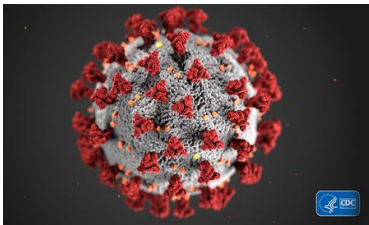

Happening Around Gwinnett



County government continues to operate during COVID-19

County government continues to operate during COVID-19. Gwinnett County Government is monitoring developments in the coronavirus pandemic and how it affects our residents, employees, and our delivery of important County services. Though Governor Kemp's Shelter-in-Place order has been rescinded for most residents, elderly and medically fragile residents must continue to

shelter in place through June 12 as part of the extended Public Health State of Emergency. Most County facilities remain open. Learn about the response from specific departments [here](#).

Advance voting now underway

Voters are not limited to Election Day to cast their ballot in the June 9 Presidential Preference Primary, General Primary, and Nonpartisan Election. Eligible voters may vote advance in person every day, including weekends, from May 18 to June 5 at the Gwinnett Voter Registrations and Elections Beauty P. Baldwin Building in Lawrenceville. The office is open for advance voting Monday through Saturday from 8:00am to 5:00pm and Sunday from noon to 7:00pm. Voters can also cast their ballots those days at the Gwinnett County Fairgrounds located at 2405 Sugarloaf Parkway in Lawrenceville Monday through Saturday from 7:00am to 7:00pm and Sunday from noon to 7:00pm. There will be no voting on Monday, May 25 at either location in observance of Memorial Day.



And if you took advantage of the vote-by-mail option, we now have our drop boxes installed at [eight locations around the county](#) where you can securely drop off your ballot without postage.

Gwinnett County to observe Memorial Day with virtual ceremony

Because of the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic, Gwinnett County Government will commemorate America's fallen military and law enforcement heroes with a virtual Memorial Day ceremony on May 25.

Board of Commissioners Chairman Charlotte Nash, District 4 Commissioner Marlene Fosque, and Ron and Caroline Buice of the Fallen Heroes Committee will deliver video remarks. Retired Marine Colonel Parker Miller will be the keynote speaker. The ceremony will also include the traditional appearance of the Gwinnett County Honor Guard, a singing of the National Anthem, three-volley salute and Taps.

Census timeline extended in response to COVID-19

More than 60 percent of Gwinnett's residents have already completed the 2020 Census, but we need your help to ensure everyone is counted. In response to COVID-19, the Census Bureau has modified the timeline for the 2020 Census. You now have until October 31 to complete your questionnaire, but if you wait that long, doorknockers may come to your house starting mid-August to collect your answers. The census helps shape representation in government and influences federal and state governments' decisions

about how to distribute funding and resources. It also informs plans for roads, hospitals, and new businesses. Complete your questionnaire online at My2020Census.gov, by mail, or by phone today.

Share your opinion on Gwinnett's list of proposed transit projects

You can help shape the future of transit in Gwinnett by sharing your thoughts on the [list of transit projects](#) submitted by Gwinnett County to The Atlanta-Region Transit Link Authority for approval. The deadline to share your views is May 22.



The ATL Board of Directors will consider the public comments when it weighs Gwinnett's list at its June 4 meeting. If accepted by The ATL Board, these projects would be eligible for inclusion in a potential future transit referendum that could be considered by Gwinnett voters. The Board of Commissioners has not determined whether or when to call a referendum that would identify a plan for financially constrained transit projects and provide a funding source. Gwinnett nonprofits invited to apply for COVID-19 grant funding

Gwinnett County is accepting applications from nonprofit and faith-based partners for round one of the federal CARES Act grant funding to serve Gwinnett residents most in need because of COVID-19. Applicants will need to fill out the COVID-19 Statement of Need application and submit it electronically to the Community Development Program by June 4 for consideration.

Funding allocations will be made to qualifying nonprofit agencies providing eligible services in Gwinnett County. Applicants must be registered to conduct business in the state of Georgia and be designated as a 501(c)(3) organization.

Make a difference by donating blood

If you're healthy and able, consider donating blood through the American Red Cross. At each blood drive, Red Cross employees follow thorough safety protocols. In addition to standard procedures, the Red Cross has also implemented pre-donation donor temperature screenings, enhanced disinfecting procedures, social distancing, staff wellness and protection, and more education for donors.

The American Red Cross conducted several successful blood drives at Gwinnett County parks in April, collecting 177 units of blood which could save up to 531 lives. There are more opportunities to donate blood this month. Blood drives will take place at the Bethesda Park Senior Center from 10:00am to 4:00pm on May 20, 21, 28, and 29.
