Celebrate Earth Day at the County's free recycling event

Please join the Solid Waste and Recovered Materials Division on Saturday, April 18, 2015, at Coolray Field, home of the Gwinnett Braves, as we celebrate Earth Day with a free recycling event. This event will feature paper shredding (limit five copier paper boxes), electronics recycling (\$10 cash fee per TV), tire recycling (limit eight tires per vehicle; no dealer tires), paint collection (limit five one-gallon cans per vehicle; cans must contain 25 percent wet, usable paint; no paint thinners, stains, spackle, oil paint cans, rusted paint cans, or dried-up paint), and toner/printer cartridge collection. Please also bring your gently used or old sneakers to be donated to those in need or recycled into surfaces for local playgrounds and running tracks.

Tax Assessors Office issues real estate property annual notice of assessments

Most residential and commercial annual notice of assessments were mailed April 3, 2015. An annual notice of assessment is not a tax bill. The notice informs you of the value assessed on your residential or commercial real estate as of January I, 2015. If you do not agree with the notice value, you may appeal during the 45-day appeal period, which begins from the date on your notice and ends 45 days later (May 18 for those dated April 3). Visit www.gwinnett-assessor.com to appeal your 2015 value electronically or submit a completed PT3 I I A state appeal form to the Tax Assessors Office before the end of the 45-day appeal period.

Gwinnett's second DDI opens

Last month, the Jimmy Carter Boulevard bridge over I-85 opened as a new Diverging Diamond Interchange, Gwinnett County's second DDI and the third in Georgia. The DDI's innovative design relieves congestion, improves safety, and is less expensive than replacing the bridge. Funding for the project comes from the 2009 SPLOST sales tax program, the Gwinnett Village Community Improvement District, and the State Road and Tollway Authority.

Construction will continue on the center median and pedestrian facilities while crews finalize the signals, interchange lighting, and pavement markings. In the meantime, pedestrian traffic should continue to use the detour route of Jimmy Carter Boulevard to Oakbrook Parkway to Center Way to Goshen Springs Road to Jimmy Carter Boulevard and the reverse. Project completion is expected this summer.

Dispose of household hazardous wastes the right way

Many of the products that we use frequently around the house come with warning labels to prevent harm to our bodies, but did you know that they can also harm the environment if they are not disposed of properly? Household products such as herbicides, pesticides, paints, solvents, batteries, automobile fluids, and some cleaning products that are thrown away or dumped in our stormwater drainage system, which includes drains, pipes, and ditches, can harm the health of our rivers, lakes, and streams. These drains lead directly to surface waters.

Discharges to the stormwater drainage system are also considered violations of the County's *Illicit Discharge and Illegal Connection Ordinance*. If you know of or see individuals dumping hazardous substances into storm drains, drainage ditches, or streams, call 678.376.7193 and choose option 2 to report the violation.

There are several options available to properly dispose of or recycle these products. One is to give away used products to someone who can use them. There are also local retailers who participate in recycling programs for your old electronics and certain household wastes such as used motor oil, batteries, and light bulbs. Always be sure to consult the label for guidance concerning proper usage and disposal methods.
