Election season is upon us and I wanted to highlight that our school board was made non-partisan, which means that like our judges, their election is **May 24**, so please be sure to make a plan to vote to ensure your voice is counted and you don't feel regret when the November election rolls around and it's too late to have your input in these important races. Also, if you pull a non-partisan ballot, you will only get the judicial and school board races and unfortunately you must select a party ballot if you want to vote in any of the partisan primary races. District 2 only has a primary election for county commissioner on the Democratic ballot while there is only a Gubernatorial primary race on the Republican ballot. However, United States Senate and United States Congressional District 7 have primaries on both partisan ballots. Safely dispose of unwanted medications

Gwinnett Police is partnering with the Drug Enforcement Administration for the National Take Back Initiative on **Saturday, April 30** to provide a safe and convenient way to drop off unused and expired medications at various collection sites. Tablets, capsules, patches, and other forms of prescription drugs can be dropped off at police headquarters and its six precincts from 10:00am to 2:00pm for proper disposal. Leaders cut ribbon on The Water Tower

County leaders cut the ribbon on [The Water Tower](#) — an innovation center that brings education, coworking, and research together under one roof. The campus features three classrooms, four conference rooms, multiple laboratories, coworking spaces, single-tenant office rentals, a field training center, and a water treatment demonstration area.

Located in Buford, The Water Tower is operated by two nonprofit organizations: The Water Tower at Gwinnett and The Water Tower Institute. The \$33.7 million facility combines water utilities, research, and community and executes on my pillars of innovation, inclusion, and investments in infrastructure.

Board of Assessors mails notices for 2022 assessed property values

The Gwinnett County Board of Assessors mailed approximately 294,000 Annual Notices of Assessment to residential and commercial property owners today. An Annual Notice of Assessment is not a tax bill. The notice informs you of the value assessed on your residential or commercial real estate as of January 1, 2022. Property owners may appeal the assessed value within 45 days of the date of the notice. To view and print a copy of your annual notice of assessment, research market values, read
