Gwinnett's 2040 Unified Plan being reviewed by the state

Gwinnett County has forwarded its 2040 Unified Plan to the state Department of Community Affairs and the Atlanta Regional Commission for review.

The 2040 Unified Plan contains analyses, policies, maps, and proposals to help guide progress and development countywide. Crafted after months of public input, the Unified Plan provides a blueprint of how the county's residents and other stakeholders want Gwinnett to grow and develop.

The 2040 plan addresses community goals, needs and opportunities, as well as housing, transportation, economic development and land use. It also establishes a community work program. A future land use map shows recommended development patterns in detail. The plan was developed by consulting firm Pond & Co. and identifies possible activity centers, employment centers, residential neighborhoods, and low-intensity areas.

Other county plans are incorporated into the Unified Plan, including long-term visions for transportation, transit, trails, and water and sewer plans.

The final 2040 plan will be adopted by the Gwinnett Board of Commissioners in February 2019. To read the plan, visit www.gwinnett2040unifiedplan.com.

Gwinnett, state DOT jointly funding engineering to widen Scenic Highway

The Board of Commissioners recently approved a funding agreement with the Georgia Department of Transportation for preliminary engineering to widen State Route 124/Scenic Highway from U.S. 78 to Sugarloaf Parkway.

The Georgia DOT will provide \$4.8 million in federal funding for the design of the project. Gwinnett County will provide \$1.2 million, or 20 percent, of the engineering cost. Gwinnett's share of the funding will come from the 2017 SPLOST program.

The 4.3-mile project will widen Scenic Highway to six lanes to reduce traffic congestion and improve connectivity between Lawrenceville and Snellville. The project, which could take several years to complete, also includes sidewalk and curb and gutter improvements.

PUBLIC SAFETY

Keep your family and home safe for the yuletide season

Make the holiday season a safe and enjoyable time for the whole family by following these safety tips:

- Never place a live tree close to a heat source, such as a fireplace or space heater
- Inspect holiday lights for frayed wires, bare spots, gaps in the insulation, broken or cracked sockets, and excessive kinks or wear
- Never leave holiday lights on unattended
- Lit candles should be placed in stable holders; never leave the house or go to sleep with a candle burning
- Never leave food on the stove unattended and set a timer when baking or simmering
- Have a working smoke alarm on every level of the home and in each bedroom

Scheduled water rate increase to begin in January 2019

Effective January 2019, a regularly scheduled rate increase will be implemented as the result of a water rate resolution approved by the Gwinnett County Board of Commissioners and the Gwinnett County Water and Sewerage Authority in 2015.

This increase will be used to continue inspecting, maintaining, and repairing the growing water and sewer infrastructure in Gwinnett County, ensuring reliable water and wastewater service for existing and future customers.

Single Family Residential (per 1,000 gallons)	
Water	
Tier 1 (up to 8,000 gallons)	\$4.99
Tier 2 (8,000 – 12,000 gallons)	\$7.485
Tier 3 (over 12,000 gallons)	\$9.98
Sewer	\$8.14

Commercial/Multi Family Residential (per 1,000 gallons)	
Water	\$4.99
Sewer	\$8.14

All irrigation and builder accounts will be billed at two times the tier-one volumetric rate (\$9.98 per 1,000 gallons) for all water passing through the water meter per billing period.

TAX COMMISSIONER

Some seniors 65 or older on January 1 can get an exemption

If you are 65 years or older as of January 1 and your taxable income is below \$91,912, you likely qualify for the Senior School Tax Exemption.
