Learn how to enhance water efficiency

Gwinnett's Water Resources Assistance Program is available to help homeowners enhance water efficiency in their homes. This partnership with Habitat for Humanity helps qualified homeowners with plumbing services, septic system repairs, and water-saving appliances, which can protect our water resources and help to save costs on your water bill and repairs.

To qualify for WRAP, applicants must be a Gwinnett County homeowner, reside in the home where assistance is provided, and have an income at or below 60 percent of the area median income. TAX COMMISSIONER

Seniors may qualify for tax breaks

Older adults qualify for some tax breaks in Gwinnett. Residents who are 65 or older as of January 1 with Georgia taxable income below \$112,048 might qualify for the Senior School Tax Homestead Exemption. An emissions waiver is also available for seniors 65 or older whose vehicles are at least 10 years old and driven less than 5,000 miles per year. To check eligibility and apply, visit GwinnettTaxCommissioner.com/Seniors.

Reduce your chances of falling

Did you know that falls are the leading cause of injury death for older adults? Falling accidents rise with age. For many older adults, the fear of falling may cause them to avoid activities like walking, shopping, or even taking part in social activities. - Visit the eye doctor yearly to monitor potential vision problems
- Make your home safer by repairing or removing things you could trip over

SPLOST

Grant supports County roadway maintenance

Smooth roads are ahead for Gwinnett County travelers. The Board of Commissioners voted to apply for a Georgia Department of Transportation grant worth more than \$7 million. This local maintenance and improvement grant will extend the life of approximately 55 miles of roadway throughout the County through resurfacing.

Each year, Transportation staff rate the pavement conditions of roadways throughout the County. Streets with a rating of 55 or below on a scale of 100 are prioritized for resurfacing. Streets above that level are patched and reexamined in the following years. The grant will be matched by the County with \$2.1 million from the 2017 SPLOST program.
