Managing household hazardous waste

Household hazardous wastes are products that contain hazardous substances that homeowners use and that can be dangerous to the environment if disposed of improperly. Examples include paints, solvents, batteries, automobile fluids, herbicides, and pesticides. Proper disposal of these wastes helps safeguard the health of our local rivers, lakes, streams, and groundwater.

Here are a few tips for handling your household hazardous wastes: Do not pour leftover products down the drain or into ditches, stormdrains or gutters, or dump, bury, or burn the products. Do give the leftover products to someone who can use them before throwing them away and avoid buying hazardous products in the future. Consider using safer alternatives such as less toxic cleaning products.

Internet crimes unit combats online predators

The Internet Crimes Against Children (ICAC) Unit is a proactive initiative that consists of detectives from the Police Department's Special Victims and Electronic and Financial Crimes Units. The detectives are specially trained and equipped to combat predators who stalk children online.

Predators contact teenagers and children over the Internet to entice them to engage in sexual acts and sexual tourism (traveling with the intent to engage in sexual conduct). Predators use the Internet to produce, manufacture, and distribute pornography, and encourage children to exchange pornography.

Physical contact between the child and the predator does not need to occur for a child to become a victim or for a crime to be committed.

Parents and guardians must also be aware of the inherent dangers of the Internet and remain ever vigilant of their children's online activities.

Duncan Creek Park gets artificial turf field

Gwinnett commissioners awarded a construction contract for \$835,000 to install an artificial turf multi-purpose field at Duncan Creek Park in northeast Gwinnett County. The project includes renovating the existing multi-purpose field and warm-up area with the installation of artificial turf, including permanent striping for football and soccer, with corners for lacrosse.

"With our current budget concerns, initiating this pilot program to convert two multi-purpose fields to artificial turf makes good economic sense," said District 4 Commissioner Kevin Kenerly. "This will allow Gwinnett County time to evaluate the cost and playability of the new fields and consider extending the program to other parks."

The general contractor for the Duncan Creek Park project is East Tennessee Turf and Landscape and the turf supplier/installer is Deluxe Athletics of Marietta. Construction will begin in April with completion by mid-July. The multi-purpose field will also be installed in Cemetery Field in Norcross. Funds from the project will come from the 2005 SPLOST.

TAX COMMISSIONER

Reminder: Final 2009 tax bills due May 15

Payment is due on May 15 for the final 2009 property tax bills. Supplemental tax bills were sent to Gwinnett County property owners that reflect the increase in the County millage rate adopted by the Board of Commissioners last December. The final 2009 County millage rate of 13.25 is an increase of 2.28 mills over the temporary millage rate that was used to calculate tax bills mailed last September. Property owners are encouraged to read the important information included on the tax bill to help them understand this billing. Keep in mind that payment for this bill is due May 15 but previously unpaid balances may be due sooner.
