

Commissioners approve Transit Development Plan

The Board of Commissioners recently approved the Transit Development Plan, a strategic response to Gwinnett County's population and economic growth.

This plan, developed with community input over an 18-month period from 2022 to 2023, works to address mobility challenges and improve the quality of life in Gwinnett. It outlines a range of short- and long-term recommendations for the County's transit system, including capital priorities, operational improvements, and supporting infrastructure.

The new plan includes an extensive network that covers 100 percent of Gwinnett County, introducing services like local ride, quick ride, rapid ride, and airport ride to connect areas within the county and to Hartsfield-Jackson Atlanta International Airport. Get a grant toward your first home

Are you a first-time homebuyer? You might be eligible for Gwinnett's Homestretch Down Payment Assistance Program! New or existing Gwinnett residents aspiring to own a home can receive down payment assistance up to \$7,500 as a five-year deferred payment loan with zero percent interest.

To qualify, the home must be located within Gwinnett County and should not exceed \$323,000 for an existing home or \$346,000 for new construction. Visit **GwinnettCounty.com/HomestretchDPA** for a list of eligibility requirements.

Gwinnett is addressing the needs and challenges of our residents in our newest program, Upfront Gwinnett. In September, we launched the new show with a series of episodes focused on fighting fentanyl, a powerful synthetic opioid drug. Fentanyl was responsible for 527 overdoses in Gwinnett County alone last year, including 135 fatalities.

Assessors' Office will conduct onsite property field visits

Gwinnett Board of Assessors appraisal staff conduct routine field visits to maintain accurate appraisal data as part of the County's annual review process. Representatives from Gwinnett, LMC, or Tyler Technologies will verify existing or new construction, measure exteriors, and take photographs. While these visits do not require contact or involvement from property owners, appraisers will carry proper identification and announce their presence at the property before beginning a review.

- Schedule septic tank pumping every three to five years

Haven't received your decals after registration?

When you renew your registration online or by mail, allow up to 14 days to receive your decal. If you don't receive it within that time frame, you can contact the Gwinnett Tax Commissioner's Office at 770.822.8818 or via email at Tag@GwinnettCounty.com to request a replacement, which will be sent to you by mail. A replacement can also be obtained in person at any tag office by presenting your valid driver's license.

- Stay in the kitchen while you are cooking
- Keep flammable items like oven mitts, potholders, food packaging, and dish towels away from the stovetop
- Most cooking fires start when someone is frying food; keep an eye on what you fry
- Fires start when the heat is too high if you see any smoke or the grease starts to boil, turn the burner off
- Keep children and pets away from the stove
- Install and maintain smoke alarms at home

Middle school gets traffic safety improvements

The new Archer Cluster Middle School will see significant improvements in traffic safety. These enhancements include the construction of a roundabout at the intersection of Bold Springs Road and Indian Shoals Road, as well as the installation of a new traffic signal at the school's driveway on Indian Shoals Road. Additionally, a sidewalk will be installed alongside the curb and gutter, accompanied by drainage improvements.

This project is funded 82 percent by the 2017 Special Purpose Local Option Sales Tax program, known as SPLOST.
