## Commissioners keep 2022 millage rate the same as last year

The Gwinnett Board of Commissioners adopted the same general fund millage rate as last year, 6.95 mills. Prior to the vote, the Board held three public hearings and accepted comments through the County's website.

Most homeowners in Gwinnett benefit from the Value Offset Exemption, which means they will not see an increase in the county government portion of their tax bill. Property taxes are based on millage rates set by county government, schools, and cities. One mill equals a dollar tax per thousand dollars of assessed property value.

The Tax Commissioner's Office will mail property tax bills in September and payments will be due in November.

### SPLOST renewal to be on November ballot

When voters head to the polls during November's General Election, they will decide on the renewal of the one-cent special purpose local option sales tax, or SPLOST. Commissioners voted to place the referendum on the November ballot. If given the green light by voters, the new program could raise \$1.35 billion over the next six years that would fund transportation, new roads and improvements, parks and recreation facilities, public safety facilities and equipment, libraries, and more projects. ### Keep leaves out of storm drains

Autumn brings rich colors to our trees, and while the crunchy leaves are fun to play in, they could lead to water pollution if swept or blown into storm drains.

Storm drains lead directly to our local waterways. Decomposing leaves add excess nutrients to the water and allow algal blooms to grow, which can negatively affect the water quality and ecosystem. Leaves and other yard debris can also cause a blockage in a storm drain, which can lead to localized flooding during heavy rain events. Here are some useful tips for protecting water quality and storm drains this fall:

- Keep your leaves out of storm drains
- Rake leaves out of the curb and gutter
- Compost fallen leaves for free fertilizer
- Use fallen leaves as mulch in your landscape


### Prevent fires in your home

It's important for every member of the community to take time to understand how to stay safe in case of a fire. Fire is fast, and there is little time to escape.

This year's theme, "Fire won't wait. Plan your escape," focuses on simple but important actions you can take to keep yourself and those around you safe from home fires. Here are some helpful steps to follow:

- Plan your escape route. Make sure to draw a simple map of your home, find two ways out of each room, and practice getting out in under 2 minutes
- Make sure smoke alarms are in every level of your home and in each bedroom, and test them twice a year
- Choose an outside meeting place a safe distance from your home
- Practice home fire drills. Run through your plan at different times of the day or night and practice different ways out. In a real fire, go to the safe meeting place, call 911, and keep everyone close until firefighters arrive

## SPLOST

### BOC approves improvements to aquatic centers

Commissioners recently approved SPLOST-funded improvement projects at the Bogan Park and Bethesda Park Aquatic Centers.

The \$526,000 Bogan Park Aquatic Center project will re-plaster the pool and replace the play structure installed there in 2008. The \$264,780 Bethesda Park Aquatic Center project will include mechanical improvements to the ductwork to meet the County's asset management plan standards.

Both projects are funded by the 2017 Special Purpose Local Option Sales Tax program, known as SPLOST.
