Last chance to apply for the next Gwinnett Youth Commission class

New SPLOST program now collecting your pennies

Last November, Gwinnett voters approved the renewal of the one-cent Special Purpose Local Option Sales Tax. The program is expected to raise \$1.35 billion for capital projects over the next six years.

The 2023 SPLOST began collections April 1. It is not a

new or additional tax but a continuation of the one-cent tax already being collected on retail sales. Sales tax in Gwinnett is six percent, including four percent for state taxes, one percent for schools' E-SPLOST, and one percent for our SPLOST program.
