Last chance to make sure #EveryOneCounts in the 2020 Census!

The self-response deadline for the 2020 Census is Wednesday, September 30, which means there are just 10 days left to ensure that Gwinnett gets a complete and accurate count of our population. Remember, census data determines our representation in government, federal funding, and future planning for community resources like schools, hospitals, and roads. Be sure to visit My2020Census.gov to fill out the survey! It's simple and takes less than 10 minutes, and you can rest

Georgia Secretary of State launches absentee ballot request website

The Georgia Secretary of State's Office has launched a new online portal for voters to request an absentee ballot. Voters can now visit BallotRequest.sos.ga.gov to request an absentee by mail ballot for November 3 election. The new website asks voters to enter their first name, last name, and date of birth and to provide a Georgia driver's license or personal identification card issued by the state of Georgia, as well as their county of residence. The request is then sent to



county election officials. When the ballots are available, voters will receive their ballot in the mail.

If you plan to vote advance in person, you can vote from October 12 to October 30 at the Beauty P. Baldwin Voter Registrations and Elections Office and eight additional satellite locations, including the Gwinnett County Fairgrounds. La Secretaría del Estado de Georgia lanza un sitio web para solicitar boletas de voto

La Oficina del Secretaría de Estado de Georgia ha lanzado un nuevo portal en línea para que los votantes soliciten una boleta de voto en ausente. Los votantes ahora pueden visitar BallotRequest.sos.ga.gov para solicitar una boleta de voto ausente por correo para las elección del 3 de Noviembre. El nuevo sitio web solicita a los votantes que ingresen su nombre, apellido y la fecha de nacimiento y proporcionar una licencia de conducir de Georgia o una tarjeta de identificación personal emitida por el estado de Georgia, así como su condado de residencia. Luego, la solicitud se envía a los funcionarios electorales del condado. Cuando las boletas estén disponibles, los votantes recibirán su boleta por correo.

Si planea votar por adelantado en persona, puede votar del 12 al 30 de Octubre en la Oficina de Inscripción de Votantes y Elecciones Beauty P. Baldwin y en ocho ubicaciones satélites adicionales, incluyendo el Recinto Ferial del Condado de Gwinnett. Encuentre lugares y horarios de votación adelantada aquí en el sitio web de Elecciones

Get help with online learning from the Gwinnett County Public Library

The Gwinnett County Public Library and Gwinnett County Public Schools are providing students with access to an online resource for remote learning. The <u>Tutor.com Learning Suite</u> offers online tutoring, homework help, test preparation, and self-study resources. Students can get one-on-one tutoring in any math, science, social studies, and English subject. Tutor.com covers 40 subjects, including AP courses. Live tutoring support is available daily from 8:00am to

Enjoy your parks safely


In an evolving response to the COVID-19 pandemic, certain areas within parks remain closed. However, residents can still enjoy the outdoors for exercise and mental and physical health while following social distancing guidelines recommended by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.

Things to know before you go:

- Water fountains are closed; bring your own water to stay hydrated
- There is a maximum occupancy of 50 at any amenity such as pavilions, basketball courts, sand volleyball courts, playgrounds, skate parks, or ball fields
- Guests should use a "Leave No Trace" mentality. Bring a suitable trash bag and take everything out to help protect others
- Follow CDC guidelines to keep yourself and other guests safe



• Follow guidelines for specific amenities like pickleball courts and aquatic centers



Know when to get tested for COVID-19

The Gwinnett, Newton, and Rockdale County Health Department recommends that individuals get tested for COVID-19 if they've been within 6 feet of a COVID-19 positive person for more than 15 minutes, masked or unmasked. You should get tested when you start to feel ill or 10 days after exposure if you don't have symptoms. You can answer the questions in this flow chart to determine if you should get tested.
