Commissioners approve 2040 Unified Plan

The Board of Commissioners continues to focus on our mission of providing high-quality services to Gwinnett County's citizens and businesses. The County's 2040 Unified Plan was approved a few weeks ago after receiving a favorable review from the state Department of Community Affairs and the Atlanta Regional Commission. Tax assessment notices mailed

You should have received your property tax assessments by now as they were mailed earlier this month. These assessments show your updated property value for this year as well as an estimate of your property taxes. Remember that you have the right to appeal the property value within 45 days from the date stated on your 2019 Annual Notice of Assessment. The Tax Assessor's Office is ready to assist property owners with any questions, so be sure to visit their website for more details.

Update on Infinite Energy Center and Revel development

If you've been around the Infinite Energy Center lately, you have seen lots of construction happening in and around the center. The parking lot at the front of the center is being revamped into a multi-level parking garage. Inside the center, a 50,000 square foot expansion will take place, almost doubling the existing space, along with a new

entrance wing, roof, and renovated grand ballroom.

North American Properties, the developer for the Revel mixed-use project around the Infinite Energy Center, has secured a financial partner. In addition, North American Properties has started discussions with tenants for the new project, which will be revealed later this summer.

Renovated Norcross Senior Center opens with ribbon cutting

The newly renovated Norcross Senior Center, located in District 1, opened May 8 with a ribbon cutting ceremony. The \$444,400 renovation, funded by SPLOST, created this state-of-the art facility with features to meet the needs of our aging adults. The new flow and natural light from the open concept make time spent at the Norcross Senior Center more enjoyable for participants. The building features an enlarged dining room to seat 30 more seniors than could be previously accommodated, a multipurpose classroom, a updated computer lab, a personal care room, a salon, raised garden



beds in the patio area, and support space. The design also anticipates older individuals with mobility, visual, and hearing challenges.

Observe these water safety tips this summer

Outdoor pools in Gwinnett County parks will open beginning **Saturday, May 25**. In addition, many of you will venture out to Lake Lanier or the Chattahoochee River this summer. While lifeguards are onduty at County pools, the Chattahoochee River, Lake Lanier, and many facilities such as backyard, apartment complex, and subdivision pools have no lifeguard on-duty and require extra diligence to ensure safety.

In order to stay safe and enjoy the summer, Gwinnett Fire and Emergency Services suggests following some simple water safety rules:

- Supervise children in and around water.
- Check the water release schedule from Buford Dam before entering the Chattahoochee River.
 When water is released from the dam, the river can rise 10 feet in minutes! Call 770.945.1466
 or listen to 1610AM for release schedules. When the release is scheduled, quickly head for the shore.

Swim only in designated areas and obey boating and pool rules.

Did You Know?

There are six **Community Improvement Districts** in Gwinnett County, with four that are entirely (<u>Gwinnett Place CID</u> and <u>Sugarloaf CID</u>) and partially (<u>Gateway 85 CID</u> and <u>Lilburn CID</u>) in District 1. Community Improvement Districts are an association of property owners in a defined area that voluntarily tax themselves in order to fund improvements within the district's boundaries. CIDs seek to improve business development opportunities and enhance property values by developing and promoting coordinated transportation and community character improvements to benefit property owners, business owners, and residents in their specific district.
