
Happening Around Gwinnett

Vaccinations underway at mass vaccination site at Gwinnett Place Mall

Gwinnett County Government and the Gwinnett, Newton, and Rockdale County Health Departments worked together to convert the bottom floor of the former Sears building at Gwinnett Place Mall into a mass vaccination center that will accommodate immunizing up to 3,000 people a day as vaccines become available. Vaccine is still limited, and the state is currently in Phase 1A of distribution, which includes health care workers, first responders, long-term care facility workers and residents, and adults 65 and older. Appointments at the Gwinnett Place Mall site are required and can only be scheduled [here](#).



The [state's COVID-19 vaccination page](#) includes information about the COVID-19 distribution phases; a status dashboard where you can see data about the amount of vaccines allocated, shipped, and administered to Georgians; and a list of locations where appointments are available. If you're looking for a [COVID-19 vaccination site near you](#), be sure to check back often as the participating vaccine site locations list will be updated frequently. Additional locations statewide will be added when providers are ready to safely administer the vaccine, and as vaccine supply allows.

Kick off your spring cleaning at Household Hazardous Waste Collection Day

Gwinnett Water Resources and Gwinnett Clean & Beautiful are teaming up to host the fifth annual Household Hazardous Waste collection day Saturday, February 20 from 9:00am to 1:00pm at the Gwinnett County Fairgrounds. Residents can drop off up to five containers of household hazardous waste, like paint, aerosols, batteries, and more, for proper disposal or recycling. COVID-19 guidelines will be in place to ensure the safety of residents and staff, which may result in a slightly longer wait during drop off. For a full list

Apply for a seat on the Zoning Board of Appeals

The role of the ZBA is to consider and decide upon appeals and variances from the strict application of the Unified Development Ordinance. Generally, meetings are held the second Tuesday of each month at 6:30pm at the Gwinnett County Justice and Administration Center auditorium. Due to the pandemic, certain meetings may be held virtually.

Now is the time to apply for a homestead exemption

The best way to reduce your property tax bill is to apply for a homestead exemption. If you own and occupy a home in Gwinnett as your primary residence as of January 1, you likely qualify. Apply at GwinnettTaxCommissioner.com/Apply by April 1, and staff will help determine your eligibility and the best exemption for your situation. You must apply by April 1 for relief this year. If you already have an exemption in place, you do not need to reapply.
