Save money with smart water habits

Gwinnett has safe and reliable drinking water, but water is still a limited resource. Reducing your water usage helps conserve our water resources and saves you money on your water bill. Here are some helpful tips to help you save water at home:

- Turn the faucet off when brushing your teeth or shaving
- Only wash full loads of dishes and laundry
- Upgrade to WaterSense plumbing fixtures
- Water outdoors in early morning or late evening to reduce rapid evaporation

Apply for a Homestead Exemption by April 1

Looking for a way to reduce your property tax bill? Apply for a homestead exemption. Owners who occupied their home as their primary residence on January 1 and apply by April 1 qualify for an exemption this year. The state's proposed Homeowner Tax Relief Grant could mean additional savings for owners with a homestead exemption in 2023. You can apply now at **GwinnettTaxCommissioner.com/Apply** to take advantage. If you already have an exemption in place, you do not need to reapply.

PUBLIC SAFETY

Don't become a victim of tax scams

Each tax filing season, there are scammers who pose as IRS agents to trick residents into sharing personal information. By sharing this information, your life savings could be compromised. Here are some tips to help you avoid tax scams:

- Be cautious when choosing tax preparers and do research before handing over your information
- Watch for unsolicited emails, texts, and fake websites that might prompt you to click a link or share personal information
- Be on alert for phone scams; IRS representatives will never demand payments over the phone or leave threatening messages

If you suspect fraudulent tax activity, report it to the IRS. You can also report fraud or scams to the Federal Trade Commission. For more tips, visit IRS.gov.





SPLOST

New SPLOST goes into effect April 1

Last November, Gwinnett voters approved the renewal of the one-cent Special Purpose Local Option Sales Tax. The program is expected to raise \$1.35 billion for capital projects over the next six years.

The 2023 SPLOST program begins collections April 1. It is not a new or additional tax, but a continuation of the one-cent tax already being collected on retail sales. Sales tax in Gwinnett is six percent, including four percent for state taxes, one percent for schools' E-SPLOST, and one percent for our SPLOST program. The total sales tax will remain at six percent when the new collection begins in April. To learn how your pennies are working in Gwinnett, visit GwinnettSPLOST.com.

Get affordable internet access for your home

You may qualify for a \$30 monthly discount on your home or mobile internet service through the Federal Communications Commission Affordable Connectivity Program. Gwinnett County is encouraging eligible residents to claim this new benefit and start saving on internet service. Celebrate Earth Day by recycling

Have some hard-to-recycle items? Bring them — rain or shine — to our Earth Day recycling event on Saturday, April 22 from 9:00am to noon at Coolray Field in Lawrenceville. Volunteers will remove items placed in disposable containers from the trunk or back seat of your vehicle.

Recycling electronics is free except for projection/console TVs (\$35), flat-screen TVs/computer monitors (\$15), and printers (\$5). Paper shredding is limited to five copier boxes, and oil and latex paint will be limited to 10 gallons per vehicle.
