Check out the annual water quality report

The Department of Water Resources has published WaterWords, an annual report containing important information about the quality of your drinking water. In 2013, the department detected 12 contaminants in the drinking water it produces. These contaminants were below allowable levels, however, and no health-based violations were reported. Is your old toilet worth \$100?

Toilet flushing accounts for the largest percentage of indoor water use in the average home. By replacing an old or leaking toilet with a new high-efficiency model, you could save thousands of gallons each month. The Department of Water Resources participates in the Metropolitan North Georgia Water Planning District's regional Toilet Rebate Program for single-family homes. Through the program, DWR provides \$100 rebates to qualified homeowners for replacing old, inefficient toilets.

To meet the requirements for the rebate program, you must have an individual residential water account with DWR and be up to date on your bill payments. Your home must have been built in 1993 or earlier and the new toilet must be an approved WaterSense®-certified toilet that uses 1.28 gallons per flush or less. Customers may apply for up to two rebates per household for a maximum of \$200 of account credit. Residents in Gwinnett County who replace their old toilets can drop them off to be recycled for free 24-hours a-day, seven-days-a-week at DWR's Central Facility in Lawrenceville. The porcelain is recycled by breaking it up and mixing it into stone aggregate to be used for landscaping, pipe beds, or as a road base. Since Gwinnett County began its recycling program in February 2011, more than of 240 tons of porcelain have been diverted from our landfills. Tips to keep kids safe around water

According to Safe Kids Gwinnett, more than 700 children under age 14 died in 2009 in the United States due to unintentional drowning. Here's how you can help keep your children safe around water:

- **Lock:** Make sure your pool is surrounded by a fence with self-closing and self-latching gates. Install anti-entrapment drain covers and backup devices.
- **Look:** Always watch children when they are around any type of water, even if they know how to swim. If a child is missing, check the water first.
- **Learn:** Learn how to swim and use a Coast Guard approved life jacket. Learn CPR and how to use rescue equipment. Teach your children water safety rules.

Board allocates 2014 SPLOST funds

On April 16, 2014, the Gwinnett County Board of Commissioners allocated 2014 SPLOST program funds within the public safety category and approved project lists in accordance with the purposes outlined in the referendum approved by voters last November. In addition to public safety, other purposes include transportation, recreation, senior services, and libraries. All 16 cities in Gwinnett County are also sharing in the sales tax proceeds.

Project selection for these purposes involved heavy public input, with recommendations for both the transportation and recreation lists coming from committees made up of residents.

Poll officials needed for elections

The Voter Registrations and Elections Division needs dedicated citizens to serve as paid poll officials for the 2014 elections. Successful poll officials demonstrate patience, enjoy working with people, take direction well, and are detail oriented. Applicants must be a U.S. citizen and a resident of Gwinnett County, at least 16 years old, and able to read, write, and speak English. Those who were convicted of a felony involving moral turpitude or judicially determined to be mentally incompetent are not eligible to serve as a poll official. In addition, she will chair the ACCG Policy Council, which helps to guide the association's advocacy efforts before the Georgia General Assembly and Congress.
