Census questionnaires from the US Census Bureau are being sent to every housing unit in March, so by April I, please send your census forms back! Completing the form will be quick and easy and all answers are protected by law. It is estimated that, for the average household, the questionnaire will take about 10 minutes to complete. In addition to being quick, easy, and confidential, responding to the questionnaire is important. Census results will determine apportionment of representation and resources. Our response rate will help determine if Georgia gains another seat in the US House of Representatives as well as our portion of an estimated \$400 billion in federal funding distributed to communities each year. So be sure to complete and mail back your questionnaire by April I.

Clean up our roadways to protect our waterways

Georgians are proud of our beautiful state, but unfortunately, our roadways are becoming dumping grounds for illegal litter. The same state that inspired poet laureate Sidney Lanier to write of its beautiful rivers and trees is being threatened by litter, which is unsightly and expensive to remove. Roadside litter also poses a serious threat to motorists, wildlife, and streams.

Georgia's Adopt-A-Highway Program enlists citizen volunteers' help to remove litter from state roadsides. While saving taxpayer dollars, the program provides recognition for participating companies and organizations, brings the environmental and monetary costs of littering in the public eye and promotes civic responsibility and pride. The volunteers of the Adopt-A-Highway program serve as visible reminders to the public that we are all stewards of the land.

Gwinnett firefighters raise top dollars for burn foundation

Gwinnett's Fire and Emergency Services department won first place in the 2009 Georgia Firefighters Burn Foundation **"Give Burns the Boot"** Boot Drive. The department was recognized during an event at Georgia State University last month. More than 100 fire departments across the state participate in the annual boot drive to raise money for burn centers and burn prevention programs in Georgia.

Gwinnett firefighters collected \$77,980 by blanketing area businesses and shopping centers. "Our success is due to the generous outpouring from our citizens," said department spokesperson Captain **Thomas Rutledge**. "We want to express our appreciation to the citizens and business professionals in Gwinnett County. Even in tough economic times, they understand and support fire safety and bum prevention."

Boot drive donations help fund a statewide burn camp for burn injury survivors. About 10 percent stays local for the purchase of smoke alarms and fire safety education materials.

SPLOST: County's first "green" library opens this spring

Gwinnett officials will celebrate the opening of the County's 15th library branch and first green library, on Saturday, May 8 at 1:00 pm. The new Hamilton Mill Library branch is located at 3690 Braselton Highway, adjacent to the new Duncan Creek Park in Dacula. The grand opening is free and open to the public.

Located on a five-acre site, the library was built to meet LEED (Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design) Silver certification standards to achieve better energy efficiency and lifecyle costing. In addition to its sustainability features, Precision Planning, Inc., the architects for this project, designed the 20,000-square-foot



building with an "Art in Architecture" component that consists of specially-designed window glass depicting themes of water, earth, sun, and the use of language designed by Atlanta artist and sculptor Maria Artemis. Project contractor Garrard Construction completed the library's construction last winter.

The \$7.4 million project was funded through the 2005 Special Purpose Local Option Sales Tax (SPLOST) and a \$2 million capital outlay grant from the State of Georgia.

Planning and Development streamlines permit review process

The Gwinnett County Department of Planning and Development has launched a new digital data submission program called *gwinnett Proj-x* that allows citizens, architects, and engineers to electronically submit drawings and documents for development and building permits. The program also integrates land use and infrastructure data that is incorporated into the County's GIS mapping system.

The program was developed by Accela, Inc., and Avolve Software Corporation and features a web-based County database that tracks the permitting process from submission to payment, updates to the County's current database for site and building inspections, and 24-hour customer access to inspection services. Although portions of the systems have been used in other jurisdictions in Georgia, Gwinnett County is one of the first local governments to incorporate both the Accela and Avolve systems into one program.

TAX COMMISSIONER

Final 2009 tax bills in the mail, due May 15

The Gwinnett Tax Commissioner's office has mailed the final 2009 property tax bills that reflect the increase in the County millage rate adopted by the Board of Commissioners last December: Payment is due May 15. The final 2009 County millage rate of 13.25 is an increase of 2.28 mills over the temporary millage rate that was used to calculate tax bills mailed last September: Property owners are encouraged to read the important information included on the tax bill to help them understand this billing. Keep in mind that payment for this bill is due May 15 but previously unpaid balances may be due sooner.
