#### Budget proposed for 2024

Gwinnett County Chairwoman Nicole Love Hendrickson's proposed budget for 2024 totals \$2.5 billion. The proposal consists of a \$1.96 billion operating budget, which funds everyday expenses such as employee salaries, benefits, equipment, and repairs, and a \$542 million capital improvements budget, which includes funding from the County's Special Purpose Local Option Sales Tax program.

New initiatives funded by the operating budget include the expansion and enhancement of critical water services for new developments, the execution of the Gwinnett Trails program, and a mental and chronic health care initiative for residents. The capital budget will pay for new libraries, parks, and roads.

## Additional safety cameras coming to Gwinnett

Gwinnett Police is leaning on technology to fight crime with the installation of additional safety cameras across the county. Flock cameras are used to find amber alert victims and missing persons, and they allow officers to get real-time information on where stolen vehicles and suspects of crime are located. The Board of Commissioners recently approved an additional 36 Flock cameras to be installed along state routes. There are more than 7,400 cameras in metro Atlanta, and 835 of those cameras have been placed across Gwinnett since 2020. To learn more, visit GwinnettPolice.com.

- Scrape food scraps into the trash
- Wipe excess FOG off cookware before washing
- Pour used FOG in a container with a lid and place it in the trash

# Emissions are required for 2000-2021 model years

For 2024, all gasoline-powered and light-duty trucks weighing 8,500 pounds or less with model years 2000 through 2021 require an emissions test to register and renew. ### Subdivision added to streetlighting program

Gwinnett County is set to improve traffic safety and enhance community well-being by incorporating the Parkwood Ridge subdivision into its streetlighting program. This decision follows a request from property owners who live in the Snellville-area neighborhood.

Gwinnett's streetlighting program aims to illuminate residential streets throughout the county, working in collaboration with utility providers to maintain a uniform standard of streetlighting. Walton EMC will be responsible for installing and maintaining 34 energy-efficient LED streetlights, funded by the 2017 SPLOST program at a cost of \$18,360.
