Learn about Gwinnett's Transit Plan

Gwinnett County has launched an educational hub for residents to get informed about the transit plan and have their questions answered. Serving as a resource for residents to find and share information, the hub explores different transit modes, benefits for the community, and information about a potential transit referendum. It also features a monthly video series, highlighting various components of the plan.

Gwinnett's Transit Plan aims to provide 100 percent transit coverage through the expansion of the existing microtransit service. Proposed services also include an airport ride to Hartsfield-Jackson Atlanta International Airport, Bus Rapid Transit and Bus Rapid Transit Lite, and additional transit transfer facilities.

In January, the Board of Commissioners approved a notice of intent to call for a transit referendum, an action required by Georgia law before the Board can officially call for a transit referendum to be placed on the November ballot.

Some recipe ingredients, such as cooking oils, are essential to creating the perfect dinner but can harm sewer pipes and septic systems. When these fats, oils, and grease, known as FOG, go down the drain, they solidify, causing blockages and potential damage. Save money and protect the environment with these helpful disposal tips:

- Scrape food scraps into the trash
- Wipe excess FOG off cookware before washing
- Use sink strainers to prevent food scraps from entering the drain
- Pour used FOG into a container with a lid and dispose of it in the trash

Keep an eye on kids around water

Accidental drownings are tragic reminders of how quickly life can be taken away. Although 90 percent of parents say they supervise their children while they are swimming, these adults are sometimes distracted by other activities. Here are some helpful tips to keep your kids safe in or around pools:

- Stay alert even with a lifeguard on duty
- Install secure barriers around home pools
- Ensure children wear a fitted life jacket whenever they are around water
- Sign your kids up for swim lessons with Gwinnett Parks to practice safe swimming
- Designate a Water Watcher, a responsible adult who watches kids in the water without distractions

SPLOST

Visit the expanded Ivy Creek Greenway

Gwinnett officials unveiled the expanded Ivy Creek Greenway at George Pierce Park in April, connecting the park with Westbrook Road. As a part of the 2018 Gwinnett Countywide Trails Master Plan, the greenway trailhead offers amenities such as a bike repair station, benches, and bioretention areas. It includes a ³/₄-mile section of greenway with a 12-foot-wide concrete multiuse trail. The Permatrak prefab concrete boardwalk structure also includes overlooks and a pedestrian bridge that spans Suwanee Creek. The \$3.7 million project was funded by the 2017 Special Purpose Local Option Sales Tax program, known as SPLOST.

Get your rental home inspected

Gwinnett County is committed to upholding the interior standards of the International Property Maintenance Code at residential rental properties. If your rental home is damaged, improperly maintained, unsanitary, or unsafe, you may request an inspection by emailing CodeEnforcement@GwinnettCounty.com, visiting GwinnettZIP.com, or calling 770.513.5004. Once a request is submitted, an inspection appointment will be scheduled. During the inspection, any code violations will be documented on a notice of violation. A Gwinnett Code Enforcement officer will then work with the property owner or manager to address all violations. For a list of common interior code violations, visit GwinnettCodeEnforcement.com.
