Understanding your Annual Notice of Assessment

The Gwinnett County Board of Assessors mailed approximately 304,000 Annual Notices of Assessment to residential and commercial property owners in April.

An <u>Annual Notice of Assessment</u> is not a tax bill. The notice informs you of the value assessed on your residential or commercial real estate as of January 1, 2023.

Watch the video above to learn more about reading your Annual Notice of Assessment. Property owners may appeal the assessed value within 45 days of the date of the notice by submitting a completed PT-311A State Appeal Form to the Tax Assessors' Office or by visiting <u>Gwinnett-Assessor.com</u>.
