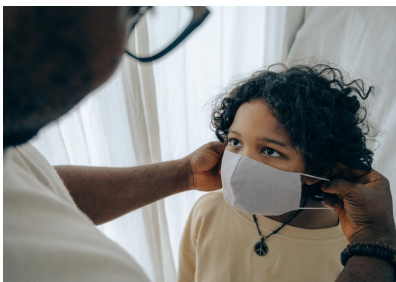

#KeepGwinnettSafe by following basic safety precautions

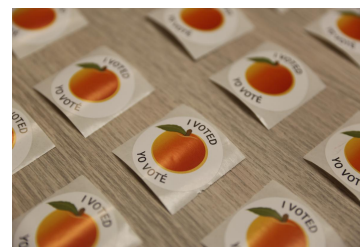

The deadline to register for the November 3 General Election and Special Election is Monday, October 5. If you're planning to vote in November, now is a good time to check your registration status at the [Secretary of State's My Voter Page](#).

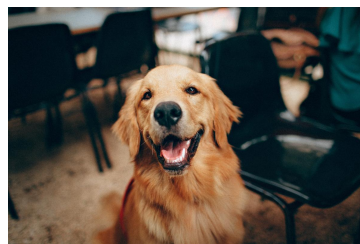
Board considering millage rate rollback

The Gwinnett County Board of Commissioners will adopt the 2020 millage rate Tuesday, August 18 at 2:00pm in the Gwinnett Justice and Administration Center Auditorium, located at 75 Langley Drive in Lawrenceville. Commissioners are considering a rate of 6.95 mills for the County's General Fund. This rollback rate means that the General Fund portion of the tax bill will not increase. Required notices for the millage rate adoption will be published in the county's legal organ Sunday, August 9.

Commissioners also will consider millage rates for Police, Fire and Emergency Services, Development and Code Enforcement, and Recreation funds. Learn more about the proposed millage rates [here](#).

Census self-response deadline approaching

The Census Bureau recently released an updated timeline announcing that self-responses will end after September 30. Remember, census data determines our representation in government, helps allocate federal funding, and leads future planning for community resources like schools, hospitals, and roads. Library offers drive-thru food pantry

The Gwinnett County Public Library is partnering with the Atlanta Community Food Bank to host a drive-thru food pantry at the Norcross branch library **Tuesday, August 18** from 11:00am while supplies last. Each family will receive one package of food containing up to 20 pounds of produce and shelf-stable items. To keep everyone safe, volunteers will bring food packages out to cars. The Norcross Branch of the Gwinnett County Public Library is located at 6025 Buford Highway in Norcross. Another drive-thru food pantry event will be held **Tuesday, August 25** starting at 11:00am at the Dacula Branch of the Gwinnett County Public Library, located at 265 Dacula Road in Dacula.

Elections office mails confirmation notices to some voters

Some voters may receive a confirmation notice including a form from Gwinnett County Voter Registrations and Elections. If you receive this notice, please complete and submit the form within 30 days so your voter registration will be updated and you will remain in an Active Status. A postage paid envelope is included in the mailer.

If you choose not to complete and return the form, your registration will **NOT** be canceled. You will still be eligible to vote even if you are moved to an Inactive Status. Voters most likely received this confirmation because a piece of official election mail was returned undeliverable to the Elections Office.
