Gwinnett Police to install more safety cameras

Gwinnett Police will soon install additional safety cameras across the county. Flock cameras are used to find missing persons and provide officers with real-time information on where stolen vehicles and suspects of crime are located. With these cameras, investigators can look at historical data from 30 days prior to track vehicles and license plates associated with particular crimes.

Thanks to partnerships with local homeowners associations and community improvement districts, Gwinnett Police have access to footage from around 800 Flock cameras currently installed throughout the county.

Board approves funding for OneStop 4 Help tracking system

OneStop 4 Help offers emergency assistance to help those facing hunger, health issues, housing insecurity, and other challenges. Currently, residents can reach our community navigators through email, phone calls, in-person visits, and an online form. The Board of Commissioners recently approved funding for a new technical solution that will streamline the experience for residents and enhance communication with providers, ensuring accountability and efficient use of resources. Assessors' Office will conduct onsite property field visits

Gwinnett Board of Assessors appraisal staff conduct routine field visits to maintain accurate appraisal data as part of the County's annual review process. Representatives from Gwinnett, LMC, or Tyler Technologies verify existing or new construction, measure exteriors, and take photographs. Although no contact or involvement is needed, appraisers will carry identification and announce their presence at the property before beginning a review. Understanding the value of water

From brushing our teeth to making a cup of coffee, water is an essential part of our daily routines. However, your water goes on a long journey to get to your tap. Gwinnett Water Resources makes sure it's safe in every way.

Water Resources draws water from Lake Lanier and pumps it to two water filtration facilities. There, County employees spend two days processing it to produce more than 70 million gallons of clean water a day. We also maintain 10 water storage tanks throughout the county — holding more than 60 million gallons of water — ensuring plenty of water is always available. After treatment, water is distributed through a 4,000 mile pipe system to almost every residence, business, school, and building in Gwinnett. This process is overseen by highly trained staff 24/7, every day of the year. Additionally, that water is tested hundreds of times each day to ensure its quality.

Learn how to collect and store rainwater

Residents are invited to discover how to collect and store rainwater in a rain barrel for landscaping use on Saturday, July 15 from 10:00am to 11:30am outdoors at the Lilburn City Park Pavilion in Lilburn. To take home your new rain barrel, a \$40 pre-payment is required.

Serving also as an agent for the state of Georgia, the tax commissioner registers and titles motor vehicles and disburses associated revenue. Practice fireworks safety this holiday season

Every Independence Day, thousands of people – mostly children – are hurt while using fireworks. To avoid serious injuries, Gwinnett Fire and Emergency Services encourages residents to attend a professional show instead of using fireworks themselves. However, if you are going to use fireworks, follow these tips to celebrate safely:

- Buy fireworks only from a licensed vendor
- · Read and follow fireworks directions carefully
- Keep a bucket of water or fire extinguisher handy
- Ignite fireworks on a flat, open surface away from buildings, vegetation, or combustible materials
- Light one device at a time using a lighter
- Keep fireworks away from children
