Gwinnett County will celebrate its bicentennial

birthday in 2018 with a yearlong celebration leading up to December 2018, the 200th anniversary of the county's founding.

Created on December 15, 1818, and named for Declaration of Independence signer Button Gwinnett, the land came from Cherokee and Creek Indians combined with a small portion of Jackson County. We were the 50th county formed in Georgia and are today its 50th largest in landmass. Still growing fast, by 2040 Gwinnett will likely have more residents that any other Georgia county.
