Gwinnett County launches Community Service Aide Program

To enhance support for Gwinnett Police officers, the County introduced a new, non-sworn position within the Police Department called community service aides.

Community service aides handle functions like road closures, abandoned vehicles, and missing-person searches. These responsibilities will support our officers, allowing more time to respond quickly to urgent calls and critical incidents. For those interested in a career in law enforcement, this role can serve as a valuable pathway with hands-on experiences and a potential entry point into the profession.

More than 200 miles of County roads to be resurfaced

The Board of Commissioners awarded resurfacing contracts totaling \$12.7 million to maintain and extend the life of residential roadways. The contracts will allow Gwinnett to resurface more than 43 center-line miles of residential streets this cycle, with more than 200 miles scheduled for rehabilitation this year. These improvements demonstrate the County's commitment to preserving infrastructure and enhancing travel experience for residents and visitors.

Tax Assessors' Office issues Real Estate Property Annual Notices of Assessment

The Tax Assessors' Office has mailed approximately 308,000 Annual Notices of Assessment to residential and commercial property owners. Stay alert for yours to arrive in the mail, or you can download it at Gwinnett-Assessor.com. An Annual Notice of Assessment is not a tax bill. The notice informs you of the value assessed on your residential or commercial real estate as of January 1, 2025. Property owners may appeal the assessed value within 45 days of the date of the notice by submitting a completed PT-311A form online or by mail. Mailed forms must be received or postmarked within 45 days of the date of your notice. It is suggested to send mailed documents by a trackable method to confirm delivery. Title your mobile home

Did you know that you must title your mobile home in your name within 30 days of purchase? If you are a new mobile homeowner, you can visit any Gwinnett County Tax Commissioner's office to change the title and complete the Manufactured Home Change Request Form. If you do not have a title, call 770.822.8800 or email Tax@GwinnettCounty.com. Mobile home taxes are due April 1 each year. Any unpaid taxes must be paid at the time of the title transfer. - Keep children and pets at least 5 feet away from any cooking area

Putting pedestrians first at Beaver Ruin Road and Center Way

Exciting pedestrian-friendly improvements are coming to Beaver Ruin Road and Center Way. The Board of Commissioners recently awarded a \$4.77 million contract to E.R. Snell Contractor Inc. to construct new fencing on Beaver Ruin Road and Center Way bridges over Interstate 85 and install crosswalks at the intersection of Center Way and Brook Hollow Parkway. These upgrades aim to create a more accessible environment, encouraging safe roadways for walkers, joggers, and cyclists. The SPLOST-funded project is expected to be completed this fall. Get your rental home inspected

If your rental home is damaged, improperly maintained, unsanitary, or unsafe, you may request an inspection by visiting GwinnettZIP.com, emailing CodeEnforcement@GwinnettCounty.com, or calling 770.513.5004. Once a request is submitted, an inspection appointment will be scheduled. During the inspection, any code violations will be documented on a notice of violation. A Gwinnett Code Enforcement officer will then work with the property owner or manager to address all violations. For a list of common interior code violations, visit GwinnettCodeEnforcement.com.

Get rid of your hazardous waste

Clear out your garage and basement and dispose of your household hazardous waste! You can bring up to five disposable containers of waste products like paint, motor oil, batteries, cleaning chemicals, and more.
