Gwinnett awarded grant to address roadway safetyGwinnett County has been awarded \$200,000 in federal funding through the U.S. Department of Transportation's <u>Safe Streets and Roads for All grant program</u>. These funds will help to improve and build upon existing roadway safety projects.

The County will contribute a match of \$50,000 for a total of \$250,000 to create the Countywide Safety Action Plan, which will implement measures that prevent roadway deaths and injuries. This plan will aim at reducing motorist, bicyclist, and pedestrian fatalities on county-maintained roads and state routes.

Apply for a Homestead Exemption by April 1

Looking for a way to reduce your property tax bill? Apply for a homestead exemption. Owners who occupied their home as their primary residence on January 1 and apply by April 1 qualify for an exemption this year. The state's proposed Homeowner Tax Relief Grant could mean additional savings for owners with a homestead exemption in 2023. You can apply now at GwinnettTaxCommissioner.com/Apply to take advantage. If you already have an exemption in place, you do not need to reapply.

County accepting applications for next Gwinnett Youth Commission class

Another batch of high schoolers will get an inside look at Gwinnett County government, interact with local leaders, and receive community leadership training this summer. The Gwinnett Youth Commission is a year-long program, which includes an eight-week summer training session. To be considered for this upcoming term, participants must be rising high school freshmen, sophomores, juniors, or seniors going into the 2023 – 2024 school year and must apply by Friday, April 7. Take the Piedmont Pathway survey

Gwinnett County is seeking input from residents on the development of a trail that will ultimately connect several counties through a short <u>survey</u>. The Piedmont Pathway Study explores how the trail can be built and its impact on the environment. As part of the Core Trail system and the Gwinnett Countywide Trails Master Plan, the 28-mile, crosscounty trail is designed to provide multiple social, economic, and environmentally sustainable benefits.



The County will use the Piedmont Pathway to address connectivity needs in Gwinnett and provide alternate modes of transportation for residents and visitors. The trail will also increase access to recreation and greenspace and enhance connectivity to Gwinnett's neighboring counties — DeKalb, Fulton, and Barrow. Board takes strides to strengthen enforcement inside rental properties

The Board of Commissioners recently <u>voiced our support</u> to adopt the International Property Maintenance Code, with local amendments tailored to the needs of Gwinnett County. If the policy changes, Gwinnett County code enforcement officers will be able to work with tenants at residential rental properties to make sure the interior of the home is up to code.

State law requires the Department of Community Affairs to conduct a 60-day review of the proposed changes prior to final adoption of the International Property Maintenance Code by the Board of Commissioners.
