

County opts out of Statewide Adjusted Base Year Homestead Exemption

The Gwinnett County Board of Commissioners voted in February 2025 to opt out of the new Statewide Adjusted Base Year Homestead Exemption introduced in House Bill 581. Three public hearings were held at the Gwinnett Justice and Administration Center in January and February – while cities and schools hosted their own hearings.

The County has an existing Value Offset Exemption that protects homeowners from tax increases due to increased property market values. Compared to the new Statewide Adjusted Base Year Homestead Exemption, the County's existing VOE protects against inflation and keeps County government taxes lower for homeowners. Unlike the existing County Government VOE, the base value of the home is adjusted annually for inflation under the new Statewide Adjusted Base Year Homestead Exemption, making it subject to increases. New roundabout coming to Lakeview Road

Gwinnett County is improving traffic flow and safety around Lakeview Road in Grayson. This project will add a new roundabout at the intersection of Lakeview Road, Pharrs Road, and Hillside Drive, where the three approaches are controlled by stop signs. It will also include new concrete sidewalks along the north side of Lakeview Road from Pharrs Road/Hillside Drive to Derrick Drive.

In addition to these improvements, the area will be enhanced with new curb and gutter, lighting, and drainage upgrades. Funded in part by the SPLOST program, the project is anticipated to be completed by 2026.

Apply for a Homestead Exemption by April 1

Looking to reduce your property tax bill? Apply for a homestead exemption. Owners who occupy a home in Gwinnett as their primary residence as of January 1 may qualify for an exemption this year. Avoid tax scams

Each tax filing season, scammers pose as IRS agents to trick residents into sharing personal information. By sharing this information, your life savings could be compromised. Here are some tips to help you avoid tax scams:

- Be cautious when choosing tax preparers and do research before handing over your information
- Watch for unsolicited emails, texts, and fake websites that might prompt you to click a link or share personal information
- Be on alert for phone scams; IRS representatives will never demand payments over the phone or leave threatening messages

Exciting changes coming to the Dacula Park Activity Building

County officials recently broke ground on the Dacula Park Activity Building expansion project. This project will convert the existing 7,440-square-foot building into a two-story, 34,000-square-foot community recreation center with a full-service senior wing. With a focus on enhancing programming on the eastern side of Gwinnett County, the new facility will include a gym with an upper-level walking track, art and dance studios, 76 additional parking spaces, and more. The \$12.8 million project is funded by the County's SPLOST program and Community Development Block Grant funds.

Apply for mortgage assistance

Gwinnett homeowners can apply for up to \$50,000 in mortgage assistance through the Georgia Mortgage Assistance program. To be considered, homeowners must be a legal Georgia resident, the household income must meet the Area Median Income limits, and the home must be the homeowners' primary residence.
