Key dates for upcoming elections

Remember these important dates, and confirm your voter registration by the April 20 registration deadline:

- General Primary/Nonpartisan Election: May 19
- General Primary/Nonpartisan Election Runoff: June 16

Advance voting for the General Primary/Nonpartisan Election will take place April 27 through May 15 at 13 advance voting locations. Visit MVP.SOS.GA.gov to check your voter registration status, find your polling place, and view sample ballots.

Assessors' Office to issue Annual Notices of Assessment in April

Most residential and commercial Annual Notices of Assessment for 2026 are expected to be mailed in April. An Annual Notice of Assessment is not a tax bill. The notice informs you of the value assessed on your residential or commercial real estate as of January 1, 2026.

Property owners may appeal the assessed value within 45 days of the date of the notice by submitting a completed PT-311A state appeal form to the Assessors' Office or by visiting Gwinnett-Assessor.com.

TAX COMMISSIONER

Confirm your ID meets DMV requirements

Did you know you can use almost any government-issued ID to title a motor vehicle? Acceptable forms of ID include a Georgia driver's license, a Georgia state ID issued by the Department of Driver Services, or a U.S. passport. For Gwinnett County DMV needs, visit GwinnettTaxCommissioner.com or visit one of the five tag offices around the county.

PUBLIC SAFETY

Beware of planning and zoning application scams

Scammers posing as planning and zoning offices have been reported across the country. Emails are designed to look like official County messaging and may include invoices requesting fraudulent application processing fees or counterfeit approval letters.

Planning and zoning applications for Gwinnett County are processed through GwinnettZIP.com. If you receive a suspicious email, avoid clicking links or providing payment information. Contact Gwinnett Planning and Development at 678.518.6000 to check whether an email is legitimate and to get assistance.

Rockbridge Road at Wydella Road to receive traffic improvements

The County will be installing a traffic light system at the intersection of Rockbridge Road and Wydella Road to enhance commuter safety and connectivity. The project includes the construction of one left turn lane on Rockbridge — northbound and southbound — onto Wydella Road. The County will also install sidewalks, along with curb and gutter and drainage improvements. The project is partially funded by the Special Purpose Local Option Sales Tax program.
