So far this year, we've been able to gather with great community organizations and residents alike to celebrate the unique spirit of Gwinnett.

On January 25, Community Outreach participated in the [20th annual Martin Luther King Jr. Day Parade](#) in downtown Lawrenceville. Gwinnett Youth Commissioners carried banners celebrating the occasion and remind parade goers about the importance of participating in the 2020 Census.

On January 27, Gwinnett Youth Commissioners hosted a **Youth Leaders Breakfast** and facilitated conversation with elected officials and community leaders across Gwinnett County.

On February 12, Chairman Nash gave her final [State of the County address](#) at the Infinite Energy Center. During her address, she issued several challenges to the future leaders of Gwinnett and emphasized the importance of early childhood literacy.

#GwinnettCounts Census Update

The 2020 Census is here, and we are encouraging everyone to respond! Even though it's past Census Day, April 1, **it's not too late to respond**. In fact, you can complete your questionnaire online, by phone, or by mail any time before

August 14.

It's our goal to support the U.S. Census Bureau's mission of making sure every resident is counted once, only once, and in the right place. Mailers have been sent in the last few weeks that include instructions on how to complete the census. You can also visit [My2020Census.gov](https://www.census.gov/my2020census) to answer the questionnaire online. It takes less 10 minutes to complete, but it makes a huge impact on our future. Your responses help determine funding for hospitals, schools, and more for our community.

Sponsored by the Board of Commissioners and coordinated through the Community Outreach office, the Gwinnett County Youth Commission is a leadership and service oriented program


