### 8 tips to make your landscape waterwise

Often the biggest single use of water by homeowners is for lawn and landscape irrigation. It is estimated that the typical suburban lawn consumes 10,000 gallons of water above and beyond the rain that falls each year.

**Waterwise** is a style of landscaping that conserves water and protects the environment. The main objective is to match the right plants with your existing site conditions so that the use of additional resources—such as water, fertilizer, pesticides, and labor—is minimized. Waterwise landscapes not only save water, they also save time by requiring less routine care than most traditional landscapes. Follow these eight fundamentals for a waterwise landscape:

- Group plants according to their water needs
- Use native and low-water-use plants
- Limit turf areas to those needed for practical uses
- Use efficient irrigation systems
- Schedule irrigation wisely
- Make sure soil is healthy
- Remember to mulch
- Provide regular maintenance

In short, plan and maintain your landscape with these principles of water efficiency in mind and it will continue to conserve water and look attractive. Using less water does not mean landscaping only with cacti and rocks! With a little planning, you can have a low-cost, low-maintenance landscape with healthy plants and turfgrass that can tolerate summer heat and drought conditions and thrive while using much less water.

### 4 tips to avoid fishy guests

1. If you don't know the person, don't open the door. Tell them from the closed door that you are not interested and ask them to leave. If they refuse to leave, call the police.
2. Don't ignore the knock at the door; they may be checking to see if you are home before trying to break in.
3. Don't leave your garage door open unless you are working outside in the garage or front yard; an open door is an invitation for someone to enter your personal space and a garage door is a door into your home.
4. As always, if you notice any suspicious activity, call the police. Be sure to dial 911 for the quickest way an officer can be dispatched to assist you during any time of the day.

## SPLOST

### County accepts state funds for Sugarloaf Parkway extension

The Gwinnett County Board of Commissioners approved a contract with the Georgia Department of Transportation in March for \$2.5 million in state funds for the Sugarloaf Parkway extension from Campbell Road to State Route 316.

Commission Chairman **Charlotte Nash** said, "The Board's gratitude goes to the state DOT for contributing funds to this regionally significant project. This is just another example of how our SPLOST funds have been able to leverage state and federal funding to help improve mobility."

Work on the current section is the last of four projects to extend Sugarloaf Parkway from State Route 20 south of Lawrenceville to State Route 316 in the Dacula area. Once completed, the four-lane, divided, limited-access roadway will have interchanges at New Hope Road, Martins Chapel Road, Campbell Road, and SR 316. The state previously provided a total of \$5 million toward the construction of two other sections.

Construction of the final section is already underway by ER Snell Contractor, Inc., which previously won the contract. The ramps on the south side of SR 316 are anticipated to be opened to traffic in August with the north side ramps expected to open by the end of 2012.
