Apply for the Gwinnett 101 Spring 2016 session

Have you ever wondered why a fire truck responds to your medical emergency? Why the County has a SPLOST program? Or how clean water gets to your house? The Gwinnett 101: Citizens Academy can help answer those questions and more.

Gwinnett 101 is a free program designed to develop and nurture informed and engaged residents, students, and business owners in Gwinnett. Class members will get a first-hand glimpse of how the County works and build a network with others who live, work, and learn in Gwinnett County.

Classes will be held on Thursday evenings from 6:00pm to 9:00pm beginning with an orientation on April 12 and ending with graduation and recognition by the Gwinnett County Board of Commissioners on Tuesday, June 28.

Interested candidates must be at least 18 years old and be a resident and/or business owner in Gwinnett or attend a Gwinnett college or university. Class size is limited to 30 participants who will be chosen by a selection committee.

Make your voice heard this election season

The election season is underway, so make sure your voter registration is up to date. Please take note of the upcoming elections:

- **Presidential Preference Primary:** March 1
- **General Primary/Nonpartisan Election:** May 24
- **General Primary/Nonpartisan Election Runoff:** July 26
- **General Election:** November 8
- **State General Election Runoff:** December 6
- **Federal General Election Runoff:** January 10

To register to vote in Georgia, you must be a citizen of the United States, a legal resident of Georgia and of the county in which you wish to vote, and at least 18 years old by Election Day.

You may not register to vote if you are currently serving any sentence imposed by the conviction of a felony or have been judicially determined to be mentally incompetent. Visit www.gwinnettelelections.com to download and complete a voter registration application.

You can now register to vote online if you have a Georgia issued personal identification card or driver's license. To register, visit the Georgia Secretary of State's website at www.mvp.sos.ga.gov.

If you need to locate your polling place, visit the Secretary of State's My Voter Page at www.mvp.sos.ga.gov. You can also get a list of candidates and their websites, view sample ballots, and get updates on your voter registration and absentee ballot requests.

Advance and absentee voting is available, so be sure to visit www.gwinnettelelections.com for dates and locations.

Gwinnett builds new morgue and medical examiner's office

Gwinnett commissioners in December approved a construction contract for a new morgue and medical examiner's office. The 2014 SPLOST is funding the 15,000 square foot facility that will be built on 5.6 acres the County owns at 320 Hurricane Shoals Road in Lawrenceville.

McKnight Construction Company Inc. was the lowest of three pre-qualified bidders at \$5.7 million. The building is designed by Precision Planning Inc. to achieve LEED (Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design) Certification through the U.S. Green Building Council.

The morgue space will have three state of the art autopsy stations plus a laboratory and space for evidence processing and storage. The facility will also have office space for the Medical Examiner, medical staff, investigators, and administrative staff along with a family conference room and respite area. The medical examiner conducts death investigations, including postmortem examinations of bodies, in order to determine cause and manner of death in cases that meet certain criteria as defined under state law, such as sudden or suspicious deaths.

Tips for safe driving in winter weather

Winter weather driving presents a number of challenges for you and your car, so it's best to stay off the roads during a severe winter weather event. If you have to go out on the road, consider these tips:

- Never warm up your vehicle in an enclosed area.
- Make sure your tires are properly inflated and keep your gas tank at least half full during the winter season.
- Make sure your exhaust pipe isn't clogged with snow or ice to prevent a dangerous carbon monoxide leak into the passenger compartment.
- Keep a ready kit in the trunk with water, food, a flashlight, and first aid kit.

Water leaks can run, but they can't hide

Are you ready to get to the bottom of the water leaks around your home? If so, race over to your plumbing fixtures, fix those drips, and save valuable water and money all year long. Fix a Leak Week, sponsored by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency's WaterSense® program, encourages Americans to help put a stop to the 1 trillion gallons of water wasted from household leaks each year. This year's Fix a Leak Week is March 14 through March 20, 2016.

Water Resources is asking residents to help conserve water by checking, listening, and repairing:

- **Check** for dripping faucets, showerheads, tub spouts, and fixture connections. You can also perform a leak test using your water meter. Read your water meter before and after a two-hour period when no water is being used. If the meter reading changes, you probably have a leak.
- **Listen** for hissing or trickling noises coming from your toilet or water refilling the tank in between flushes. Also check for silent leaks by putting a teaspoon of food coloring in the tank and seeing if it appears in the bowl before you flush.
- **Repair** leaks by taking the defective part to your local hardware or plumbing store to find the correct replacement. If you buy a new fixture, look for WaterSense® labeled models, which are independently tested and certified to use 20 percent less water.
