


Greetings!

Apply for a small business grant starting September 5 Gwinnett County is helping small businesses impacted by COVID-19 find relief. The Board of Commissioners received \$181 million from the American Rescue Plan Act and allocated \$6 million of the funds to help small business owners.

Officials celebrate widening of Spalding Drive

Officials from Gwinnett County and the cities of Peachtree Corners and Sandy Springs on Wednesday celebrated the <u>completion of the Spalding</u> <u>Drive widening project</u> from Winters Chapel Road to State Route 140. The project widened the segment of Spalding Drive from a two-lane to a four-lane road with a center turn lane, added nearly 3,000 feet of a new 10-foot-wide multiuse path and replaced the existing bridge over Crooked Creek.

The project was achieved through a regional

partnership between Gwinnett County, the State Road and Tollway Authority, the city of Peachtree Corners and the city of Sandy Springs. Construction on the project began in spring 2020 and was funded in part by Gwinnett County's Special Purpose Local Option Sales Tax.

Ride Gwinnett launches new local bus routes

Ride Gwinnett's recent expansion includes two new local bus routes — Route 25 and Route 70. Route 25 services parts of Duluth, Lilburn, and Stone Mountain. The route begins at the Gwinnett Transit Center at Gwinnett Place Mall. It travels down Pleasant Hill Road passing Plaza Las Americas and takes Lawrenceville Highway towards Lilburn City Hall. After passing City Hall, Route 25 travels through Mountain Park towards Stone Mountain, where it ends near the Amazon Prime Distribution Warehouse.



Ride Gwinnett Route 70 is the first to provide service to the Snellville area. It also services parts of Stone Mountain. Beginning in downtown Snellville, Route 70 travels down Highway 78 towards Stone Mountain. It connects with route 25 at the Amazon Distribution Warehouse, before traveling through Dekalb county and ending at the Indian Creek MARTA Station.
