Memorial Day Ceremony honors Gwinnett's military heroes

The public is invited to Gwinnett County's Memorial Day Ceremony on Monday, May 30, 2011, at 1:00pm at the Gwinnett Fallen Heroes Memorial at 75 Langley Drive in Lawrenceville. This event is held each year to honor the county's past and present military heroes and public service personnel. Members of the Gwinnett County Board of Commissioners and honor guard units from the Gwinnett County Corrections, Fire and Emergency Services, Police and Sheriff's Departments, and the Lawrenceville Police Department will take part in this event.

The Fallen Heroes Memorial, located on the grounds of the Gwinnett Justice and Administration Center at 75 Langley Drive in Lawrenceville, honors all Gwinnett residents who died in the line of duty in military or public service. Let's talk toilets

Toilets are the main source of water consumption in the home, accounting for nearly 30 percent of residential use. Over the course of your life, you will likely flush the toilet 140,000 times! Now toilets use a variety of advanced technologies to ensure single-flush, clog-free performance. To be certain you are getting a top rated model, look for the WaterSense label. It certifies that the toilet went through a laboratory testing process and met rigorous criteria for both performance and efficiency.

Gwinnett County water customers may qualify for rebates of up to \$100 for replacing old, inefficient toilets. Details are available at www.northgeorgiawater.org/html/315.htm or by calling 404.463.8645.

You can also bring your old and broken toilets to the Department of Water Resources Central Facility to be recycled for free. You must remove the toilet seat and any plastic parts, including handles. Drop off the toilet at any time to 684 Winder Highway in Lawrenceville. After business hours and on weekends, access is only available from the Hosea Road entrance. SPLOST

SPLOST-funded park wins restoration award

Freeman's Mill Park won the Excellence in Restoration from The Georgia Trust for Historic Preservation. The award was presented at the 34th annual Preservation Awards ceremony in Macon on April 1. The park's highlight is an old gristmill that resides along the banks of the Alcovy River in Lawrenceville.



"This year's winners represent a tremendous dedication to restoring and revitalizing Georgia's historic buildings and communities," said **Mark C. McDonald**, president of The Georgia Trust. *"We are proud to honor such deserving projects."*

The County purchased the mill and surrounding property with funding from the Georgia Greenspace Program and the 2005 SPLOST program. The County recognized the historical significance of this landmark and committed to preserving it for future generations. The first phase of park construction raised the historic mill five feet to get it above the regulated floodplain. Construction also included a new foundation and retaining wall, restoration of the water wheel and windows, a new roof, and repair to the siding and doors.

Freeman's Mill Park also includes a playground that replicates the gristmill, picnic pavilion, half-mile multi-purpose trail, parking, and restroom facilities.

County hosts workshop for potential vendors

The Gwinnett County Purchasing Division will host the fifth annual **Supplier Symposium** on June 8, 2011, from 8:00am to noon at the Gwinnett Justice and Administration Center:



Attendees will meet buyers and contracting officers from the Purchasing Division and other metro Atlanta agencies to take advantage of networking opportunities designed to create relationships, understand County purchasing processes, and obtain information on current and upcoming projects. Attendees will also participate in presentations and roundtable discussions that will help acquaint present and potential suppliers with the County's procurement procedures.

"During this symposium, suppliers will become more knowledgeable about the County's procurement procedures and learn what's new in doing business with Gwinnett County, which will increase competition and encourage more suppliers to do business with Gwinnett County," Purchasing Director **Roslyn Forstot** said.

The symposium will begin with a morning presentation that will focus on building vendor relationships. Participants will later break into smaller groups for roundtable discussions on cost negotiations, hot topics, and contracting with Gwinnett County.
