### Community leaders complete spring session of Gwinnett 101

The Gwinnett County Board of Commissioners recently recognized 30 community leaders for completing the spring 2016 session of Gwinnett 101: Citizens Academy. Gwinnett 101 launched one year ago and is a 10-week crash course in Gwinnett County Government operations. The program is aimed at developing and nurturing informed and engaged residents, students, and business owners in the county.

The weekly sessions included an interactive history lesson, an overview of the County's budget process, and a community planning session. In addition, class members toured the F. Wayne Hill Water Reclamation Facility and the Traffic Control Center, performed a mock trial with judges, and participated in demonstrations led by Fire and Emergency Services, Police, and Community Services.

Gwinnett 101 is held twice a year in the spring and fall, and there are no fees to participate. Each class is limited to 30 participants and candidates for the program will be selected by an independent committee. Past due accounts will receive a second notice postcard when the bill is 20 days past due and will be disconnected when it is 30 days past due. ## County to upgrade intersection of Pleasant Hill Road and Club Drive

Commissioners in June awarded a contract to Georgia Development Partners Inc., the lowest of five bidders at \$1,563,631.87, to upgrade the intersection of Pleasant Hill Road at Club Drive.

District 1 Commissioner **Jace Brooks** said, "These improvements are expected to make traffic in this area flow much more smoothly."

The project, funded by SPLOST, will install triple left-turn lanes on Pleasant Hill Road northbound to replace the existing dual left-turn lanes. In addition, eastbound dual right lanes will be installed at Club Drive to replace the existing single right-turn lane.

## PUBLIC SAFETY

### Beat the heat, check the backseat

Every year, children die of hyperthermia, also known as heat stroke, while unattended in vehicles. Just two years ago, there were 30 heat stroke deaths of children left unattended in vehicles; the first seven occurred in April and May. Remember to **ACT** to prevent more tragedies this summer:

**Avoid** heat stroke-related injury and death:

- Never leave your child alone in the car, even for a minute.
- Consistently lock unattended vehicle doors and trunks, even in your driveway or garage.

**Create** reminders and habits that give you a safety net:

- Establish a peace-of-mind plan. When you drop off your child, make a habit of calling or texting other caregivers so all of you know where your child is at all times.
- Place a purse, briefcase, gym bag, cell phone, or an item that is needed at your next stop in the back seat.

**Take** action if you see an unattended child in a vehicle:

- Dial 911 immediately and follow the instructions from emergency personnel – they are trained to determine if a child is in danger.

## PROTECTING OUR RESOURCES

### Maintain that drain!

Do you know where your wastewater goes? Homes and businesses in Gwinnett County either send their wastewater to a septic tank or to the sanitary sewer system. A septic tank treats wastewater onsite while the sanitary sewer system sends it to a treatment plant. It is important to be aware of which system serves your home or business. Septic systems require different methods of maintenance to remain effective.

A septic system consists of a septic tank, a drain field, and the soil under the drain field. Inside the septic tank, solids settle to the bottom while floatables rise to the surface. The untreated wastewater remaining then flows out of the tank into the drain field. As the water infiltrates the soil, natural processes purify it before it reaches the water table.

A septic system failure can pose a threat to human and environmental health and can also be very expensive to repair. In order to prevent these impacts on your health and your wallet, consider the following steps:

- Have your septic tank pumped every three to five years
- Remember your toilet is not a trashcan
- Use cleaning chemicals as directed to avoid harming the system
- Do not drive or park over the drain field
- Implement water conservation tactics to reduce wastewater volume
