School zone speed enforcement program extended through 2026

Gwinnett County has renewed its contract with Red-Speed Georgia LLC through May 2026 to continue school zone speed enforcement. The program aims to reduce dangerous driving near schools using speed-detection cameras that operate during designated school hours only.

Integrated with license plate readers, the system has been successful in reducing speeding near schools, boosting safety for students and drivers alike. The violator-funded program is expected to generate \$2.7 million and includes automated cameras, monitoring, billing, and collections. County secures \$1.3 million in grant funding for court programs

The County will receive seven grants from the Criminal Justice Coordinating Council totaling more than \$911,000 for Superior, State, and Juvenile Courts. The funding will support local court programs — including Adult Drug Court, Mental Health Court, and Veterans' Intervention Program — that serve residents navigating substance use, mental health challenges, and recovery. The programs have nearly 1,500 graduates, emphasizing long-term recovery and second chances. The County will also receive a Juvenile Justice Incentive Grant just under \$480,000 to expand evidence-based services for at-risk youth in partnership with CHRIS 180.

Keep grass clippings out of stormwater drains

Did you know that letting yard waste like grass clippings enter a storm drain could lead to water pollution? Grass clippings may seem harmless, but if swept into a storm drain, they can break down and release nutrients into the water. These excess nutrients can lead to algae blooms and oxygen depletion. Grass clippings can also contribute to clogs, preventing rainwater from draining quickly. The County's Illicit Discharge and Illegal Connection Ordinance prohibits the discharge of anything other than rainwater into storm drains.

If you see a discharge entering a storm drain, call 678.376.7000 to file a report.

Step into the Hooper-Renwick Themed Library

A beloved piece of Gwinnett history is getting a new chapter. The former Hooper-Renwick School, which once served as the only public high school for Black students in the Gwinnett County school system, has been reimagined as a one-of-a-kind themed library and is now open to the public. Inside its preserved brick walls, visitors will find library amenities alongside community space and exhibits that showcase stories, accomplishments, and memorabilia related to the school.

The project was funded by the County's SPLOST program with additional contributions from the city of Lawrenceville, which also provided the 3.8-acre site, sidewalks, lighting, and landscaping for the project. Get a grant toward your first home

If you're a first-time homebuyer, you might be eligible for Gwinnett's Homestretch Down Payment Assistance Program. New or existing Gwinnett residents aspiring to own a home can receive down payment assistance of up to \$10,000 as a five-year deferred payment loan with 0% interest. Improvements coming to Stone Mountain Highway at US 78/SR 10

The County is adding three northbound left-turn lanes at East Park Place Boulevard to improve traffic flow and safety at the busy intersection of Stone Mountain Highway and US 78/State Route 10. The project includes upgraded traffic signals, a new concrete median, fresh sidewalks, curb and gutter work, and improved drainage. Drivers should expect delays, though nearby neighborhoods won't be directly affected. Funded by the SPLOST program, the project is anticipated to be completed by 2026.

County offices closed for Labor Day

All Gwinnett County Government offices, apart from operations required for the comfort and safety of residents, will be closed Monday, September 1 for the Labor Day holiday and will resume regular hours on Tuesday, September 2.
