

- Returned to in-person community outreach opportunities to educate the citizens of the county about the services provided by the Probate Court






Challenges

- Staff development




Estate Filings January – July






Guardianship/Conservatorship Petitions January – July






Compliance Reports Filed January – July






Mental Health Petitions January – July






Vital Records Issued

Birth and Death Certificates | January – July






WCL Applications in 2022

Operational Decisions


- Offer Guide and File software through the court's case management system

2023 Decision Package

- Request for new Associate Judge position (Cost \$141,533).
- With the amount of growth that Gwinnett County has seen, it is unrealistic, if not impossible, for the one elected judge and one appointed associate judge to effectively manage the entire workload of a county the size of Gwinnett
