The year is speeding by, and spring will be here before we know it! I hope you had a great Valentine's Day with those you hold near and dear.

Since my last newsletter, the Board of Commissioners took action on several important items:

- Appointed Marcus Strickland to the Gwinnett County Airport Authority to represent District 2
- Awarded a SPLOST-funded \$868,044 contract for pedestrian and traffic improvements at Pleasant Hill Road at Ronald Reagan Parkway and Lawrenceville Highway at Ronald Reagan Parkway
- Approved Gwinnett Transportation to apply for two grants worth \$25 million each as part of the U.S. Department of Transportation's Rebuilding American Infrastructure with Sustainability and Equity program to upgrade the Gwinnett Place Transit Center and build a multi-use trail from Gwinnett Place to McDaniel Farm Park
- Accepted a \$2,600 donation from the Gwinnett County Police Foundation on behalf of Ordner Construction Foundation to purchase a grill and rowing machine for Gwinnett Police's Central Precinct
- Appointed Robert Ponder as Registered Architect Representative and David Moss as Registered Electrical Engineer Representative to the Board of Construction Adjustments and Appeals
- Appointed Debra Hoyte-Malette to the Region Three Department of Behavioral Health and Developmental Disabilities Advisory Council
- Approved a \$1.26 million contract for the development of the Gwinnett County 2045 Unified Plan

Needs Assessment. As a part of this process, Health Management Associates is distributing <u>a survey</u> to help understand the health and well-being of our community and be able to allocate resources to assist those in need.

The <u>survey</u> will take approximately 10 minutes to complete and will be available until **Tuesday**, **February 28**. Responses are completely anonymous. The online survey is also available in Spanish, Vietnamese, Korean, and Chinese. Health Management Associates will combine the results of this survey with information

collected from other activities to better meet the needs of Gwinnett residents.

# Piedmont Pathway Study explores options for cross-county trail

The 2023 Piedmont Pathway Study is exploring how the 28mile, cross-county trail can be built and its impact on the environment. The County will use the Piedmont Pathway to address connectivity needs in Gwinnett and provide alternate modes of transportation. The trail will also increase access to recreation and greenspace and enhance connectivity to Gwinnett's neighboring counties — DeKalb, Fulton, and Barrow. # Gwinnett earns platinum-level sustainability certification

Gwinnett County continues to uphold its commitment to sustainability, earning recertification as a Green Community at the Platinum Level by the Atlanta Regional Commission. Developed in 2009, the <u>Green Communities Program</u> is a voluntary sustainability certification program that helps local governments implement measures that reduce their environmental impact through actionable measures.

The recertification recognizes Gwinnett's ongoing commitment

to environmental stewardship and leadership in sustainability practices for a stronger, greener community. Gwinnett first earned certification as a Green Community in 2010 and became the first county to be certified at the Platinum Level in 2018.
