Get vaccinated and earn \$100 at Vaccines Aren't Scary event

Gwinnett County is offering **\$100 Visa gift cards** to people ages 12 and up who receive a COVID-19 vaccine at its vaccine incentive event this weekend. The Vaccines Aren't Scary event in partnership with the Gwinnett, Newton and Rockdale County Health Departments will take place **Friday, October 22** and **Saturday, October 23** at the vaccine site inside the former Sears at Gwinnett Place Mall.

Gift cards will be offered from 9:00am to 5:00pm each day during the two-day event. The site will offer Pfizer and Moderna vaccines. Participants should make an appointment at GCGA.us/VaccineIncentive to secure their slot during the event and guarantee their gift card. Please make an appointment by 9:00am on Thursday for the Friday date and by 9:00am Friday for the Saturday date.

So far, more than 53 percent of Gwinnett residents have been fully vaccinated, but in recent months, demand for vaccines has slowed.

The County is using federal funding from the American Rescue Plan Act to pay for the vaccine incentive gift cards. Guests are asked to bring their insurance card and identification, if applicable. People without insurance or ID will *not* be turned away. Regardless of insurance status, the vaccine is offered at no cost.

The vaccination site is located at 2100 Pleasant Hill Road in Duluth.

Gwinnett Entrepreneur Center now accepting applications

If you're a new business owner in financial need or one who needs a jumpstart, the Gwinnett Entrepreneur Center wants to lend a helping hand. The center is now accepting applications for membership from budding business owners.

Sponsored by the Board of Commissioners, the center is an incubator to help the county's small businesses with coworking and office space, classes, workshops, business coaching, and networking connections. The center will also offer tailored support services to local non-member entrepreneurs. Georgia Gwinnett College will help manage the facility.

There are two membership levels, and under the center's Opportunity Program, business owners who meet certain financial criteria are eligible for a 50 percent discount on dues. Those interested are asked to carefully review the member handbook, tour the facility, and attend an informational webinar about the center before applying. Among the requirements, applicants must be at least 16 years old, a U.S. citizen, and be able to read, write, and speak English. They also must be a resident of Gwinnett County or neighboring County (Barrow, Walton, DeKalb, Fulton, Rockdale, Hall, or Forsyth) or a Gwinnett County government employee, and they must have access to a computer for required online training.

Interested citizens are encouraged to apply online prior to the event at [GwinnettCountyJobs.com](https://www.gwinnettcountryjobs.com).

Please bring documents to verify your identity and legal authorization to work in the U.S. no sooner than 90 days prior to working. To view the list of accepted documents, visit [USCIS.gov/i-9-central](https://uscis.gov/i-9-central).

Also, there are no scheduled federal, state, and county elections in 2021. However, 13 municipalities in Gwinnett County are conducting elections on Tuesday, November 2, 2021.

Gwinnett launches pilot program to recycle glass

Gwinnett County has teamed up with Waste Pro USA, Inc., to pilot a drop-off glass recycling program at OneStop Norcross beginning Saturday, October 16. The pilot program will provide residents a safe and sustainable opportunity to recycle glass.

Residents can bring their clean, empty glass containers to OneStop Norcross, located at 5030 Georgia Belle Court. The clearly marked drop-off container is located in the center's parking lot and is accessible 24/7.



Dropped off glass will be hauled to Strategic Materials, Inc., a large glass recycler in the Atlanta area.



Gwinnett expands nondiscrimination policy

Gwinnett County's Board of Commissioners expanded the county's nondiscrimination policy to protect a person's ancestry, family status, immigration status, and homeless status. The amendment also draws inspiration from the Creating a Respectful and Open World for Natural Hair Act. The CROWN Act ensures that race-based hairstyles, textures, and protective styles such as braids, locs, twists, and knots are protected in the workplace. These changes will take place on November 1.
