BOC approves 2026 budget

On January 6, the Board of Commissioners approved a \$2.58 billion budget to fund County operations and projects for 2026, a reduction of \$84.6 million from the previous year's budget.

The adopted spending plan consists of a \$2.15 billion operating budget and a \$431 million capital improvements budget, which includes funds from the Special Purpose Local Option Sales Tax program.

The budget includes funding for initiatives like the completion of the Gwinnett Community Resource Center at Grayson Highway, enhancements to E911 communications, and the relocation of Fire Station 3. The budget also helps to maintain roadways and provide safe, clean drinking water.

Prepare your home for cold weather

When temperatures drop, winterize your home to prevent potential damage to your plumbing system. Frozen water in your pipes can expand, causing those pipes to burst. Avoid costly repairs and prevent winter plumbing problems with these helpful tips:

- Use an insulated spigot cover on outdoor faucets
- Insulate pipes in attics, basements, and crawl spaces
- Keep garage doors closed to protect unheated areas
- While traveling, set your thermostat to at least 55 degrees Fahrenheit

TAX COMMISSIONER

Emissions required for 2002 to 2023 model cars

For 2026, all gasoline-powered and light-duty trucks (weighing 8,500 pounds or less) with model years 2002 through 2023 must undergo emissions testing for registration and renewal. For testing locations, senior exemptions, and more, visit CleanAirForce.com. Once your vehicle has been tested, renew online at GwinnettTaxCommissioner.com/Renew.

PUBLIC SAFETY

Prevent carbon monoxide poisoning in your home

Carbon monoxide is a colorless, odorless, and tasteless gas that can cause illness or possibly death. It forms when fuel doesn't burn completely in appliances such as furnaces, dryers, wood-burning stoves, fireplaces, and car engines. Many cases of poisoning come from poorly installed or maintained home heating systems. To avoid carbon monoxide poisoning in your home, follow these helpful tips:

- Install a carbon monoxide detector in your home.
- Install home heating appliances according to the manufacturer's instructions.
- Never use gasoline-powered tools or engines indoors.
- Avoid warming up your vehicle in the garage.

Pedestrian safety improvements coming near Dyer Elementary

Gwinnett County is enhancing safety and accessibility for pedestrians near Dyer Elementary School. New sidewalks will be installed on the north side of Hurricane Shoals Road from the school to Retreat Drive and on the west side of Rabbit Hill Circle from Hurricane Shoals Road to Hood Road. The \$1.3 million project will be funded by the Special Purpose Local Option Sales Tax program as part of the County's ongoing commitment to building a more walkable, sustainable community. Get a grant toward your first home

If you're a first-time homebuyer, you might be eligible for Gwinnett's Homestretch Down Payment Assistance Program! New or existing Gwinnett residents aspiring to own a home can receive down payment assistance of up to \$10,000 as a five-year deferred payment loan with 0% interest. To qualify, the home must be located within Gwinnett County and should not exceed \$349,000 for an existing home or \$410,000 for new construction.
