Combine this with over 700 miles of storm drainage pipe and 600,000 Gwinnett residents, and there are bound to be some problems. The Department of Public Utilities needs every County resident to be watchful for water trouble in their area and report the problems they see through our 24 hour call center. When

you call, please be able to provide as much information as possible. Try to answer the questions Who, What, When, Where, Why, and How as they apply to each situation. Some possible problems that may be reported through the call center are as follows:



- ◆ Damaged Pipes
- ◆ Illegal dumping into the storm drain
- ◆ Water Leaks
- ◆ Flooding
- ◆ Easement Maintenance
- ◆ Drainage Problems
- ◆ Sanitary Sewer Overflow
