## Bay Creek Police Precinct and Alternate 911 Center open in southeast Gwinnett

The Gwinnett County Police Department recently opened the new Bay Creek Police Precinct and Alternate 911 Center.

Located in unincorporated Loganville, the 12,117-square-foot precinct will dramatically increase the police presence in the growing southeastern part of the county, reduce response times to calls in the area, and enhance many community relations initiatives.

The facility features offices for command staff, a fitness center and locker rooms, and evidence storage space. It will also offer services such as access to reports and a community meeting room. Police services for the area have previously been split between two other precincts.

The alternate 911 center will provide reliable communication with officers and other agencies during critical incidents, such as severe weather, when communications might be compromised.

The \$15 million project was funded by the 2009, 2014, and 2017 SPLOST programs.

### Duluth Library relocation project begins

Construction will soon begin relocating and expanding the Gwinnett County Public Library branch in downtown Duluth. Gwinnett County and the city of Duluth are partnering on the \$5 million project. Construction is estimated to take about 12 months. The County is paying for design and construction of the facility with revenue from the 2014 and 2016 SPLOST programs.

The library branch is moving from its current location to Main Street where it will have access to Buford Highway. The city of Duluth provided 1.9 acres of land while the County added about half an acre. The single-story, 22,000-square-foot space will be twice the size of the existing branch. The new facility will feature adult, teen, and children's areas, a meeting room, and study rooms.

## PUBLIC SAFETY



### Make an emergency kit for your vehicle

January and February are peak months for snow and ice storms. In a worst-case scenario, you could be trapped in your vehicle for an extended time period. Take a few steps to prepare for a winter emergency in your vehicle:

- Winterize your vehicle and keep your gas tank at least half-full to prevent your fuel line from freezing
- Stock an emergency kit with food and bottled water, a portable cell phone charger, ice scraper, flashlight and batteries, first aid kit, blankets, jumper cables, and sand or cat litter for traction
- If you do get stuck on the road, remain in your vehicle where rescuers are most likely to find you
- Avoid going out on foot unless you can find a safe place to take shelter
- Avoid idling for a long time with windows up or in an enclosed space
- Carry a phone charger in your car

## PROTECTING OUR RESOURCES



### Old Norcross Road culvert project highlights the value of stormwater utility fee

An aging stacked-stone bridge on Old Norcross Road near Norcross flooded in heavy rains and lacked shoulders and guardrails. During a three-month project in 2019, the Department of Water Resources rebuilt the structure, adding six box culverts to handle the water flow from a tributary to Bromolow Creek, and adding shoulders and guardrails for safety.

The \$1 million project was made possible by an annual stormwater utility fee, which is based on each property's area of impervious surface and covers the cost of stormwater projects and initiatives. In Gwinnett County, stormwater utility fees are used to inspect, replace, and upgrade the stormwater drainage system, as well as to help reduce flooding, fulfill regulatory requirements, and reduce pollution carried to waterways by runoff.

In Gwinnett, stormwater utility fees helped pay for about \$29 million in critical stormwater infrastructure improvements in 2019 throughout the county. Since its inception in 2006, the stormwater utility fee has enabled DWR professionals to better protect water quality, maintain vital stormwater infrastructure, and design solutions for stormwater management to provide the highest level of service to the community. The program helps DWR complete more than 200 repair, maintenance, and replacement projects a year, including about 10 major projects like the one at Old Norcross Road, plus many other stormwater-related services.

### Emissions required for 1996 – 2017 model years

For 2020, all gasoline-powered and light-duty trucks 8,500 pounds or less with the model years 1996 through 2017 require an emissions test to register and renew.
