New garbage and recycling program goes into effect

Residents in unincorporated Gwinnett County are now part of a new garbage and recycling program that offers more efficient, costeffective, and environmentally-friendly service. Five haulers have been contracted to serve five different areas of the County. This new plan does not affect city residents. You should have received your 95-gallon wheeled trash cart and recycling bin during the month of June. If you have not received your trash cart or recycling bin, or if you need a smaller, 65-gallon trash cart, contact your assigned hauler to request it.

Call the Gwinnett County Solid Waste Call Center at 770.822.7141 weekdays between 7:30am and 5:30pm with plan questions or contact your assigned hauler with service questions. Visit www.sustainablegwinnett.com to get a list of the 35 recyclable items.



PROTECTING OUR RESOURCES

Use the three P's of water wise landscaping

Plan your landscaping to group plants together according to watering needs. This will prevent blanket watering to ensure all plants are thriving.

Fall planting is best. The cooler season is less stressful on plants. Planting in the fall gives roots a chance to grow throughout the winter, establishing them for a hearty spring. Fall planting also helps curb water loss through evaporation from foliage due to decreased temperatures.



Prepare the soil before you sow your plant. Till soil and make sure to include organic materials (composted yard waste, manure, or peat moss) to help retain moisture and provide nutrients to the plant.

Check soil drainage. Dig a hole 15 inches deep by 15 inches in diameter and fill it with water. If the hole remains filled with water after one hour, the site may be poorly drained. Adding pea gravel to the area may improve

When digging a hole for your plant, make sure that the hole is two times the size of the plant bulb. Water the bulb thoroughly, unwind the roots, and pull back any burlap. Make sure that the top of the root ball is level with the surface soil for best results. Once the hole is filled, cover with approximately three to five inches of organic mulch to help retain moisture. Keep in mind that organics decompose and will need to be replenished regularly.

Placing a drip irrigation system under the mulch will keep the soil moist. Only water the plants that need it. Remove weeds as frequently as possible. Weeds compete with plants for moisture and nutrients.

Protect your home during summer vacation

It's summer vacation time—time to pack your bathing suit and head to the beach. But before you hit the shores, remember to take precautions to protect what you can't take with you: your home.

Prevent burglaries:

- Stop your mail, newspapers, and any other home deliveries
- · Ask a relative or neighbor to housesit
- Lock all doors and windows, including the garage door
- Never leave messages on your answering machine that say you're on vacation
- Lock up valuables
- Arrange for someone to cut the lawn; nothing gives away an unoccupied home faster than grass that is over a
- Install motion-sensor spot lights at exterior doors and use timers on your interior and exterior lights
- Take pictures or video of your home before you leave in case you have a break-in and need to identify your items

Save resources:

- Unplug everything you can and turn off all appliances
- Turn down the setting on your hot water heater
- Consider shutting off the water if you will be away for more than two weeks

SPLOST

SPLOST: Road, bridge, sidewalk improvements approved

Several Gwinnett County roads will get major upgrades that are designed to improve road and foot traffic in specific areas. Five Forks Trickum Road will get major improvements, Patterson Road will get a new bridge, and Head Elementary School will soon have a new sidewalk to nearby neighborhoods after the Gwinnett Board of Commissioners approved the projects in June. The Special Purpose Local Option Sales Tax (SPLOST) will fund all three projects.

The three intersections on Five Forks Trickum Road that will get turn lanes and full pedestrian access are Pounds/Garner Road, Winchester Drive, and Cole



Patterson Road will close for about five months while crews replace a bridge over Pew Creek, realign the roadway, and improve the road shoulders. The project includes a new sidewalk on Hewatt Road from Corral Way to Head Elementary School that is to be completed by fall. C.W. Matthews was the lowest of eight bidders at about \$1.3 million.

Commission Chairman **Charles Bannister** said, "These projects continue the County's emphasis on fixing traffic bottlenecks and improving safety for motorists and pedestrians."

Check your polling place online

Many polling places in Gwinnett have changed since the last election. Please check the Secretary of State's new My Voter Page (MVP) before voting. It provides personalized information for all Georgia voters including poll location with map and directions, a list of candidates and their websites, sample ballots, election districts, and current representatives with links to the local voter registration and elections office and for absentee ballot requests.

Secretary of State Brian Kemp has also announced a new website designed to stop voter fraud at www.sos.ga.gov/StopVoterFraud. Report questionable election-related activity there or by calling 877.725.9797.
