Gwinnett is helping to address homelessness

Gwinnett is teaming up with United Way, the Primerica Foundation, and other partners on a new collaborative program to better coordinate assistance for people in our community who are homeless. Called the HomeFirst Gwinnett Initiative, the program is establishing an assessment center and a 20-bed shelter for women and children in the Norcross area. My fellow commissioners and I attended the Break-Through event where we used

Everyone can enjoy Gwinnett's accessible playgrounds

In Gwinnett County's park system, we have three completely inclusive playgrounds: Peachtree Ridge Park, Tribble Mill Park, and Bay Creek Park. Peachtree Ridge Park and Bay Creek Park have a special needs inclusive ball field as well. All playgrounds and all pools are accessible to kids who use wheelchairs and children with disabilities. At West Gwinnett Park and Aquatic Center, we also have a large adaptable



swim program that continues to grow and expand.

Help keep fats, oils, and grease out of our sewer collection system

Pouring a little bacon grease down the drain or tossing meat scraps in the garbage disposal may not seem like a big deal, but every little bit adds up and can create major clogs and blockages in sewer lines that are part of the County's sewer collection system. Once a line is blocked, wastewater can back up into streets, yards, homes, and even spill into Gwinnett's rivers and streams. If the clog occurs in the sewer

lateral, then cleanup becomes the property owner's responsibility. Here are some tips for avoiding nasty backups and clogs:

- Pour liquid food scraps into a container and put the container in your trash
- Pour used oil into a container with a top so it can be reused, recycled, or placed in the trash for disposal
- Pour cooled grease into a grease can or other container for disposal or absorb it with paper towels or newspaper
- Use mesh drain strainers to catch solid food scraps to throw out with your trash
- Scrape plates over the trash can or wipe them down with a paper towel
- NOTE: "Flushable" wipes should not actually be flushed! <u>Our Department of Water Resources explains why.</u>

Help protect Gwinnett's natural resources

Gwinnett Clean & Beautiful and the Department of Water Resources are partnering to host an Adopt-a-Stream Chemical Workshop on Thursday, May 9 from 5:30pm to 8:00pm at Lilburn City Park. Georgia Adopt-a-Stream enables residents to collect baseline water quality data to both observe the conditions of our local streams and become more aware of pollution and water quality issues. Unfortunately, many streams in Gwinnett do not currently meet established state water quality standards. That's why we need your help! You and your family, co-workers, or friend group can serve as official "keepers" of a portion of a creek or



stream by periodically monitoring its condition with supplies, training, and certifications in chemical, bacterial, and macroinvertebrate testing provided by Gwinnett Clean & Beautiful and DWR. For more information or to register for a workshop, visit www.GwinnettCB.org/Adopt-a-Stream/.
