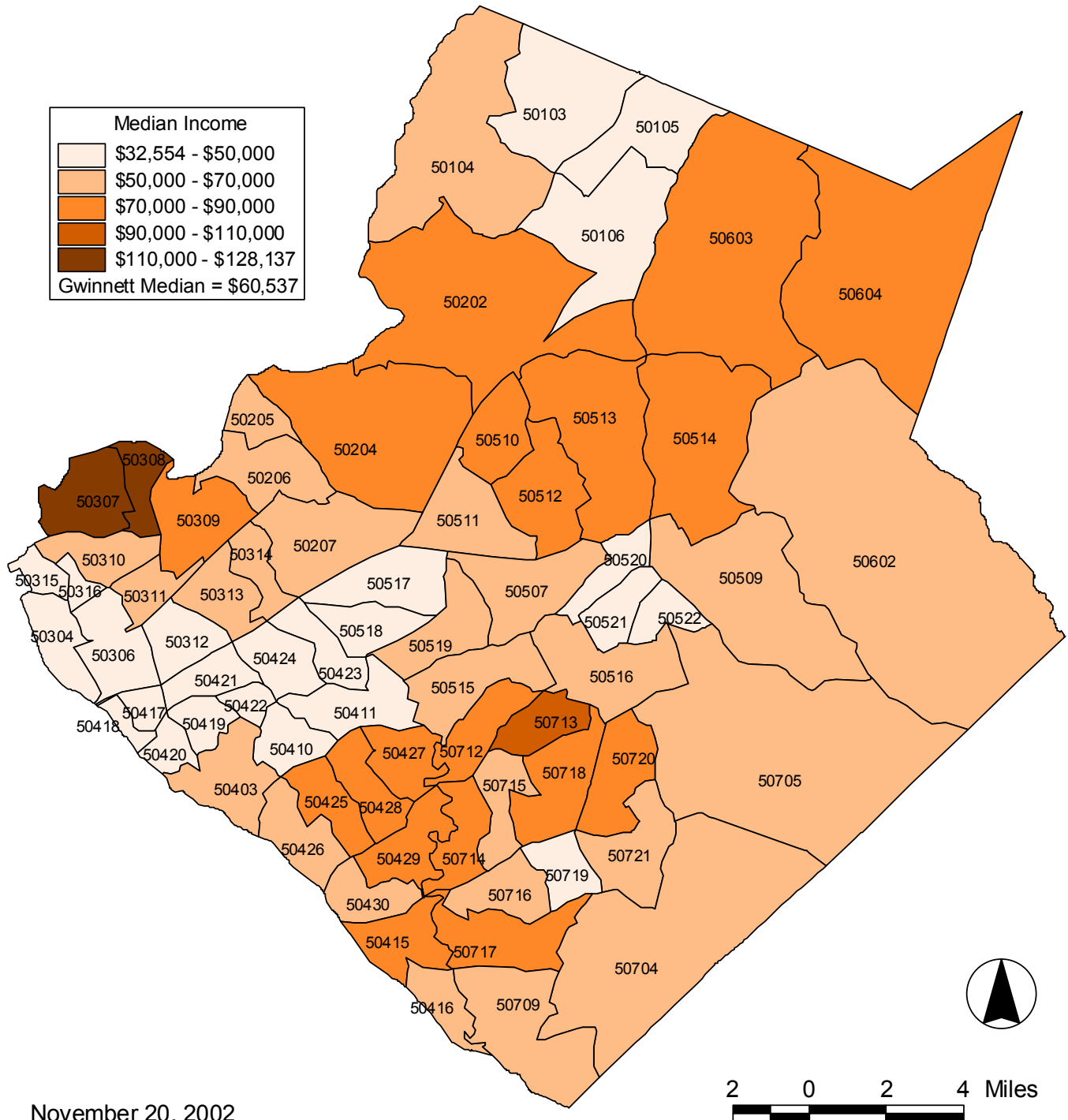
Despite growing median incomes and an increase in the number of higher income households, the population that was living in poverty in the county doubled during the 1990s.

While people and households in poverty were located throughout Gwinnett, these people and households were concentrated primarily in the Peachtree Corners, Norcross, Lilburn, Buford, and Lawrenceville areas of the county.

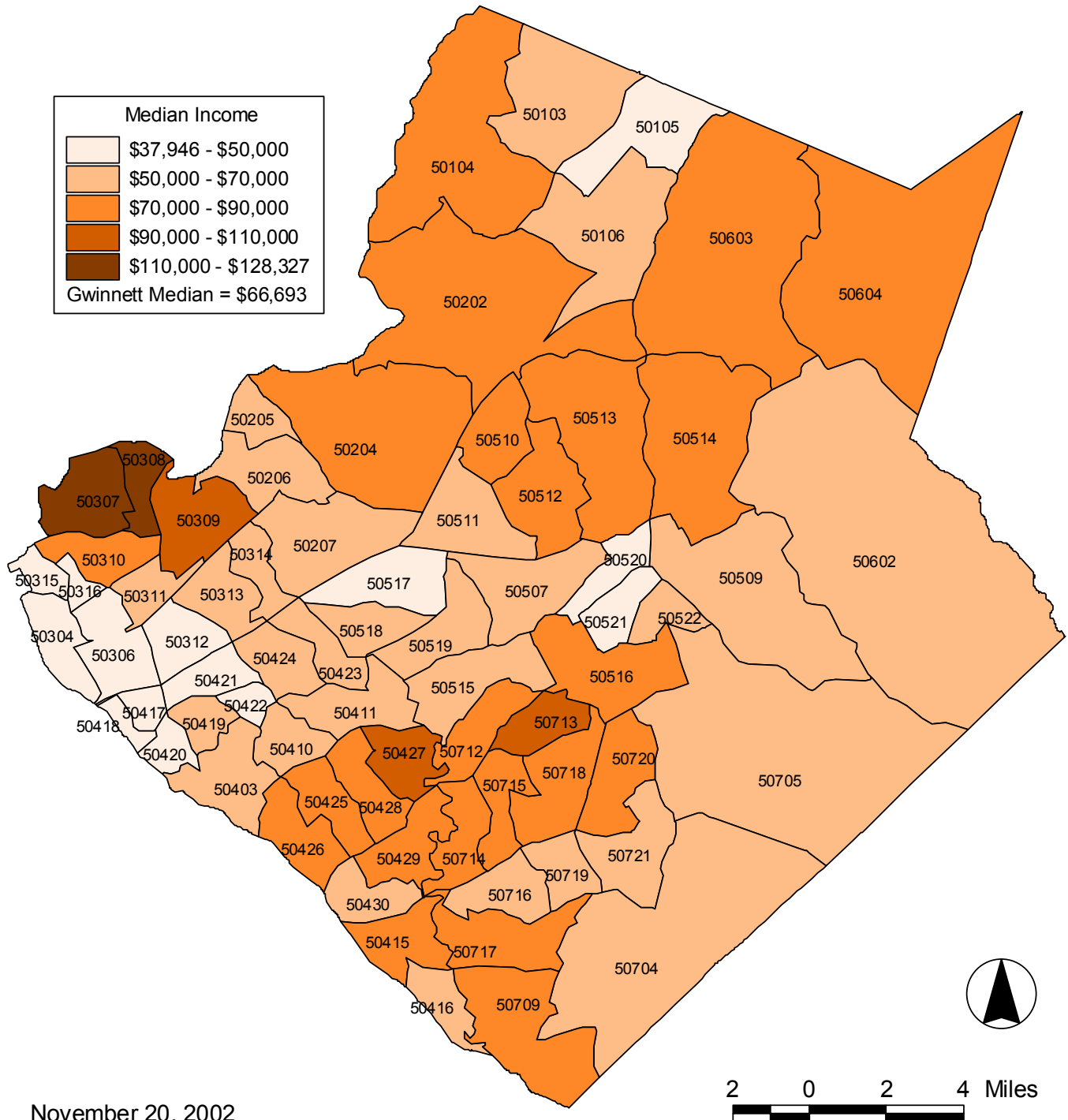
Gwinnett's median incomes will probably continue to rise during the 2000s albeit at a slower rate than was experienced during the past decade. In addition, the number of households in the higher income categories will continue to increase as incomes rise through higher salaries and more two wage earner households. However, the rate of increase in the number of higher income households will probably be less than the rate of change experienced during the 1990s.

Map 1 2000 Median Household Income



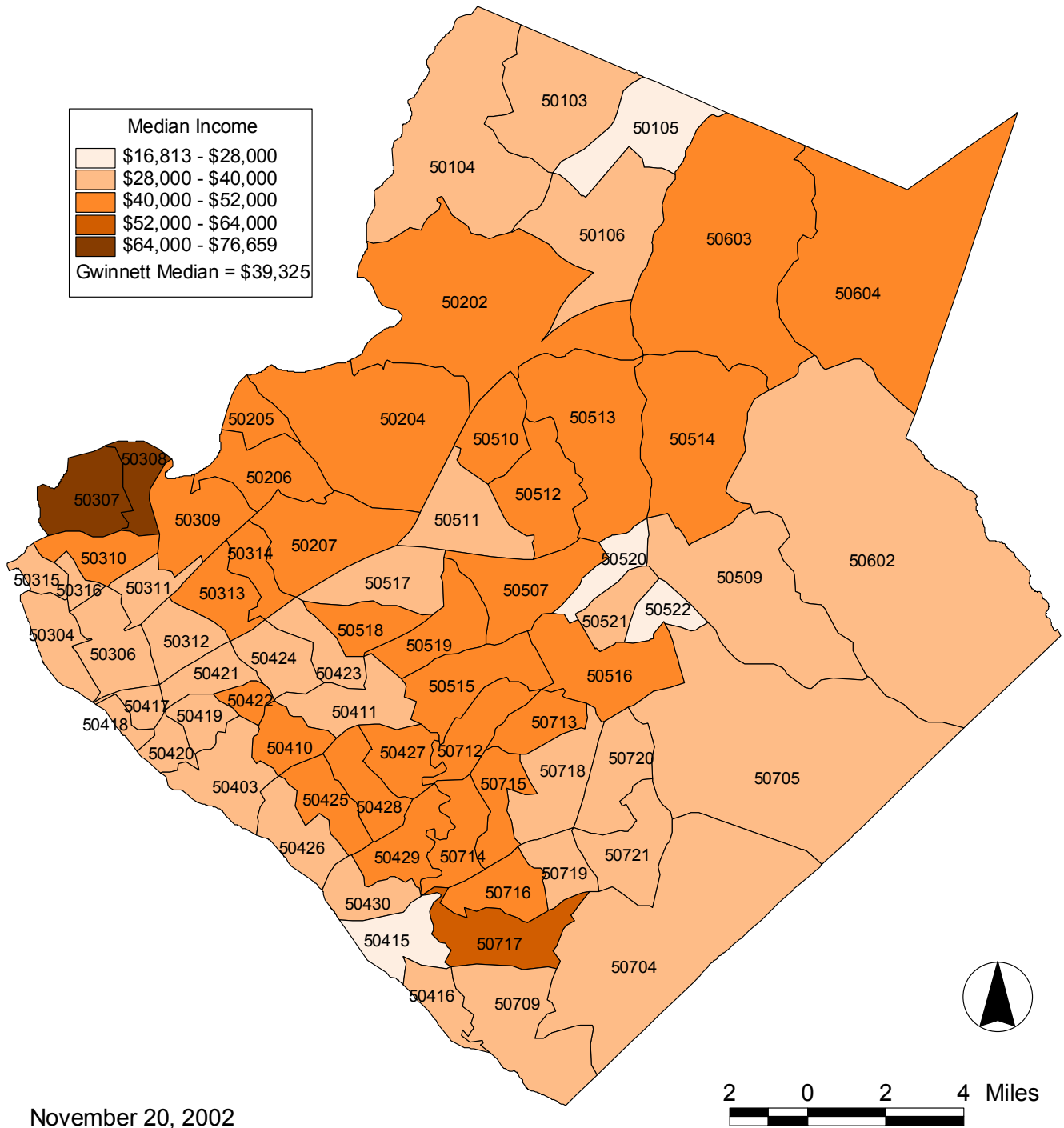

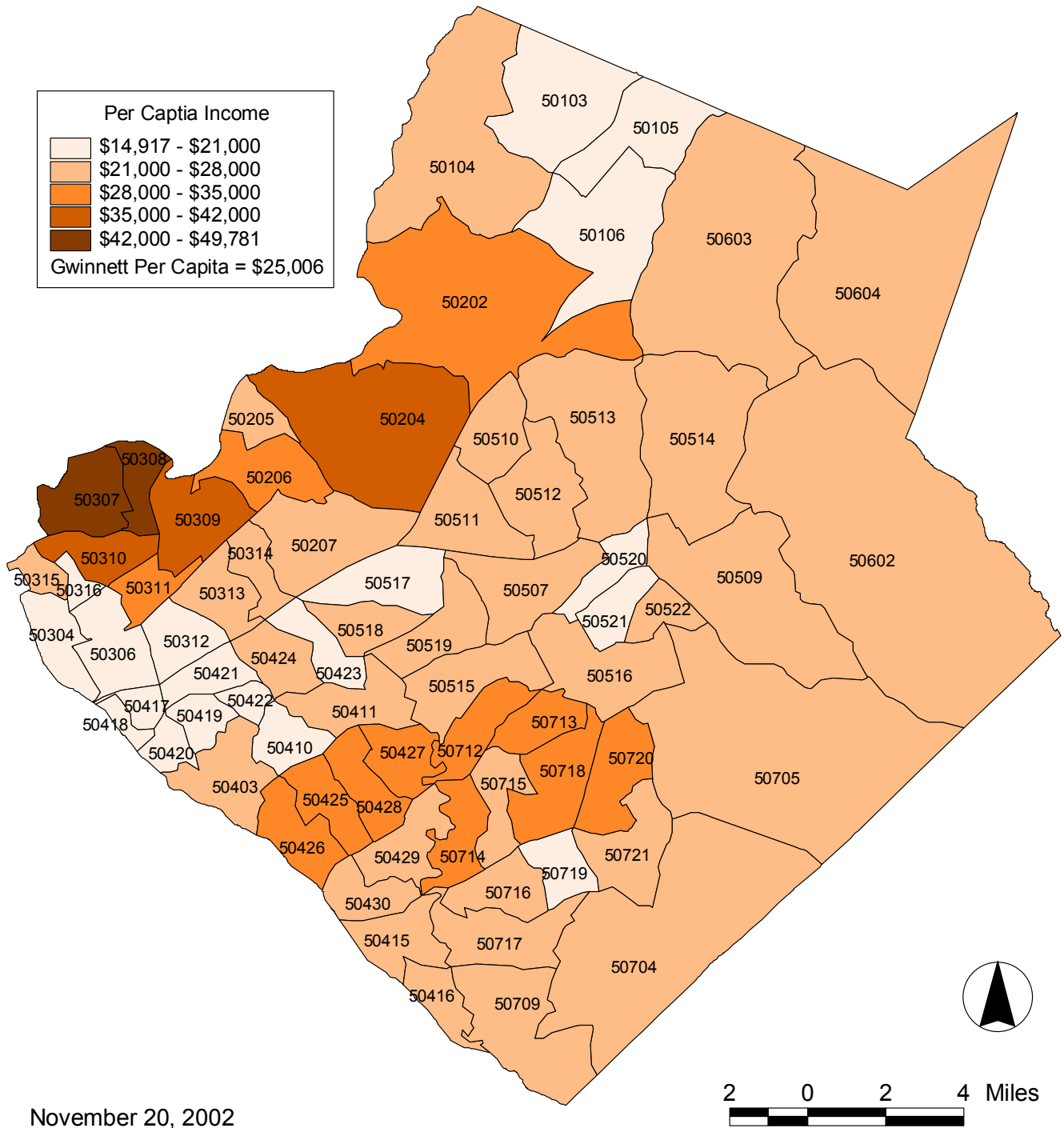
Map 3 2000 Median Nonfamily Household Income

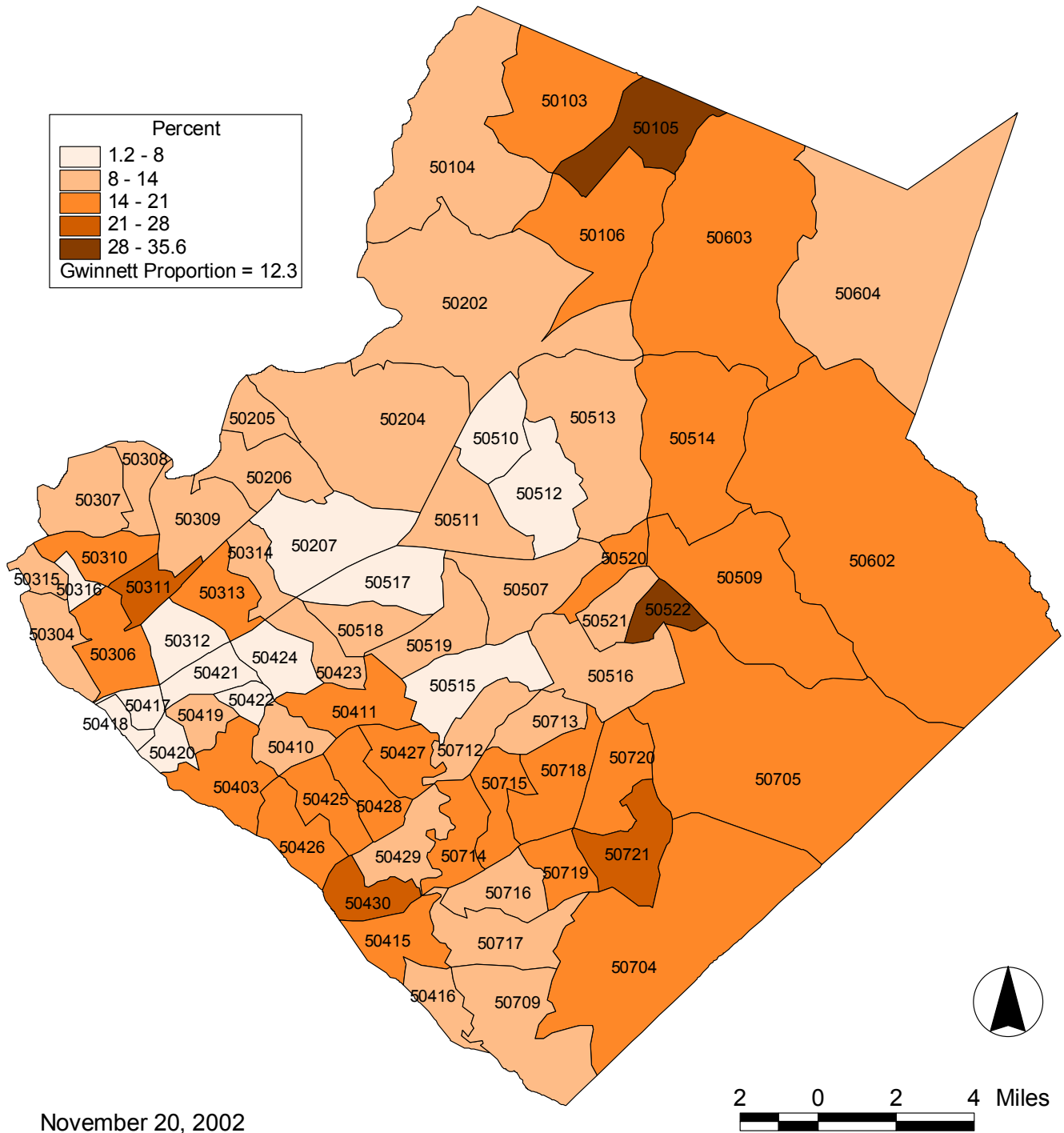
Map 4 2000 Per Capita Income



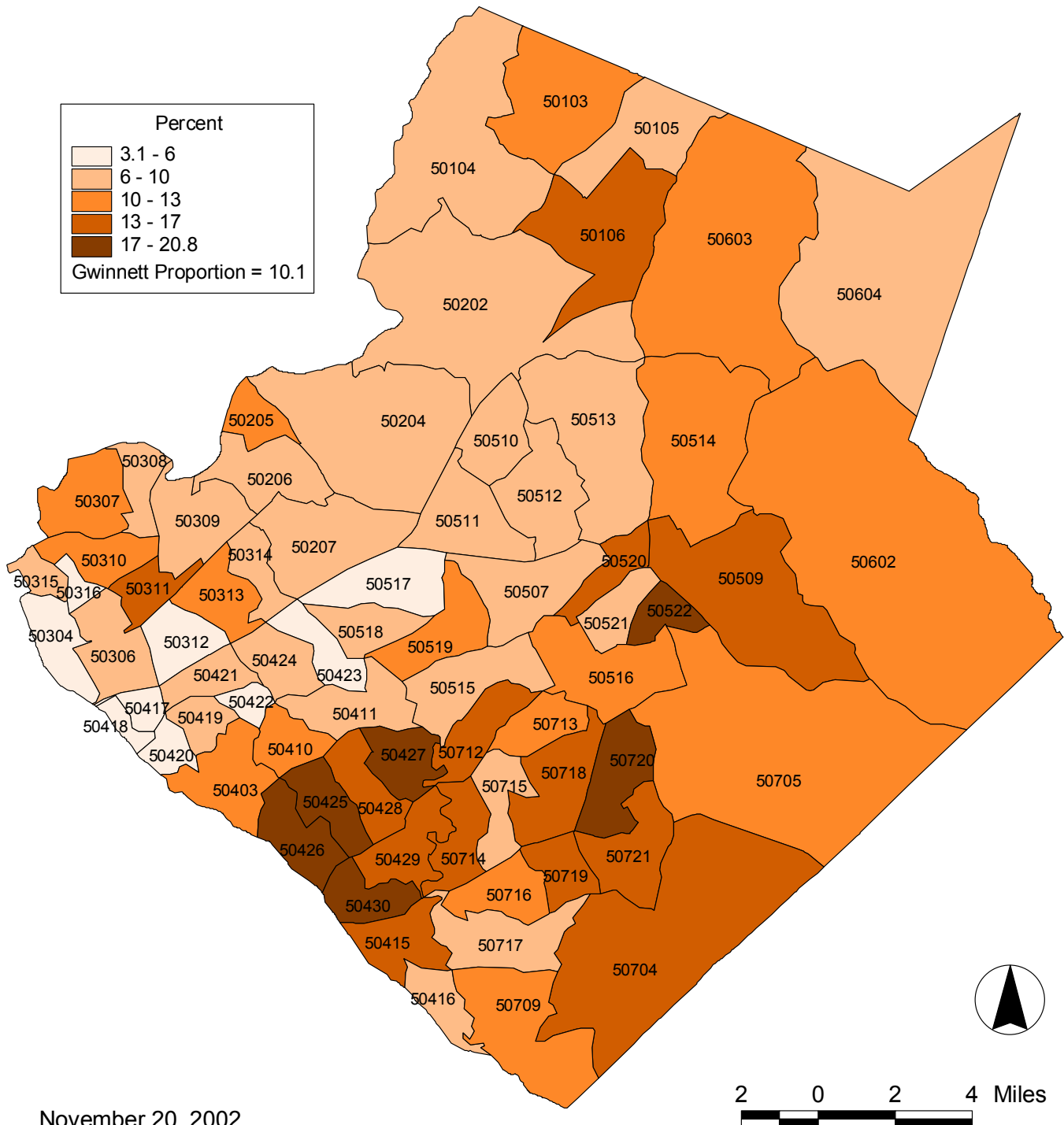
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Map 5 Percent of Households with Social Security Income in 2000

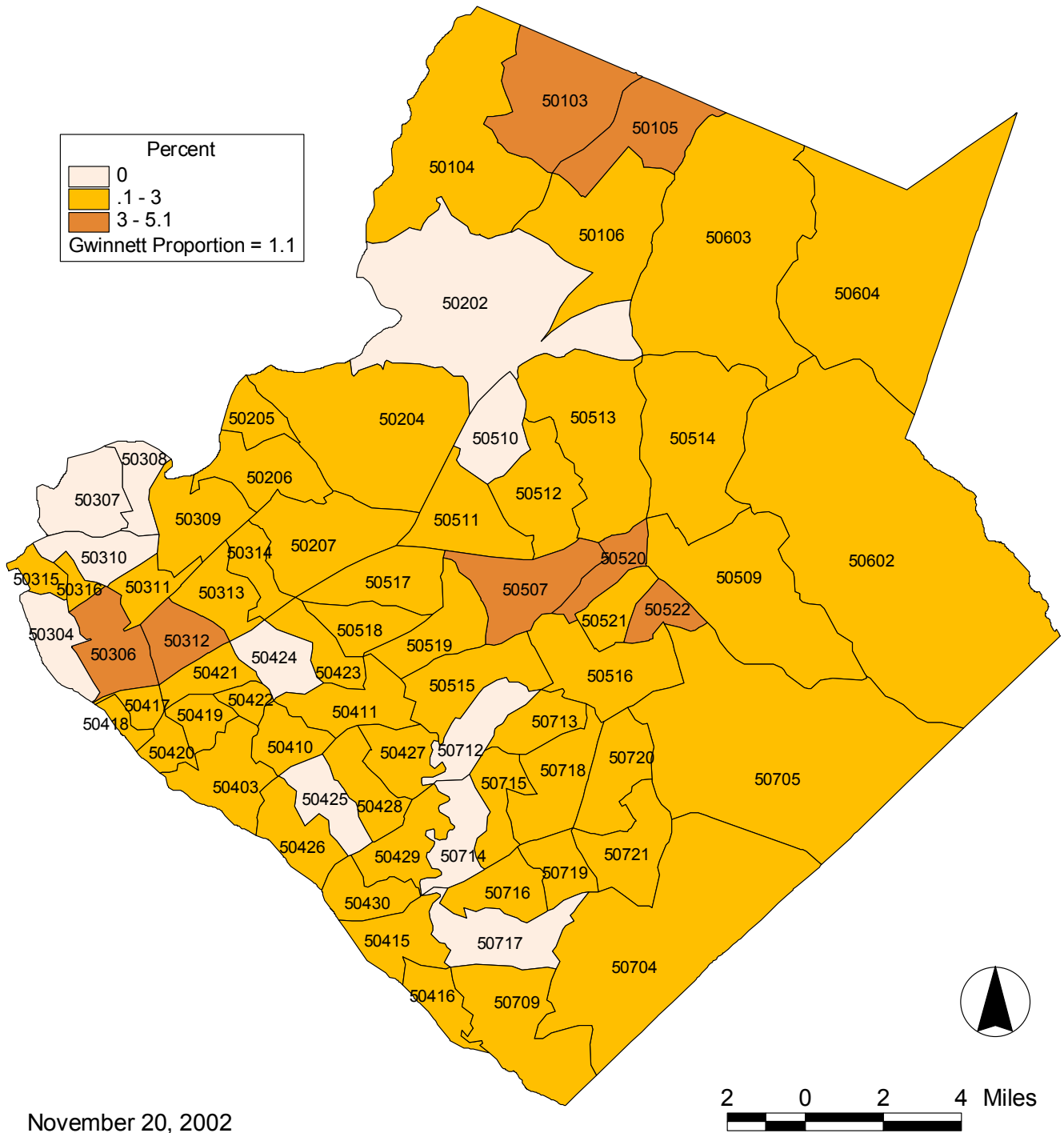


Map 6 Percent of Households with Retirement Income in 2000



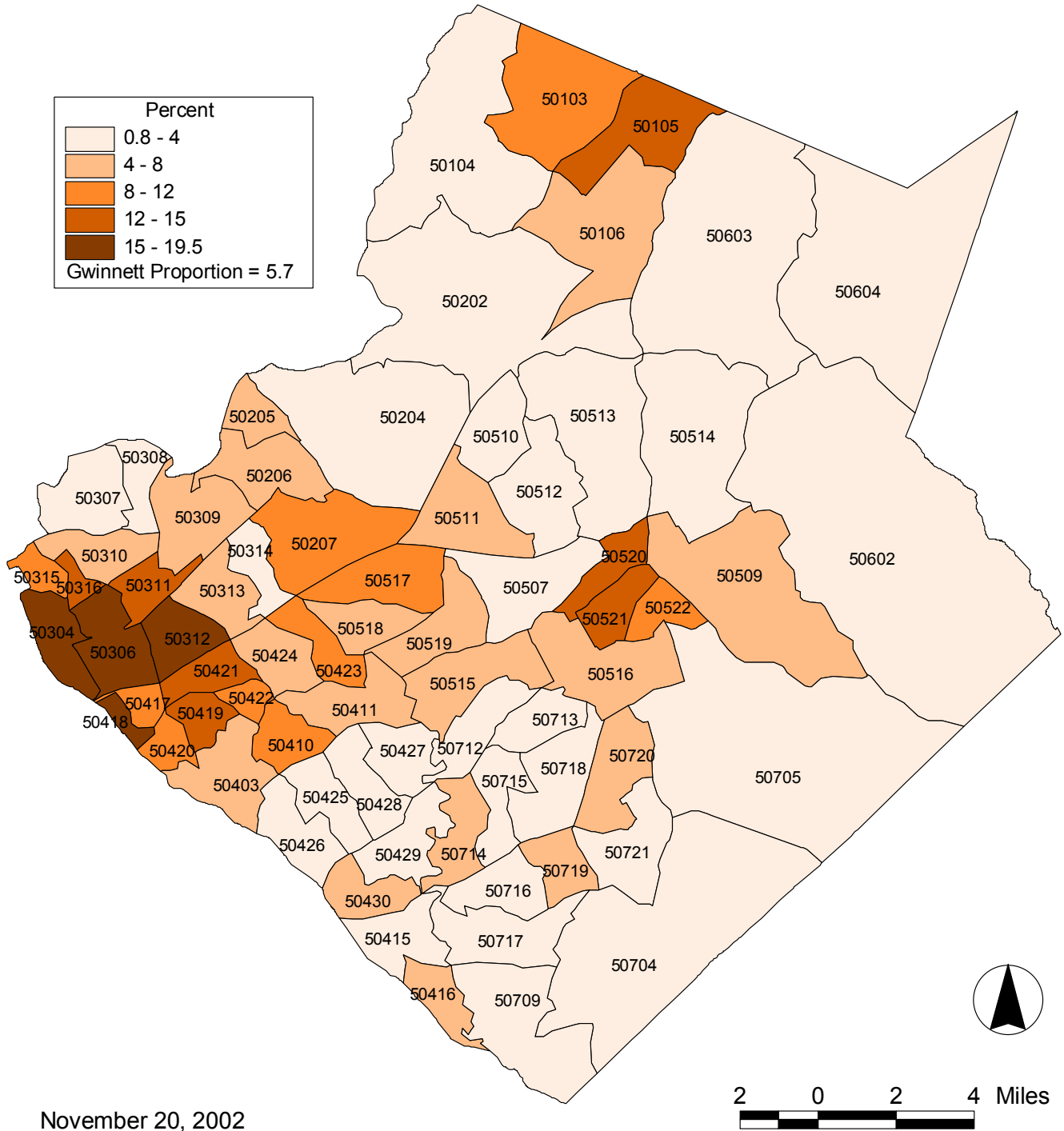

Percent of Households with Public Assistance Income in 2000

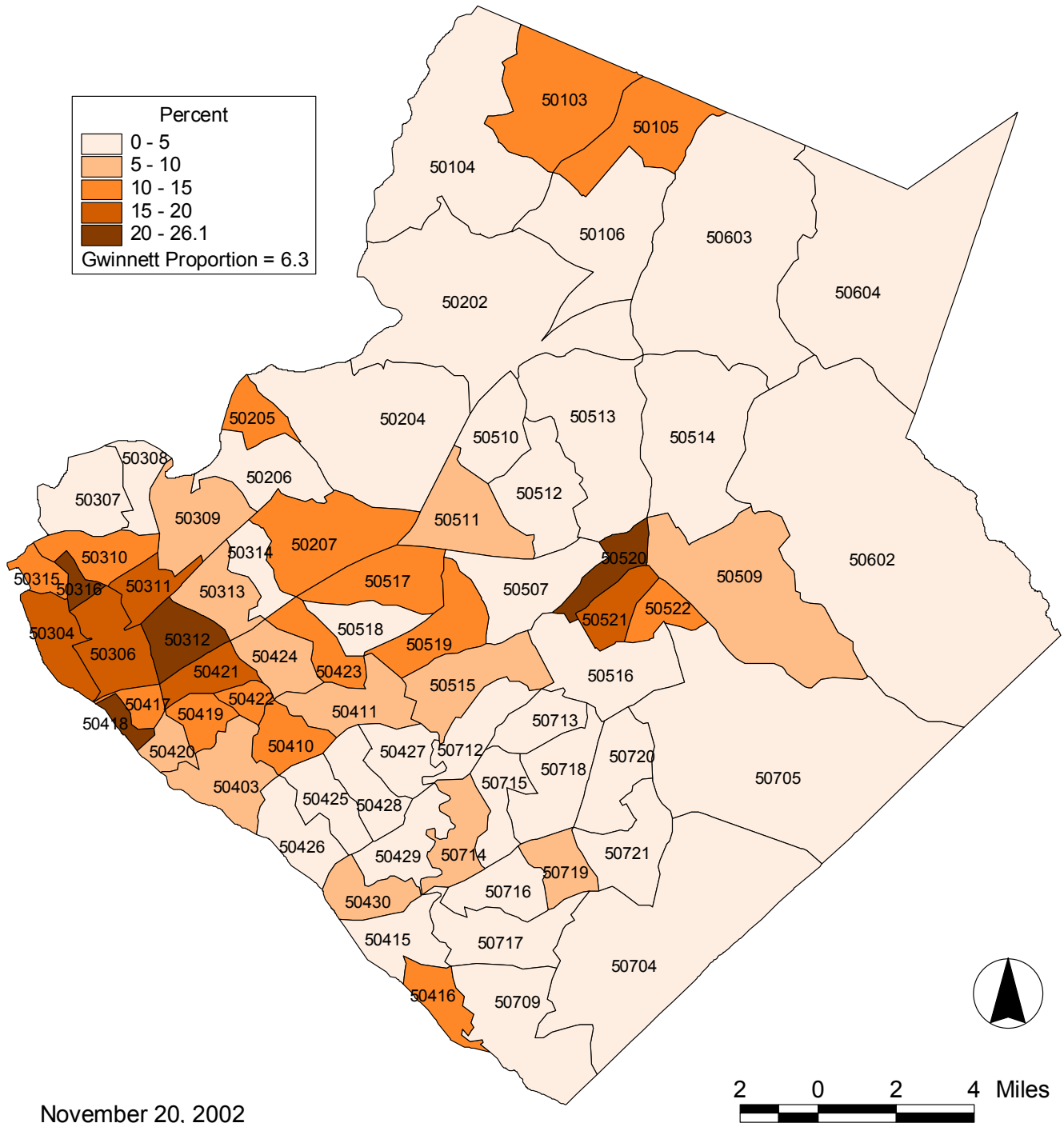


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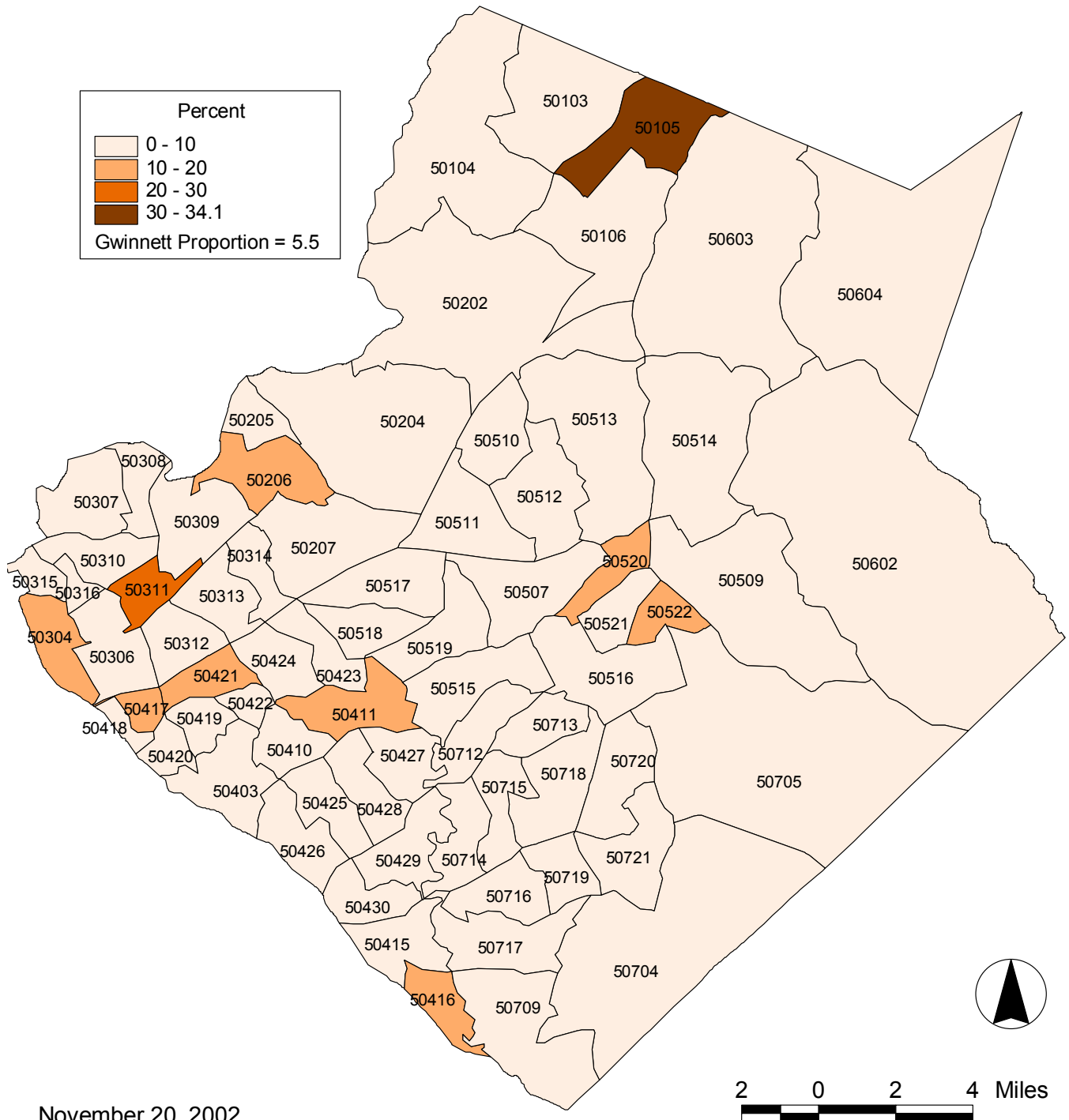
Map 8 Percent of Population Below Poverty Level in 2000



Map 9 Percent of Population Under 18 Years of Age Below Poverty Level in 2000



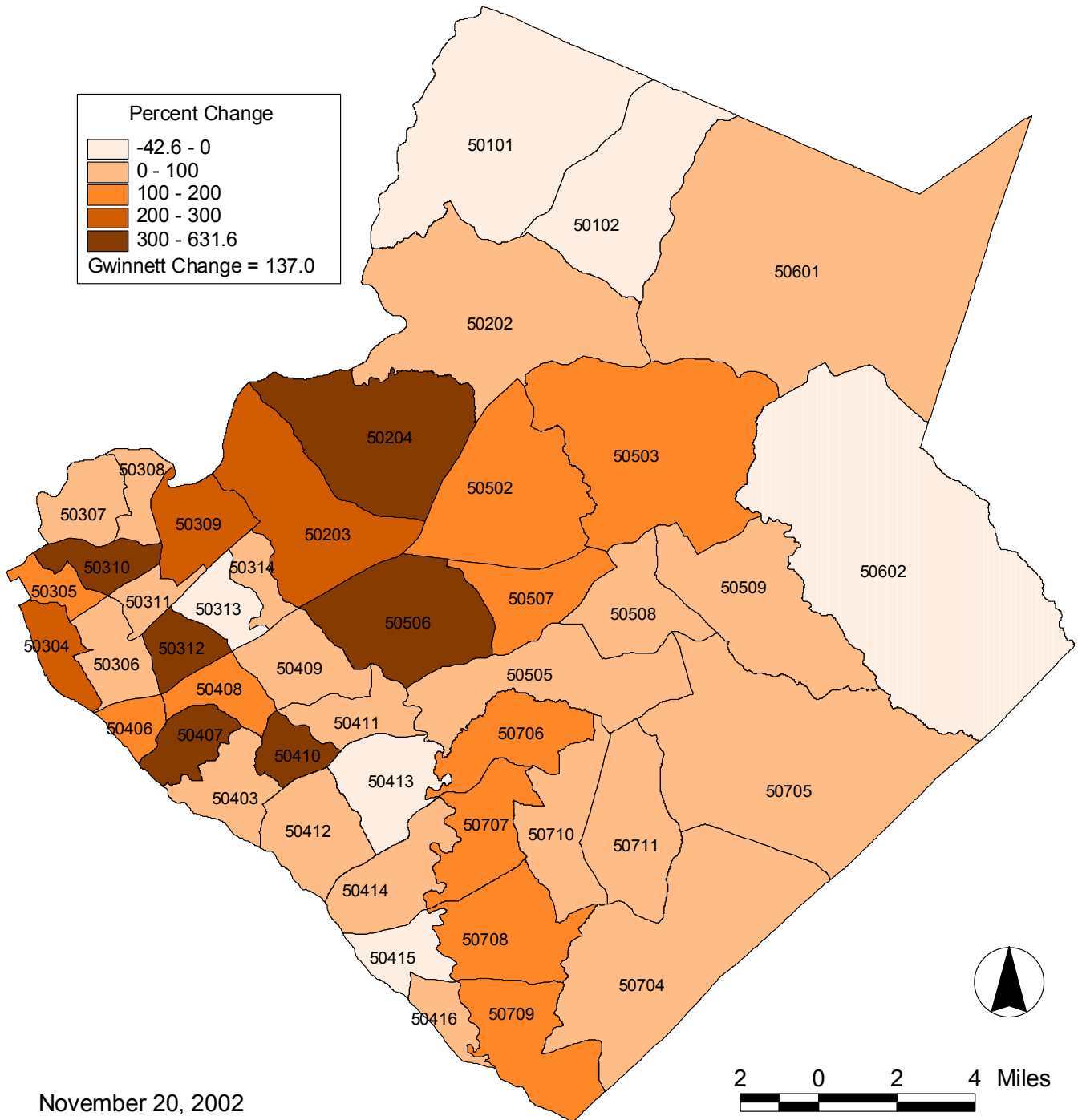
Map 10 Percent of Population 65 Years of Age or Older Below Poverty Level in 2000

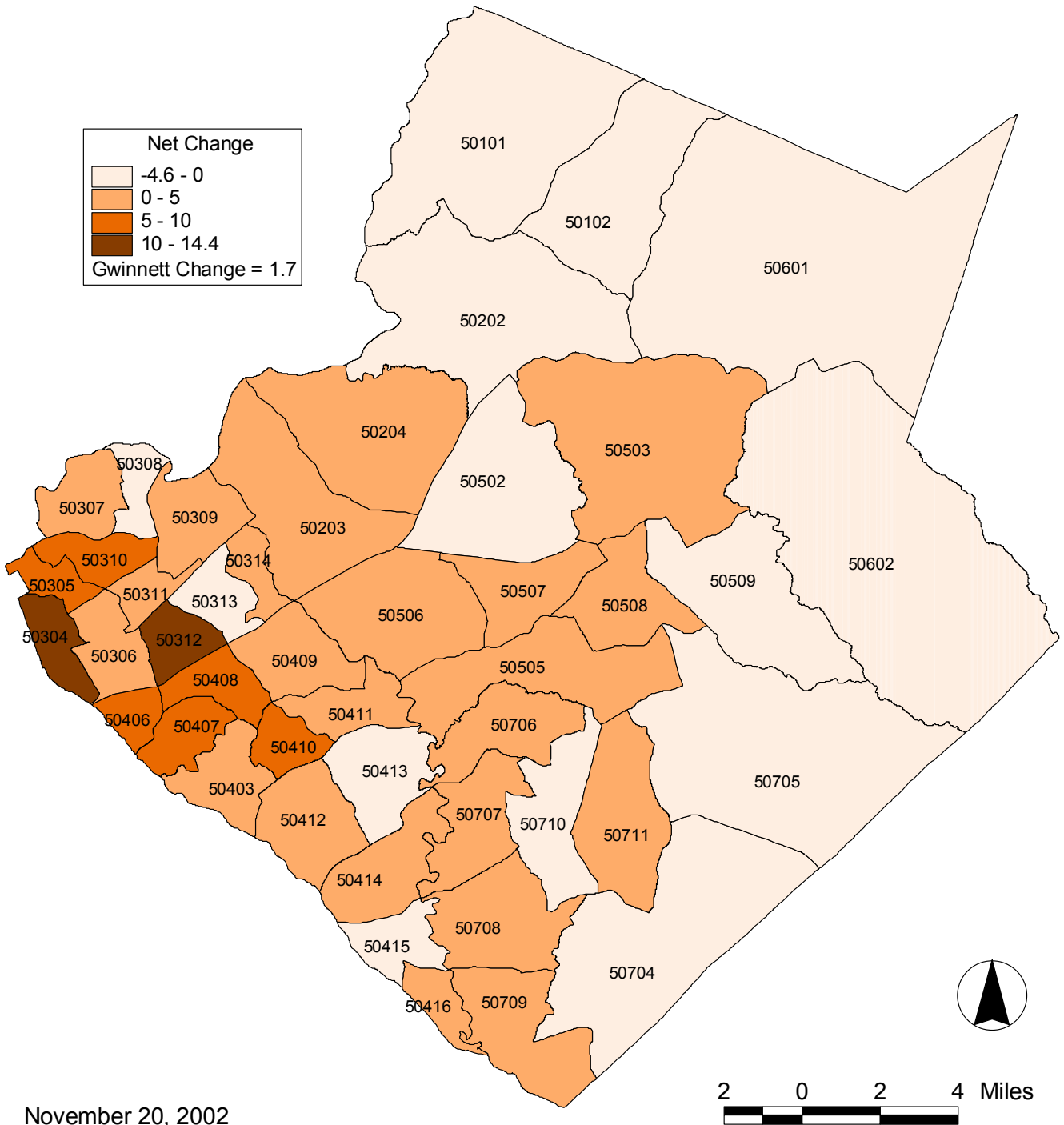

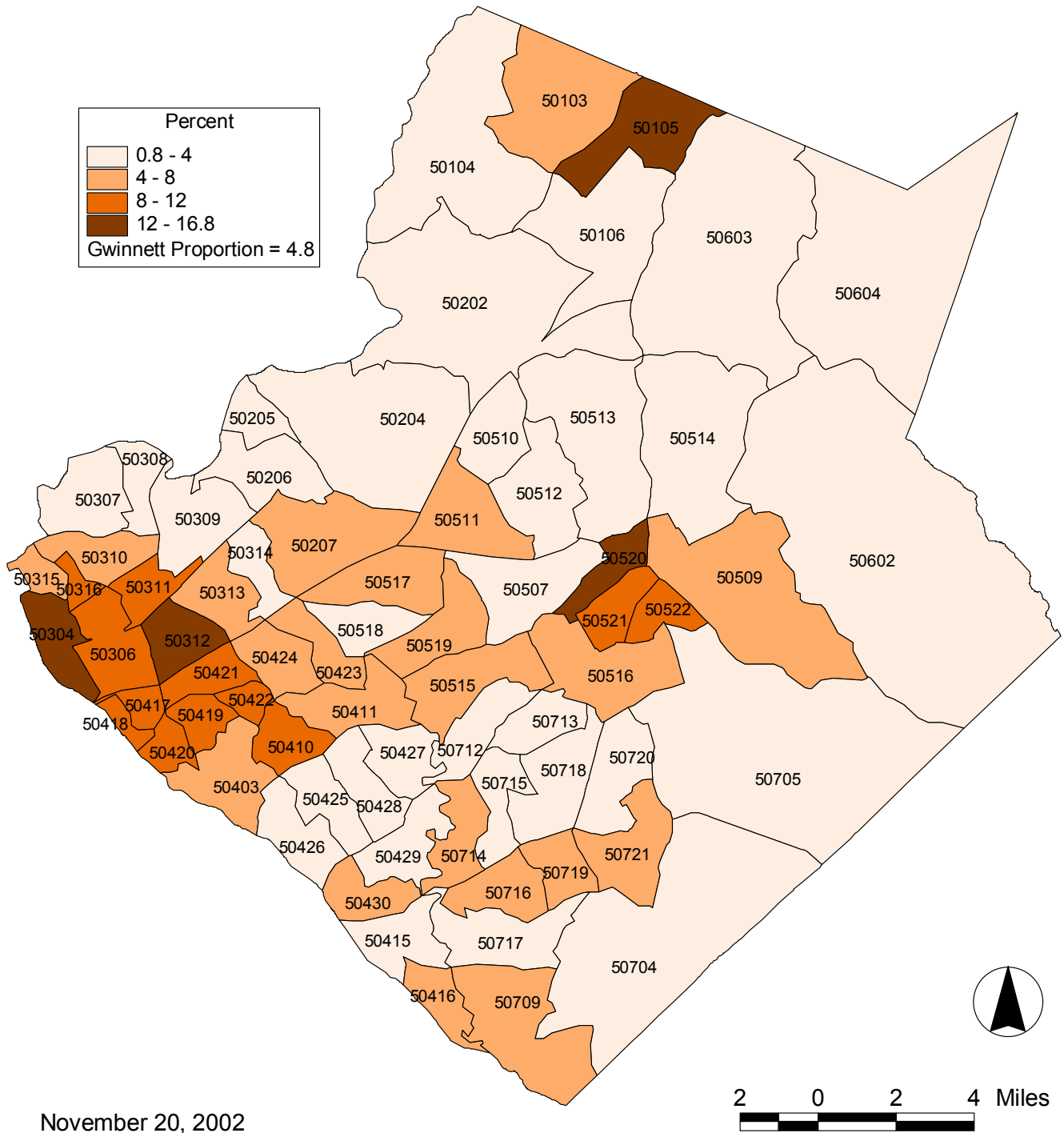
Map 12 1990-2000 Change in Proportion of Population Below Poverty Level

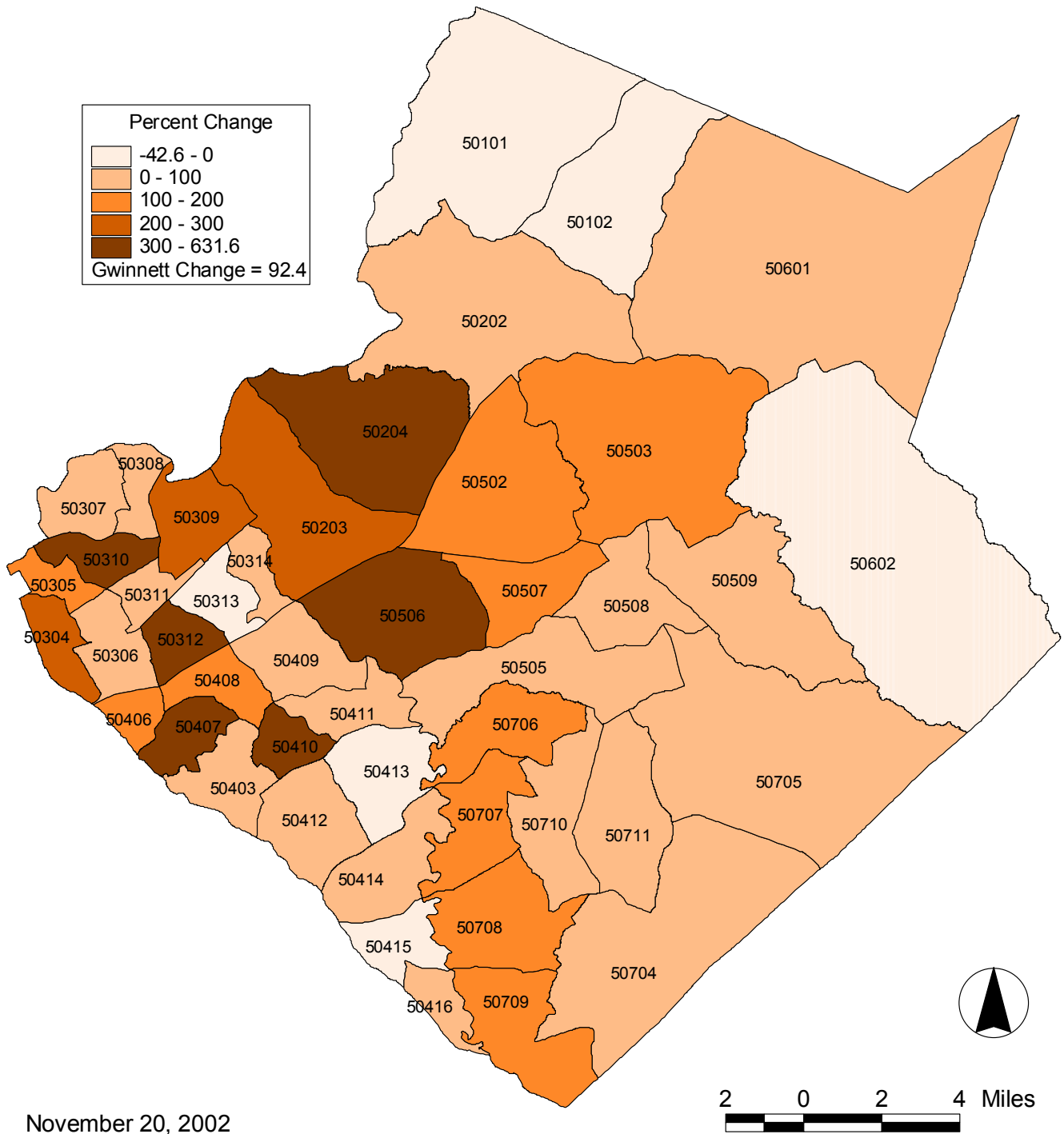

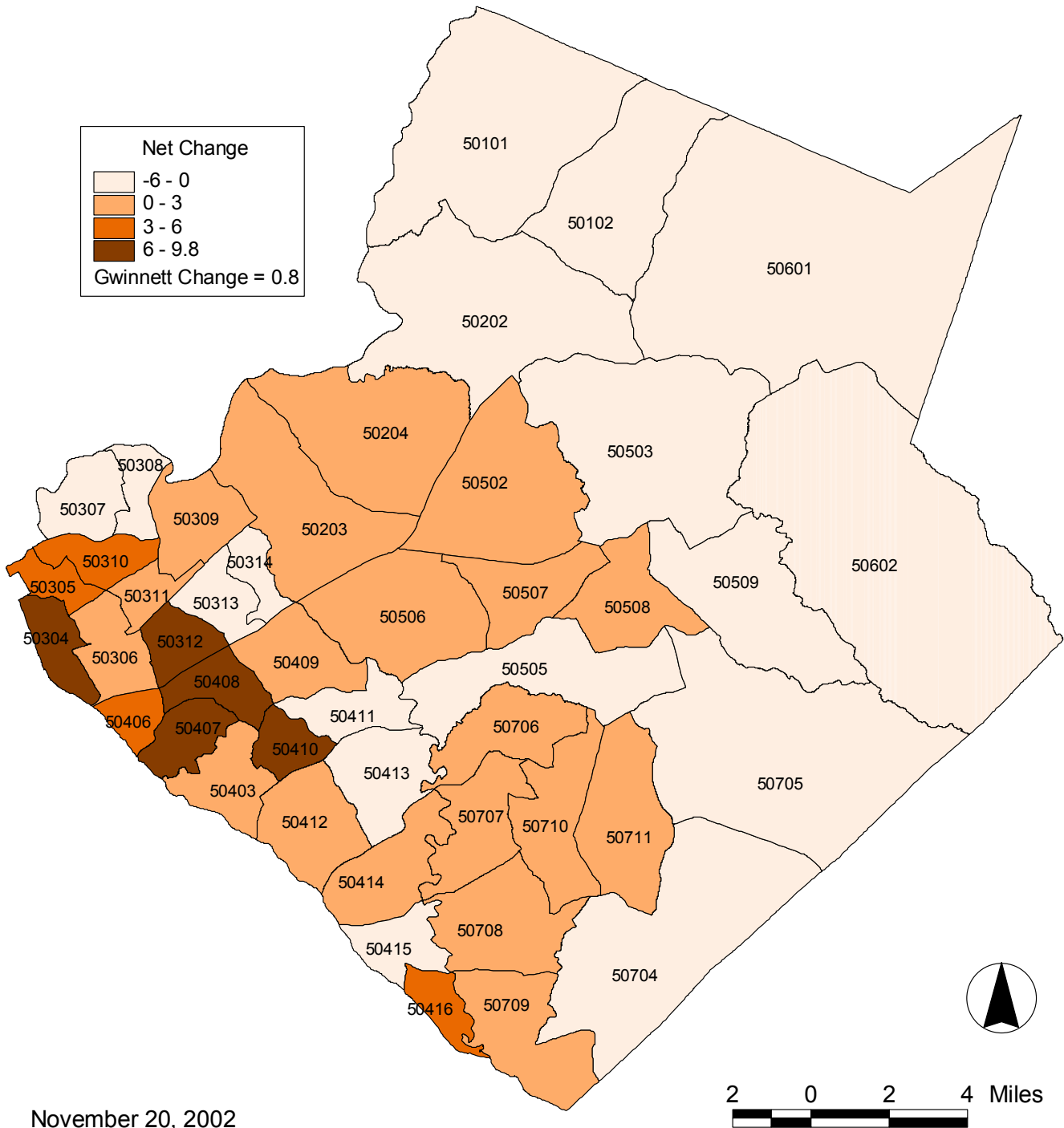
Map 14 1990-2000 Percent Change in Households Below Poverty Level

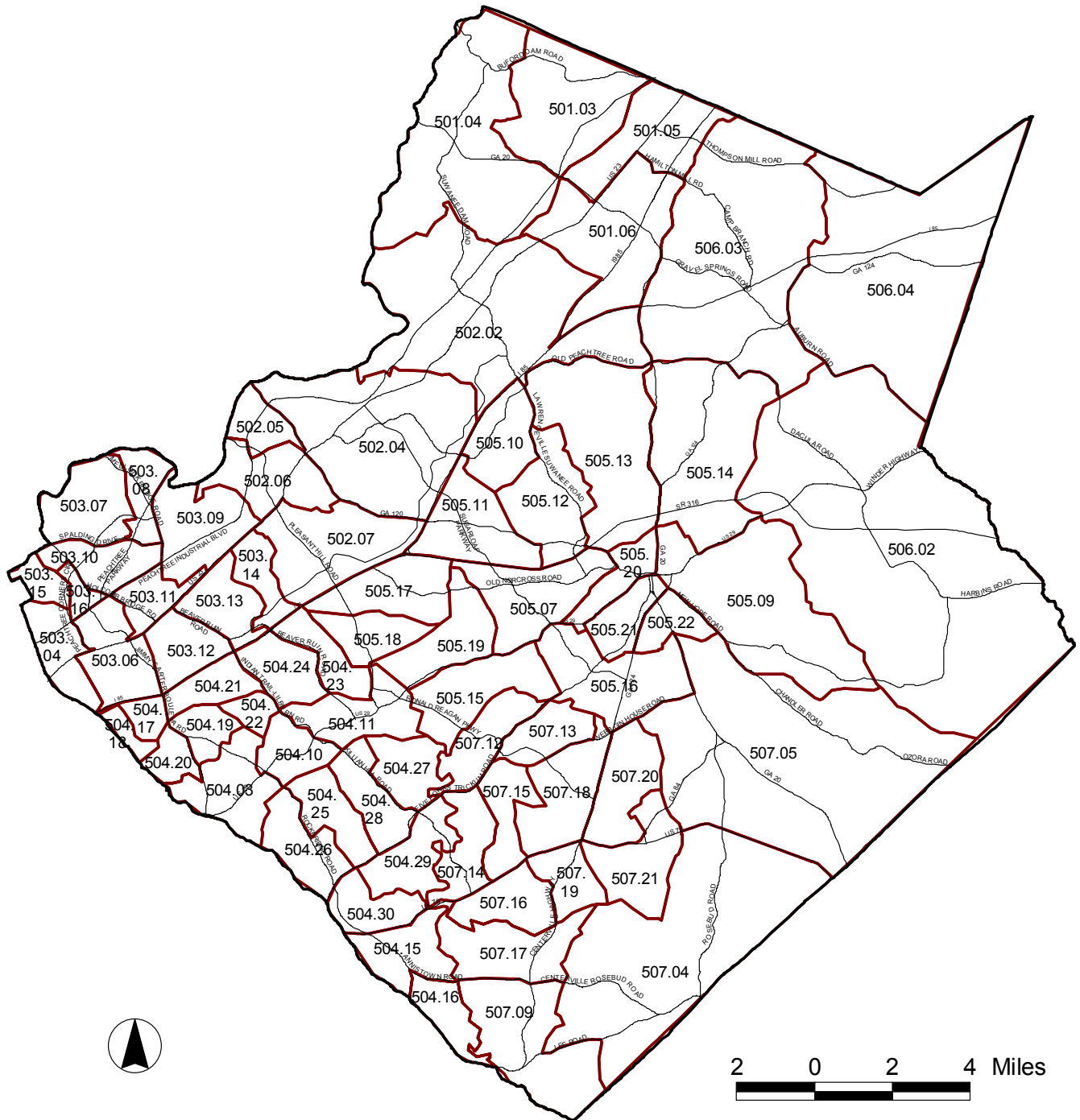

1990-2000 Change in Proportion of Households Below Poverty Level



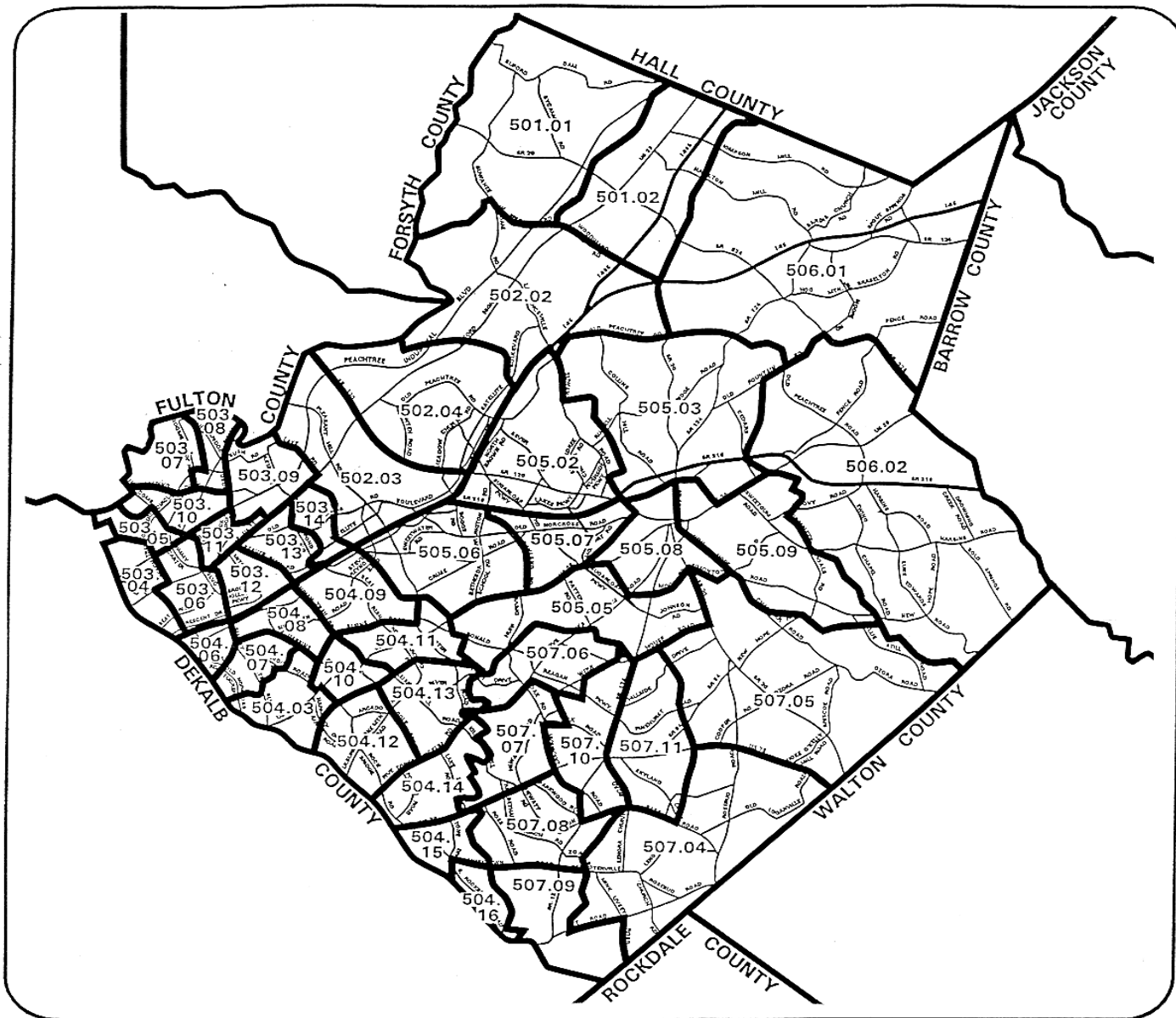
