

Flood-proof your home with a backwater valve

If you live in a flood prone area, installing a sewer backwater valve can be the difference between having your basement flood with raw sewage and keeping your home's lower level dry.

In the diagram below, the first house does not need a backwater valve. Because the home's basement is higher than the inlet to the building sewer lateral, water will drain from the first upstream manhole. The second house has sewer laterals that are slightly higher (must be at least 24" higher) than the first upstream sanitary sewer manhole cover, so the first floor doesn't need a backwater valve. Pressure could possibly build and temporarily allow water to flow at a level above the lowest sewer lateral. If a basement is constructed, it is wise to install a backwater valve. All sewer lateral openings in the last house are located below the level of the first upstream sewer manhole cover, so this home would require the installation of a backwater valve to prevent sewer flooding.

Please be aware that if your house floods with sewage and it does not have a backwater valve installed and maintained, Water Resources is not liable for the damage or clean-up costs. No claims will be processed by the County. Please take the necessary precautions to prevent a sewage flood by installing and maintaining the backwater valve. PUBLIC SAFETY

Enjoy the river, check the dam

With more people visiting the Chattahoochee River this summer, Fire and Emergency Services wants to remind you to stay safe and enjoy this great natural resource.

The National Park Service requires that you wear a life jacket if you are boating, tube floating, or wading in the river between Buford Dam and the Highway 20 bridge. Firefighters suggest wearing a life jacket at all points along the river. Never dive or jump into the river to prevent injury from submerged rocks, trees, and other debris.

Water levels rise due to water releases at Buford Dam and significant rainfall. To find out when water is being released from the dam, call 770.945.1466. Be sure to get out of the water before the water releases and pay attention to sirens and posted warning signs. Be aware that the water released from the bottom of Buford Dam is about 50° throughout the year, so exhaustion and unconsciousness may occur within minutes.

Gwinnett expands traffic monitoring

Gwinnett County transportation will begin installing more traffic cameras and fiber-optic cables to monitor arterial and corridor traffic flow and allow real-time, remote control adjustments from the Gwinnett Traffic Control Center. This technology will be in place in two congested areas: a six-mile stretch of Pleasant Hill Road between Lawrenceville Highway/U.S. 29 and Buford Highway/U.S. 23 and three miles of Buford Drive/State Route 20 between I-985 and Peachtree Industrial Boulevard near the Mall of Georgia.



The new traffic cameras will be added to the Department of Transportation's GC Smart Commute program, which gives residents the opportunity to view live traffic feeds of heavily-traveled intersections and corridors to plan their daily commute. GC Smart Commute is available 24/7 at www.gcsmartcommute.com and on TVgwinnett, the government access cable channel, weekdays between 6:30am and 8:30am and again between 4:00pm and 6:00pm.
