Summer doesn't mean that Gwinnett is slowing down, so keep reading to learn about upcoming events and activities coming to our community.

Since my last newsletter, the Board of Commissioners took action on several important items:

- Appointed Domonique Cooper to the Region Three Department of Behavioral Health and Developmental Disabilities Advisory Council
- Accepted a \$363,384 grant from the Atlanta Regional Commission to continue the Get in Gear voucher program to provide medical transportation assistance to seniors and those with disabilities
- Awarded the contract for a safe and equitable multimodal access study to Gresham Smith in an amount not to exceed \$247,949, which will be funded 80% by the Atlanta Regional Commission and 7% by the Gateway85 CID
- Accepted \$175,110 in grant funding from the Georgia Department of Natural Resources
  Environmental Protection Division with a County match of \$135,000 to increase glass recycling
  opportunities in the county
- Approved a \$161,250 contract for the provision and implementation of a coordinated care solution to Unite USA Inc., funded by the American Rescue Plan Act
- Accepted a \$50,000 donation from Northside Hospital Gwinnett to be used for training initiatives for County lifeguards

# County awarded SMART grant to improve Singleton Road

Gwinnett was awarded a \$1 million Strengthening Mobility and Revolutionizing Transportation grant from the United States Department of Transportation. Gwinnett Transportation will use the grant to examine safety and mobility solutions — such as focused lighting and warnings — for all roadway users along Singleton Road. Funding will also be used to update the County's Connected Vehicle Technology Master Plan, which previously identified smart corridor deployment. Senator Raphael Warnock, Senator Jon Ossoff, and Representative Lucy McBath supported the County in securing the federal funding to upgrade its



transportation infrastructure. The SMART Grants Program provides grants for projects that improve transportation efficiency and safety through advanced smart community technologies and systems.



## Outdoor burn ban in place through September 30

To protect air quality, the state Environmental Protection Division is imposing a metro-wide burn ban through September 30. All types of outdoor or open burning are prohibited, including burning trees, limbs, and yard waste, as well as the use of air curtain destructors.
