Learn more about Gwinnett's budget

Chairman Nash's 2020 budget proposal will be made available to the public and news media November 19 in conjunction with its formal presentation to me and my fellow commissioners. Residents will have the opportunity to provide input on the proposed budget during a budget public hearing December 12 or via an online form that will be available through the end of the year. The Board of Commissioners will adopt the annual budget during our first meeting

in January.

You can view [budget presentations](#) made by elected officials, department directors, and agency heads who presented their business plans and financial resource requests to the budget review team made up of six Gwinnett residents who were invited by Chairman Nash to help set priorities and make recommendations for the proposed budget.

County offices closed, trash and recycling collection delay for Thanksgiving

County offices, with the exception of those required for the comfort and safety of residents, will be closed November 28 and 29 for Thanksgiving and will reopen Monday, December 2. As always, a Magistrate Court judge will be available at the Gwinnett County Detention Center during the holiday.

Thanksgiving Day is one of three trash and recycling holidays for residents in unincorporated Gwinnett, along with Christmas Day and New Year's Day. That means collection scheduled for Thursday, November 28 will be rescheduled to Friday, November 29, and Friday collection will be rescheduled to Saturday, November 30. Only Thursday and Friday collections will be affected. You can visit www.GCSolidWaste.com to find your hauler's contact information. If you live within city limits, contact your city's trash and recycling provider to find out if collection will be delayed due to the holiday.



Transit Review Committee meetings continue

The Board of Commissioners passed a resolution on September



3, 2019, creating the Gwinnett County Transit Review Committee, a group of 13 citizens who will help to advise the Board on how to proceed in expanding transit in Gwinnett County to meet future demand. The committee is tasked with conducting a thoughtful and thorough review of Gwinnett's transit needs and the options for addressing those needs. The committee will present a written report with recommendations to the Board of Commissioners by the end of the year.

To allow for greater input from the wider Gwinnett community, the committee is holding regular open meetings to discuss the County's future in transit. The next three meetings will look focus on transit scenario analysis and are scheduled for November 20, December 2, and December 9. All three meetings will take place from 6:00pm to 8:00pm in Conference Room C at the Gwinnett Justice and Administration Center, located at 75 Langley Drive, Lawrenceville. The city of Peachtree Corners has designated the outer right lane at Technology Parkway as an autonomous vehicle test track where a driverless shuttle called Olli will operate through the end of the year. Olli is part of



Peachtree Corners' Curiosity Lab program. Decorating your home for the holidays can be one of the highlights of the holiday season. However, decorations can also be a fire hazard. Here are some tips to help keep you safe:

- All holiday decorations should be nonflammable and should be kept away from a heat source or open flame
- Inspect holiday lights for frayed wires, bare spots, gaps in the insulation, broken or cracked sockets, and excessive kinks or wear
- Be sure lit candles are placed in stable holders and cannot be easily knocked over, and never leave the house or go to sleep with a candle burning
