New local routes enhance transit service around Gwinnett

Ride Gwinnett is enhancing its transit services with new routes this fall. In August, Ride Gwinnett launched Local Route 25 and Local Route 70 serving new areas in Snellville through Stone Mountain. Local Route 50 will start in November, servicing Lawrenceville, Suwanee, and Buford with stops at Sugarloaf Mills, Suwanee Town Center, the Mall of Georgia, and Coolray Field.

The new services allow for better connectivity and access to local resources — providing additional options, relieving congestion, and increasing employment and economic opportunities for residents. To learn more about local service areas, visit RideGwinnett.com.

Recycle your items at America Recycles Day

Have some hard-to-recycle items? Rain or shine, you can bring them to America Recycles Day on Saturday, November 4 from 9:00am to noon at the Gwinnett County Fairgrounds in Lawrenceville. Volunteers will remove items placed in disposable containers from the trunk or back seat of your vehicle. Recycling electronics is free except for projection/console TVs (\$35), flat screen TVs/computer monitors (\$15), and printers (\$5). Assessors' Office will conduct onsite property field visits

Gwinnett Board of Assessors appraisal staff conduct routine field visits to maintain accurate appraisal data as part of the County's annual review process. Representatives from Gwinnett, LMC, or Tyler Technologies will verify existing or new construction, measure exteriors, and take photographs. Although no contact or involvement is needed, appraisers will carry identification and announce their presence at the property before beginning a review. Renew your vehicle's tag at a kiosk

Skip the trip to the tag office and renew your tag at one of 10 kiosks around the county. The Gwinnett Tax Commissioner's office has provided a convenient and easy way to renew your vehicle's tag. All you need is a valid Georgia driver's license, the correct address on your renewal notice, proof of liability insurance transmitted to the state system, and a valid emission inspection on file, if applicable. SPLOST

New library branch opens in Snellville

County leaders joined the Gwinnett County Public Library Board of Trustees and Snellville officials to open the new Elizabeth H. Williams Library branch of the Gwinnett County Public Library in the Grove at Towne Center in September. The new facility will replace the existing branch on Lenora Church Road.

The library occupies the first floor of the 44,000-squarefoot, two-story building, while the second floor houses the City of Snellville Business Center.

The branch also offers children, teen, and adult areas, 30 computer workstations, and a multipurpose room. The County's \$10.2 million contribution to the project was funded by the 2017 Special Purpose Local Option Sales Tax program, known as SPLOST.

Update your profile today to avoid losing coverage. The state of Georgia has started verifying eligibility for all Medicaid members, including PeachCare for Kids. Your contact information is crucial to ensure your coverage remains active. County receives grants to help seniors

Gwinnett seniors will continue to have access to the programs they need the most. Gwinnett County recently received a grant through the Atlanta Regional Commission to help residents ages 60 and older get access to services such as case management, meals at senior centers, home-delivered meals, recreation, personal care, and respite care for caregivers. The Atlanta Regional Commission will provide \$2.2 million, with the County matching about \$158,000.

County offices closed for November holidays

All Gwinnett County government offices, apart from operations required for the comfort and safety of residents, will be closed Friday, November 10 for Veterans Day and will resume regular hours on Monday, November 13. Offices will also be closed November 23 and 24 for the Thanksgiving holiday.
