Fix a leak week: March 12 - 18

Sponsored by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency's WaterSense® program, Fix a Leak Week encourages Americans to help put a stop to the more than I trillion gallons of water wasted from household leaks each year.

To help save water in our community, Gwinnett County is asking residents to check, twist, and replace leaking water fixtures:

- Check for leaks: Look for dripping faucets, showerheads, and fixture connections. Also check for toilets with silent leaks by putting a few drops of food coloring into the tank and seeing if it appears in the bowl before you flush. Don't forget to check irrigation systems and spigots, too
- Twist and tighten pipe connections: To save more water without a noticeable difference in flow, twist on a faucet aerator with a WaterSense® label
- **Replace the fixture if necessary:** Look for WaterSense[®] labeled models, which are independently tested and certified to use 20 percent less water and perform as well as or better than standard models

5 ways to keep kids safe on the Web

The Gwinnett County Police Department urges parents to be aware of their children's activities on the Web:

- 1. Set rules for when your children are allowed to surf the Internet and for how long
- 2. Keep the computer in a high-traffic area such as the living room or kitchen and closely supervise your kids' usage
- 3. If you child has a Facebook or Twitter account, make sure you have access to those accounts
- Research the technology you buy for your children so you'll have an understanding of what they're using
- 5. Don't rely on monitoring software alone to protect your children; technology can't replace your time and attention as a parent

Another important tip: Please call 911 if you ever need a police officer to arrive at your house, an accident, or even a non-emergency incident. This is the quickest way that an officer can be dispatched to assist you during any time of the day.

New trail, other amenities open at Rhodes Jordan Park

Visitors to Rhodes Jordan Park are enjoying the improvements from a major renovation project. The park now offers better lake access and enhanced recreational opportunities.

One new feature is a 1.1-mile paved multi-purpose trail and boardwalk around the perimeter of the existing 23-acre lake that connects to the existing trail and sidewalks. Other new amenities include three picnic pavilions, outdoor basketball and horseshoe

courts, a restroom building, and parking area. The project also rerouted the main park drive and added lake irrigation for the sports fields.

The approximately \$7.37 million park renovation project began in 2010 and was funded by the SPLOST sales tax. The last phase of this renovation includes a new soccer complex scheduled to open this spring.

Gwinnett County and the city of Lawrenceville entered into a long-term lease contract for Rhodes Jordan Park in 1991. Since then, the park land has expanded to 162 acres and also includes youth baseball, softball and football fields, a community center, outdoor aquatic center, tennis complex, and senior center. Rhodes Jordan Park is located at 100 East Crogan Street in Lawrenceville. Learn more about County parks at www.gwinnettparks.com.

New state law changes business license process

Businesses in Gwinnett County are receiving occupation tax certificate renewal forms in the mail, but before certificates can be renewed, applicants must comply with new state requirements that went into effect on January I. During the 2011 legislative session, the Georgia General Assembly passed the *Illegal Immigration Reform and Enforcement Act* (House Bill 87), that places new requirements on local governments and businesses to ensure they comply with federal and state immigration laws.

All occupation tax certificate applicants must now submit an affidavit called Systematic Alien Verification for Entitlements, along with a secure and verifiable identification document, such as a passport, driver's license, or military ID. Renewal applications will be accepted in person at the License and Revenue Office located at 446 West Crogan Street in Lawrenceville from 8:00am to 4:00pm, Monday through Friday, or through License and Revenue's new electronic renewal system at www.gwinnettlicrev.com.

Private employers with 500 or more employees must register for and use the federal E-Verify program that checks the employment eligibility of all new hires. For more information, visit **www.gwinnettlicrev.com** or call 678.377.4100.
