Reminder: rental and utility assistance available through Project RESET 2.0

Applications are open for Project RESET 2.0, which will use more than \$28.1 million in stimulus funds from the federal Emergency Rental Assistance Program to support struggling renters in our community. The program offers up to 15 months of total assistance, which may include rental and/or utility arrears (up to 12 months) and future rental and/or utility assistance if needed. Payments will be made directly to landlords and utility providers for past-due balances. Tenants

Waste Pro Update

County Administrator Glenn Stephens provided the following update regarding service issues with Waste Pro, one of the residential trash and recycling haulers contracted with the County:

We have communicated directly to Waste Pro about the requirement for performance improvement. Our County Solid Waste team continues to work closely with Waste Pro representatives to focus on completing trash and recycle routes on scheduled service days. The

County requires daily reports of missed areas and investigates specific service requests to monitor service quality. Solid Waste managers meet with Waste Pro representatives weekly to review the key performance indicators for the past week and emphasize areas for immediate improvement.

Key performance indicators have continued to improve in both trash and recycling services since March. Also, Waste Pro is now using call blasts to inform residents of service delays. Recent local Waste Pro management changes have resulted in increased communication and improved responsiveness to individual customer service concerns.

Waste Pro is actively recruiting and working to address labor shortages that have impacted businesses across the nation. More drivers are being trained, and additional routes and trucks will be added to improve service while customers' day of service will not change.

Waste Pro's corporate office has made a commitment to allocate resources to address their performance challenges with a permanent solution. County staff, County management, and the Board of Commissioners are working together to address service issues. Gwinnett, CIDS, and state DOT to participate in connected vehicle program

Gwinnett County is partnering with the Georgia Department of Transportation and five Community Improvement Districts to implement the state's Regional Connected Vehicle Program on several major traffic corridors in Gwinnett County. The cutting-edge Connected Vehicle Technology program seeks to enhance traffic safety by providing traffic and road condition in-formation to vehicles equipped to receive the messages. The equipment can also communicate with traffic control centers to help improve traffic management. Special equipment will be installed on several roads including Peachtree Industrial Boulevard, Pleasant Hill Road, Buford Highway, Jimmy Carter Boulevard, Stone Mountain Highway, Sugarloaf Parkway, and Lawrenceville Highway.



Gwinnett provides free summer meals to kids at 25 locations around the county

Gwinnett County is helping ease hardships during the COVID-19 pandemic by continuing to feed Gwinnett's children during the summer. The Gwinnett Summer Meals program provides free grab-and-go breakfasts and lunches for children 18 years of age and younger at County parks, libraries, and other locations. Meals are also available for adults 19 years of age and older with physical or mental disabilities who are enrolled in a school-based program.
