Happening Around Gwinnett

Chairwoman Hendrickson presents 2024 proposed budget

Gwinnett County Chairwoman Nicole Love Hendrickson presented her <u>proposed budget</u> to guide County government for the 2024 fiscal year. The proposed budget addresses needs like affordable housing and public safety, as well as challenges facing county government including hiring and retaining a qualified workforce.



A public hearing will be held on **December 4 at 6:30pm** at the Gwinnett Justice and Administration Center in

Lawrenceville for residents to address the Board of Commissioners. Residents can also <u>share their input</u> on the County's website through December 31.



Gwinnett hosting poll official hiring events

The Voter Registrations and Elections Division is looking for residents of all backgrounds, including bilingual poll officials, who want to gain valuable work experience. Residents who wish to be involved are invited to attend one of Gwinnett's upcoming poll hiring events on **Monday, December 4 from 4:00pm to 7:00pm** at the Gwinnett Voter Registrations and Election Beauty P. Baldwin Building in Lawrenceville or on **Monday, December 18 from 4:00pm to 7:00pm** at the Dacula Park Activity Building in Dacula.

Applicants must be at least 16 years old, a U.S. citizen, able to read, write, and speak English, be a resident or employee of Gwinnett County, and have access to a computer for required online training. Attendees must complete an I-9 form and bring the required original identification documents for verification. All workers can earn up to \$390 per election. If you are unable to attend a poll official hiring event, visit <u>GwinnettCountyJobs.com</u> to apply.

Warming stations open for overnight relief

Gwinnett will open warming stations for residents in need to receive temporary, overnight relief when temperatures reach **35 degrees and below**. Residents who visit the sites will be able to warm up, eat a meal, and get some rest. The warming stations are available from 6:00pm until 7:00am.

Federal housing assistance programs offer nocost repairs and improvements

A few changes in your home can make it safer and allow you to complete day-to-day tasks independently. Residents who own a house in Gwinnett and are **62 years or older** are encouraged to see if they qualify for no-cost home safety modifications. An occupational therapist completes an inhome assessment to identify and prioritize changes to make tasks easier and reduce accidents, with repairs completed at no cost to the homeowner. Gwinnett homeowners or renter-occupied households are also encouraged to apply for no cost home hazard repair, which includes testing for lead, mold, radon, as well as home weatherization. **Applicants must meet the HUD income guidelines**. For more information, visit <u>GwinnettHousing.org</u>.
